Crime spree reaches Bethlehem

DELMAR - A Schenectady man who was arrested on December 19 for stealing and crashing a vehicle into a police unit in Colonie and then also arrested by the State Police on December 28 for smashing car windows and stealing credit cards, has been connected to six incidents in Bethlehem.

Bethlehem detectives arrested Sylvester Flora, 26, after he was transported from the Albany County jail to the police station on Tuesday, Feb. 7. For weeks police could not charge Flora because he refused to leave his jail cell. Under a provision of the State bail reforms, an inmate does not have to leave his cell unless there is a court order. This delayed charging him by about a month.

The six incidents in Bethlehem took place on three dates in November and December.

According to reports, Flora allegedly smashed the passenger window of a vehicle at 279 Delaware

Avenue on November 8.

The victim placed her purse on the seat when reporting to work around 7:40 a.m.

Her credit card was charged \$685.96 at 12:40 p.m. in a store at Crossgates mall. The card was charged a total of \$2,300 before it was canceled. Flora was identified as the person using the card through an investigation. He was charged with criminal mischief, two counts of grand larceny, identity theft, conspiracy and criminal mischief, all felonies.

The next incidents took place on December 13 in Glenmont where Flora allegedly smashed car windows in the parking lots of Romo's Pizza and Old Brick Furniture and stole credit cards.

The thefts took place between 3-7 p.m. In the two incidents Flora was charged with grand larceny, criminal mischief, identity theft, all felonies and misdemeanor criminal mischief.

On December 13, Flora was back in Glenmont. According to reports, he allegedly smashed the window of a car on Moriah Road at 4 p.m. The victim's purse with credit cards, personal identification and items were gone.

At 6:29 p.m. a worker at Romo's Pizza was notified her car window was smashed and purse stolen from the floor of the vehicle. Although it was out of sight under a bag, it was found by the thief. The purse contained \$450 in cash, credit cards, blank checks, social security card and routing numbers from her bank accounts.

At 7:22 p.m. behind Albany Med Emurgent Care, a woman heard breaking glass and observed a black sedan speeding away from her car which had its window smashed out. The woman's wallet was gone from the car and in it was \$470 in cash, credit card, driver's license and social security card.

Port plans clear EPA hurdle

In letter to Army Corp of Engineers, EPA says it is satisfied

GLENMONT — The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency said it is satisfied with the Albany Port District Commission's response to its litany of concerns, clearing a lasting obstacle before construction can begin on the \$350 million offshore wind turbine tower manufacturing facility project.

The port now waits on the Army Corps of Engineers to grant a dredging permit that will allow for construction on a 500-foot wharf. In all, the expansion plan will encompass approximately 624,000 square feet of manufacturing space, including five new buildings of which the largest will be a nearly 300,000-square-foot facility dedicated to plate preparation and welding.

The EPA lobbied the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers last June to withhold the port's permit to start construction over its concerns for the environment, including its impact on area wetlands and animal habitats.

The agency balked against the proposed site, stating it would permanently impact nearly an acre of wetlands and damage another quarter acre of underwater grasses vital to aquatic habitats. It instead called for more studies to find an alternative location.

The two parties have since deliberated, with the port answering the agency's initial concerns with a written response in July. Over the subsequent months, the port provided information substantiating the proposed location before a final meeting between the two last December.

"Following review of the applicant's response, EPA determined the [port]

has satisfactorily addressed EPA's comments," stated Richard Balla, a supervisor for the EPA's watershed management branch, in a letter sent to the Army Corps of Engineers last month.

The New York State Energy Research and Development Authority first awarded the project to the port in 2021 as part of a massive green energy initiative involving \$644 million from both public and private funding. The Port of Coeymans and several more sites across New York City and Long Island were also selected.

The port was awarded approximately \$350 million in its bid to house the state's first wind tower manufacturing site, selected in a joint bid from energy company Equinor, and wind industry manufacturers Marmen and Welcon.

