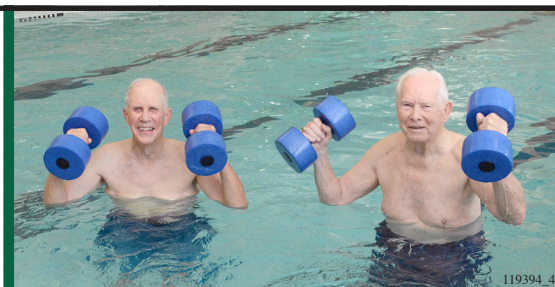

Police make arrests for burglaries in port area

Man arrested in Penn. for four incidents last summer

GLENMONT - A Ravena man is behind bars for robbing businesses in the Port of Albany and a residence on River Road last summer.

Bethlehem police arrested Donald Mason, 57, of Ravena, on a slew of charges related to the theft of tools, gasoline, and other materials.

Mason, who has a long criminal history including three stays in state prison, was apprehended in York, Penn. after Bethlehem Town Court issued an arrest warrant for the incidents.

On May 27, Sims Metal Management reported to police that a man climbed a security fence earlier in the week, broke into a building, stole four catalytic converters worth \$500 each, rescaled the fence and drove away.

The company provided security camera footage, but his identity was unknown at the time. The building sustained damage from the entry as well.

On June 14 at approximately 1:30 a.m. a River Road woman reported that Mason knocked on her door and asked for gasoline. He asked for her husband by name and said that he had helped him build their garage. The woman did not open the door and told Mason to go to a neighbor's house who was a State Trooper and he would help Mason. According to reports, the woman said he left.

Five days later, the woman's son found two broken windows in the garage and a variety of tools missing. Police also found two empty cans in the tree line of the property that previously contained gasoline in the garage.

According to police, officers had surveillance footage from a Bethlehem police unit in the River Road area on

Aggravated DWI on New Scotland Road

Man tailgates, blasts horn at car before stop

NEW SCOTLAND - A Slingerlands man was arrested for DWI after he was tailgating another car and laying on his horn while drunk on Monday, Feb. 27 at 3:57 p.m..

An Albany County Sheriff's patrol observed the 54-year-old man driving his 2018 Grey Audi traveling east on New Scotland Road and following too close to another car while honking his horn. The deputy performed a traffic stop on the Audi and found the driver to have watery eyes, slurred speech and a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath.

The man said he was on his way home from dropping his daughter off at horseback riding lessons and said he only had two beers, but then later said he consumed straight vodka an hour before. He also thought it was 6:30 p.m.

The man said he was honking at the car in front of him because the car was not turning. The deputy explained to him that there was no place for the vehicle to turn and it was driving normally.

The man was given and failed field sobriety tests, tested positive for breath alcohol and was taken into custody. At the police station he provided a breath sample that returned a 0.20 percent BAC.

He was charged with aggravated DWI, a misdemeanor, and ticketed for following too closely.

The man was given an appearance ticket for New Scotland Town Court on Thursday, March 9.

Man arrested for car break ins also charged with credit card theft

DELMAR - An Albany man arrested in

February was charged with additional crimes when he appeared in court on Tuesday, March 7.

Bethlehem police arrested Abdallah Aboueida, 24, on Tuesday, Feb. 7 for breaking into vehicles on Douglas Road and Penny Lane and stealing personal property, credit cards and cash.

He was taken into custody after he allegedly used the cards and cash to buy auto parts at a Colonie auto parts store.

Aboueida was arraigned by Bethlehem Judge Ryan Donovan and released under the supervision of probation at that time.

When he returned for court, he was charged with an additional count of grand larceny after a victim came to the police station and reported fraudulent charges on his debit card on Wednesday, Feb. 8. Aboueida was found to be in possession of that card when he was arrested for

NOTICE OF THE START OF CONSTRUCTION FOR TEMPORARY LAYDOWN YARD SEGMENT OF THE CHAMPLAIN HUDSON POWER EXPRESS PROJECT

The Champlain Hudson Power Express Project ("CHPE") intends to begin site preparation and construction on three Temporary Laydown Yards to be used during construction on the following schedule: on or about March 20, 2023 for the Fort Edward (Washington County) Laydown Yard, and on or about March 27, 2023 for the Bethlehem (Albany County) and Coxsackie/Athens (Greene County) Laydown Yards. These Laydown Yards will be utilized during the construction of the CHPE Project for construction staging, marshalling and storage to support construction work. The initial construction work will involve preparation of the sites and, if necessary in limited cases, clearing of trees and vegetation, followed by construction of the remainder of the laydown yards. Work activities described above will generally occur during daylight hours to the extent practicable and may overlap across the Project to maintain efficiency and keep disturbance to a minimum.

On February 21, 2023, the New York State Public Service Commission approved CHPE's Environmental Management & Construction Plan ("EM&CP") for the Project's Temporary Laydown Yards Segment. Upon receipt of a Notice to Proceed with Construction letter sent by the New York State Department of Public Service's Office of Electric, Gas and Water, CHPE will be authorized to commence construction activities for the approved laydown yards.