It was considered to be the first step towards the state's larger plan to

establish a home base for a global wind energy manufacturing powerhouse, including two offshore wind farms that will yield a combined 2,490 megawatts of carbon-free energy, and bring another \$8.9 billion in investments.

The state has promised approximately 5,200 new jobs will be created statewide, 350 of which will be in Albany.

The project is expected to expand the port to produce 150 off-shore wind towers and create up to 350 long-term jobs.

The project has been scrutinized locally. Neighboring residents have been concerned over how construction would affect over 2 million tons of fly ash left as waste on Beacon Island.

The property was previously used as a dumping site by the Bethlehem Energy Center power plant before the Port purchased the land several years ago. The neighboring

power plant was once coal-fired from 1952 to 1970 before switching fuel oil and then to natural gas in 1981.

More than two dozen Glenmont residents filed an Article 78 proceeding against the Town of Bethlehem last June, claiming they were not adequately informed of the construction plan. In the suit, petitioners acknowledge the town's planning and zoning boards provided notice to commercial entities within the mandated 200-foot radius of the project, but argue officials should have extended notices farther out. They say the scale of the project, including industrial noise, site view and potential increased traffic, should have called for broader attention.

Last November, a state Supreme Court judge listened to oral arguments from the suit, but no decision has been made as of yet.

Selkirk Reserve clears planning board

A renewed effort to Delaware

DELMAR - Former opponents appeared to be facing in the same direction as Bethlehem Town Board members unanimously approved to take another look at Delaware Avenue on Wednesday, Feb 8.

Board members approved a measure to allow Town Supervisor David VanLuven to enter an agreement with Albany engineering firm CHA Consulting, Inc. to design an improved Delaware Avenue corridor between Elsmere Avenue and the Albany city line.

Design services will cost up to \$422,000 and will introduce designs that include sidewalk improvements, access management and driveway consolidation, landscaping, lighting, and potential lane width reductions. Costs are to be covered by federal Transportation Alternatives Program funding previously secured for the Delaware Avenue Complete Streets and Road Diet Project.

"This is just for the design services at some point. Once the preferred alternative is identified and selected, we will return to this board for approval of that construction project," said Bethlehem Director of Planning and Economic Development Robert Leslie. "But as of tonight, there is no preferred alternative."

Developers: 'The shovels are ready'

SELKIRK — Selkirk Reserve received site plan approval from the Bethlehem Planning Board on Tuesday, Feb 7, clearing way for full approval from the Town Board and for construction to start as early as this spring.

The \$20 million development situated off of Route 9W in Selkirk received Planning Board approval after a three-year journey through site acquisition, design and local government approvals. This included a year-long moratorium on new housing projects in 2021 which delayed progress, and a moratorium extension which threatened to void \$12.5 million in critical affordable housing investment from New York State Homes and Community Renewal.

Ultimately, Selkirk Reserve was eventually issued a waiver of that moratorium before it was extended

"The Selkirk Reserve team is pleased to have passed Bethlehem's rigorous Planning Board review process, and we thank the board for their dedication to the work," said Jonathan Gertman, Senior Vice President of Development at The NRP Group. "We believe the laborious

nature of this process highlights the difficulty of building housing in New York, especially affordable housing – even as Governor Kathy Hochul has pledged New York will build 800,000 new housing units over the next decade. We look forward to continuing our important work on affordable housing in New York as the Governor's administration aims to streamline the local government process."

The development team said Selkirk Reserve meets a need for affordable housing first identified in the town's comprehensive plan in 2005. Groundbreaking is anticipated within the next few months, once final Town Board approval is achieved.

If approved, Selkirk Reserve will become the town's first affordable housing project. The plan proposes 72 units of one, two and three-bedroom homes in the Ravena Coeymans Selkirk School District.

The development team said they have adhered to green energy standards, and that the housing will feature affordable housing for those living below the median wage in Bethlehem.

According to the US Census Bureau, the median household income in Bethlehem is \$93,512 per year.

UAlbany's Innovate 518 wins \$1.25M Award to bridge research, industry

ALBANY — Innovate 518, the Capital Region Innovation Hot Spot led by the University at Albany, has received a 5-year, \$1.25 million designation through Empire State Development (ESD) to continue its work fostering entrepreneurship in the Capital Region and accelerating the commercialization of University research and innovative ideas.

The funding was part of more than \$8 million in awards to five Innovation Hot Spots and three Certified Business Incubators as part of the agency's Division of Science, Technology, and Innovation (NYSTAR). The eight awardees will each receive a five-year designation, and the awarded funding supports annual operating costs for NYSTAR programs and centers emphasize the importance of working with industry to leverage New York's technology strengths to produce new products and services.

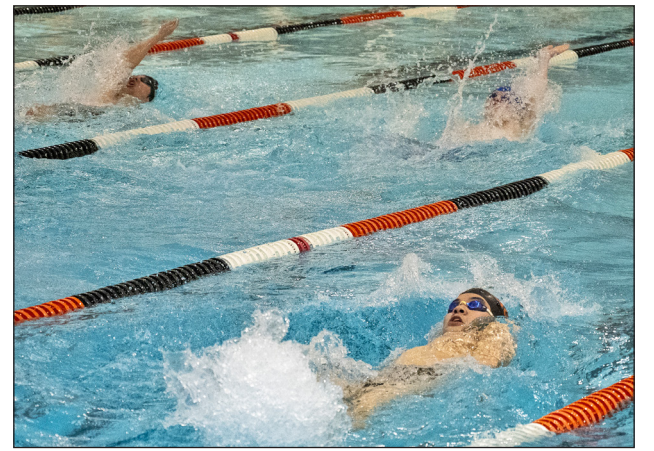

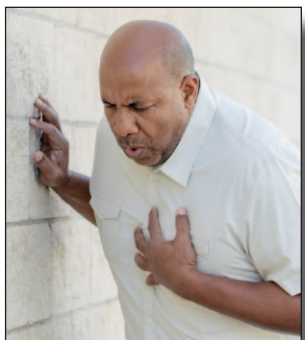

relation to the projects they were making in his class.

He recalled a particularly impressionable moment during his art class while teaching his students to make soap. The students expressed curiosity about whether they could make their own soap at home and sell it, showing Mitchell their budding interest in business skills.

“It was from that seed that the children planted that I assessed how we could teach these lessons,” Mitchell reflected. “We created a curriculum that was focused on the basics: the importance of budgeting and banking. We’re defining terms like assets and liabilities.”

aiming to make with the concepts is that when the child sees that canvas years later, they will recall the budgeting concept and connect it to the art piece of their childhood.

“Though we serve many demographics, we’re primarily in the inner cities of Albany, Troy, and Schenectady,” said Mitchell. “What we’re doing is letting them know that there are men and women in their community that look like them, that have experienced things that they have experienced, and that are doing things that they may not see as feasible for them to do.”

The missions for both SHRED and Young Futures share a compound effect. By promoting everyday decision-making and life skills against the backdrop of snowboarding and art, the goal is to guide them in ways “that will impact them in a better way,” said Mitchell.

“It may not be the largest decision, but as long as they’re making wise choices day to day, eventually the results will show in a massive way,” he added.

“On our end, it’s really about creating that equity in the outdoor space, equity in snowboarding, but also creating that equity in changing that paradigm in the industry itself,” commented Danny Hairston.

“Our mentoring is really multi-layered,” founder Danny Hairston described. “It’s on the grassroots level; it’s on the ground, but there are individuals that are held in high esteem in the snowboarding industry that these youth have access to and can pitch ideas to.”

SHRED encourages an exploration into the arts, which includes graphic design, photography, videography, creative writing, and more, through their mentorship and apprenticeship programs. Career opportunities are taught that include journalism, public relations, marketing, retail, engineering, and resort management.

“The barrier is extremely high,” said Hairston. “A lot of the youth in the communities that we serve, primarily BIPOC youth and underserved youth, don’t have access to the activity.”

He added, “It’s important to us to get youths into the outdoors, provide them with access to this activity, but also the resilience that it builds when you’re learning how to snowboard.”

Snowboarding is also an

expensive sport, which is why SHRED is committed to providing everything free of charge to their students, giving them the boots, gloves, hats, jackets, and pants that they need to begin their journey as snowboarders.

Guided by the mantra Fear, Fail, Flow, a vital part of SHRED’s educational process is helping the snowboarding students overcome one of their biggest obstacles of all: the fear of failure.

“A lot of our youths have a fear of failure,” said Hairston. “A lot of that is ingrained; when you walk into school buildings and you talk to motivational educators, they say that failure is not an option. We fail to teach that failure is part of the learning process.”

A key element of SHRED’s educational process is teaching that failure and perseverance are part of learning. These are the life skills that SHRED and Hairston hope that the youth they serve will carry with them both on and off the snow.

“The underlying goal is to increase representation and diversity in the snow

space, snowboarding, and outdoor space,” explained Hairston. “It’s an industry that is homogenized for the most part; it’s mostly white and male dominated. A lot of our youth don’t see themselves represented in the industry. It’s starting to change now. We’re really trying to change that.”

“Now that these conversations are being had, children have outlets and more information to better prepare themselves for the future,” mused James Mitchell, founder of Young Futures. The foundation’s name, Young Futures, was an intentional choice by him to reflect the mission.

Young Futures is an art

program with a focus on financial literacy. Mitchell describes art as the pathway to teaching children economic concepts such as budgeting and credit.

Young Futures began with their Art and Sole project, a family activity that encouraged families to work together, promoting healthy dynamics by allowing children to be at the forefront of the activity by painting and designing sneakers.

Mitchell’s idea to parlay teaching finance into his preexisting art classes began when Mitchell discovered a large number of children asking thought-provoking questions about finances in

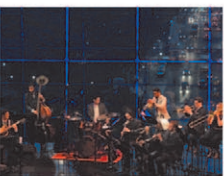

Abide With Me

Local artist Fern Apfel will present work from 7 series within her prolific body of work. Apfel was awarded Best in Show in the Arts Center's Fence Show in 2020. Abide With Me opens to the public on January 19 th ; the opening reception will be held on January 27 th during Troy Night out. Apfel finds beauty in old papers and old things. Layers of paint and hand-written details present an intimate view of archived moments that are recurring in time and memory. Follow her artistic journey where space, color and words intersect. In this solo exhibition, Apfel delves into remnants of the past in acrylic still-life paintings of old stamps, pages of diaries, and pages from well-thumbed books. Her minimalist approach to transcribing the ephemera onto wood panels breathes a preciousness and curiosity into each work. Playing cards, stamped letters, illuminated manuscripts, and articles of clothing activate open fields of color of Apfel's numerous collections. Layers of paint and hand-printed archival ink capture every subtle detail to give reverence to each subject. More often than not, these subjects reference ephemeral relics of human connection. The Clark Art Institute On the Horizon

On the Horizon: Art and Atmosphere in the Nineteenth Century examines how artists and image makers incorporated new scientific and technological understandings of the atmosphere into their works and creative practices. Ideas about the airspace, both as a realm and as a physical frontier, signaled novel

artistic possibilities. Suddenly, the atmosphere had a visual role to play in artworks—the aerial dimension came to be recognized as an essential and active pictorial element. To nineteenth-century artists, air offered a major representational challenge: How is it possible to portray something typically characterized by its transparency? This exhibit goes from ongoing through February 12th.

Promenades on Paper In eighteenth-century France, people produced and collected drawings at a startling new pace. Speaking to members of the Royal Academy of Painting and Sculpture in 1732, the comte de Caylus (1692–1765), an antiquarian and art patron, lamented that artists were drawing too much and too often. A vast trove of drawings housed at the Bibliothèque nationale de France (BnF) in Paris suggests that this diagnosis of drawing's popularity was well founded. Highlights from the library's encyclopedic holdings, many of which are being exhibited for the first time, reveal the extent to which drawing had become an all-consuming pursuit. No longer limited to the painter's studio, drawing emerged as an autonomous mode of creation. This is ongoing until March 12th 2023.

New York State Museum Unveiled: Wedding Wear in 19th-century New York

Captured: Recent Photography Acquisitions

The New York State Museum is pleased to present a selection of recent acquisitions by four photographers: Irving Browning (1895–1961), Diana Mara Henry (b. 1948), Joel Meyerowitz (b. 1938), and Joseph Squillante (b. 1949). Browning captured New York City in the 1920s and 1930s; Henry is best known as a photojournalist documenting social and political activism;

Meyerowitz has pioneered and promoted color photography; and Squillante is passionately devoted to the Hudson River. Ongoing until February 27th 2023

Berenice Abbott: Changing New York In 1929, after eight years in Europe, photographer Berenice Abbott (1898–1991) returned to New York City. She was inspired by its dramatic transformation. New construction was everywhere; hundreds of 19th-century buildings had been torn down to make way for dozens of skyscrapers. She was determined to capture this momentous change in photographs. Ongoing though July 2nd 2023.

Thomas Hart Benton

In 1956 Thomas Hart Benton was commissioned by Robert Moses, chairman of the New York Power Authority, to create two murals for the powerhouse building of the state's first hydropower facility in Massena. They feature Jacques Cartier's explorations of the St. Lawrence River and the Gulf of St. Lawrence. Alternately titled The Seneca Discover the French and Jacques Cartier Discovers the Indians, the murals depict the 16th-century encounters from two points of view. Benton took liberties with the timing of two actual events in his representation, however, combining them into a single scene for, he noted, "the sake of historical meaning." In spite of the inaccuracy, Benton had thoroughly researched the subject, studying Cartier's accounts and working with prints made shortly thereafter, as well as a model of the ship. 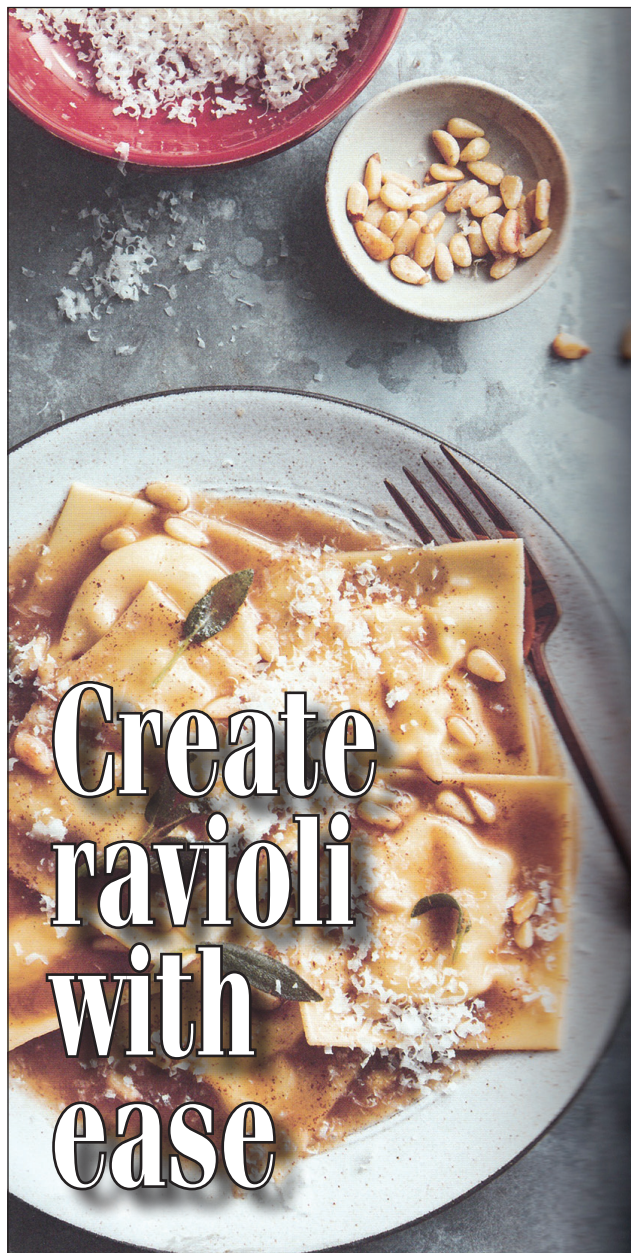

Create ravioli with ease

FOOD and VINO

Ravioli can tempt the taste buds. Ravioli are perfect pillows of pasta filled with cheese or other ingredients. Ravioli can be dressed with many different sauces, or even be battered and fried for a savory appetizer.

This recipe for “Brown Butter-Balsamic Ravioli” from “Rachael Ray 50: Memories and Meals from a Sweet and Savory Life” (Ballantine Books) enables home cooks to be as invested in their ravioli meals as they care to be. The abbreviated version of this recipe below offers the Brown Butter-Balsamic Sauce, which can be served on top of store-bought ravioli. Otherwise, you can make ravioli from scratch. The ingredients for a Basic Egg Pasta follow.

Brown Butter-Balsamic Ravioli

INGREDIENTS: Serves 4

- 6 tablespoons butter
Finely chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley or 16 sage leaves
- 2 tablespoons balsamic drizzle (or reduce 1/3 cup balsamic vinegar and 1 tablespoon [packed] light brown sugar down to 2 tablespoons thickened vinegar)
- 1 pound ravioli, homemade or store-bought
Toasted pine nuts, chopped hazelnuts, or walnuts (optional)
Grated Pecorino or Parmigiano-Reggiano

Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil. Cook ravioli until desired tenderness.

While ravioli are boiling, heat a large skillet over medium heat. Add the butter in 1-tablespoon tabs and melt. Add the sage, if using, and cook the butter for 2 to 3 minutes, until nutty and deeply golden. Remove the sage to a paper towel-lined plate. Remove the butter from the heat

and add the balsamic drizzle or reduced balsamic. Add the sauce and about 1/2 cup salty cooking water from the pasta to the ravioli to coat evenly. Top with nuts, if using, sage or parsley, and pass more cheese.

Basic Egg Pasta

INGREDIENTS: Makes 4 servings

- 4 cups super-fine Italian flour or 3 cups AP flour, plus more for rolling.
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt or fine sea salt
- 2 large eggs plus 3 large yolks, at room temperature
About 1 teaspoon extra-virgin olive oil (EVOO)
- 1 to 3 tablespoons warm water

INSTRUCTIONS

On a large work surface, mound the flour and season with salt, then use your hands to push the flour away from the center of the mound to form a well at the center. In a bowl, whip up the whole eggs, egg yolks, and EVOO and add to the well. Using a fork and working around the perimeter of the well, slowly combine the flour with the eggs and oil until they are incorporated and absorbed. Start to knead the shaggy dough once you get to the outside of the well. If the pasta dough will not come together, add 1 to 2 tablespoons of warm water. When the dough forms, place it in a bowl and then clean the work surface. Knead the dough on a lightly floured surface in one direction, away from your body, forming a wave or shell out of the dough. Ball it up, knuckle-knead firmly, then repeat, turning the dough at a 45-degree angle, then starting the knead all over again. Knead the dough for at least 15 minutes, until it is smooth and elastic. (It will look shaggy for a while; don't worry it will get smooth! Just keep at it!) Cover the dough with a kitchen towel and let stand an hour or so, or wrap and chill it overnight, bringing it back to room temperature to prepare. Use this dough to make your favorite pasta.

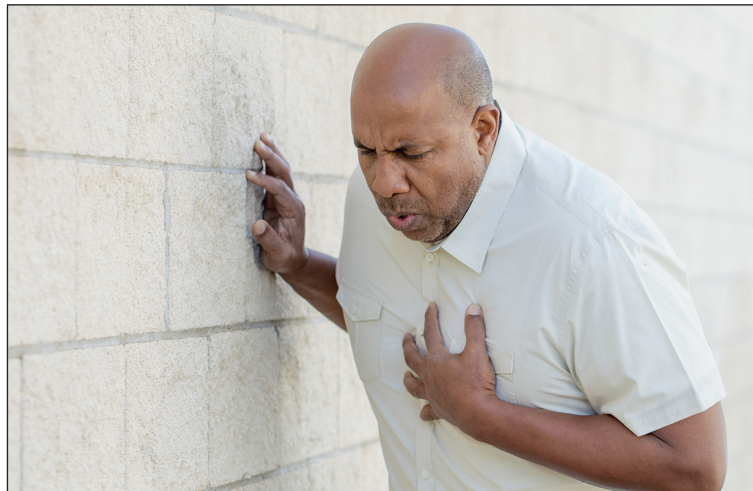

Addressing matters of the heart

Early warning signs for heart disease

Cardiovascular disease claims more lives across the globe every year than any other disease or condition, and many of those fatalities are credited to heart disease. Though the terms “cardiovascular disease” and “heart disease” are often used interchangeably, the National Heart, Blood and Lung Institute notes that, while all heart diseases are cardiovascular diseases, not all cardiovascular diseases are heart diseases. This is an important distinction, especially as adults discuss heart and cardiovascular health with their physicians.

The NHLBI reports that more than one in 10 American adults have been diagnosed with heart disease, which underscores the serious threat posed by the various conditions that fall under



the umbrella of the condition. Though NHLBI data indicates around 630,000 Americans die from heart diseases each year, many of those deaths are preventable. The same goes for Canada, where data from the Canadian Chronic Disease Surveillance System indicates that every hour roughly 14 Canadian adults age 20 and over

with diagnosed heart disease lose their lives.

Education is one of the ways in which deaths due to heart disease can be prevented. That’s especially true when individuals learn to recognize warning signs of the disease and take prompt action once such indicators appear.

• **Chest pain:** Discomfort

between the neck and upper abdomen is characterized as chest pain, which does not necessarily indicate the presence of heart disease. However, the experts at Mount Sinai indicate that chest pain is the most common symptom of poor blood flow to the heart or a heart attack. Chest pain may occur because the heart isn’t getting enough oxygen or blood. It’s important that individuals recognize that the intensity of pain in the chest does not indicate the severity of the problem. That means that even mild discomfort in the chest should be brought to the attention of a physician immediately.

• **Shortness of breath:** Shortness of breath can occur because the heart isn’t pumping blood as well as it should, thus causing blood to back up in the veins that go from the lungs to the heart. Mount Sinai notes that this results in fluid leaking into the lungs, thus producing

shortness of breath. Shortness of breath can occur at any time, including when individuals are active or at rest.

• **Coughing or wheezing:** Another indicator of fluid buildup in the lungs related to the heart is persistent coughing or wheezing. When coughing, individuals may spit up a pink or bloody mucus.

• **Swelling in the lower legs:** Mount Sinai notes that swelling in the legs, ankles or feet is another indicator of heart troubles. One of the byproducts of a poorly functioning heart is slower blood flow, and that reduction in flow can cause a backup in the veins of the legs. That backup can cause fluid to build up in the tissues, which leads to swelling.

Heart disease is a significant threat to public health. Learning to recognize signs of the disease can save an untold number of lives.
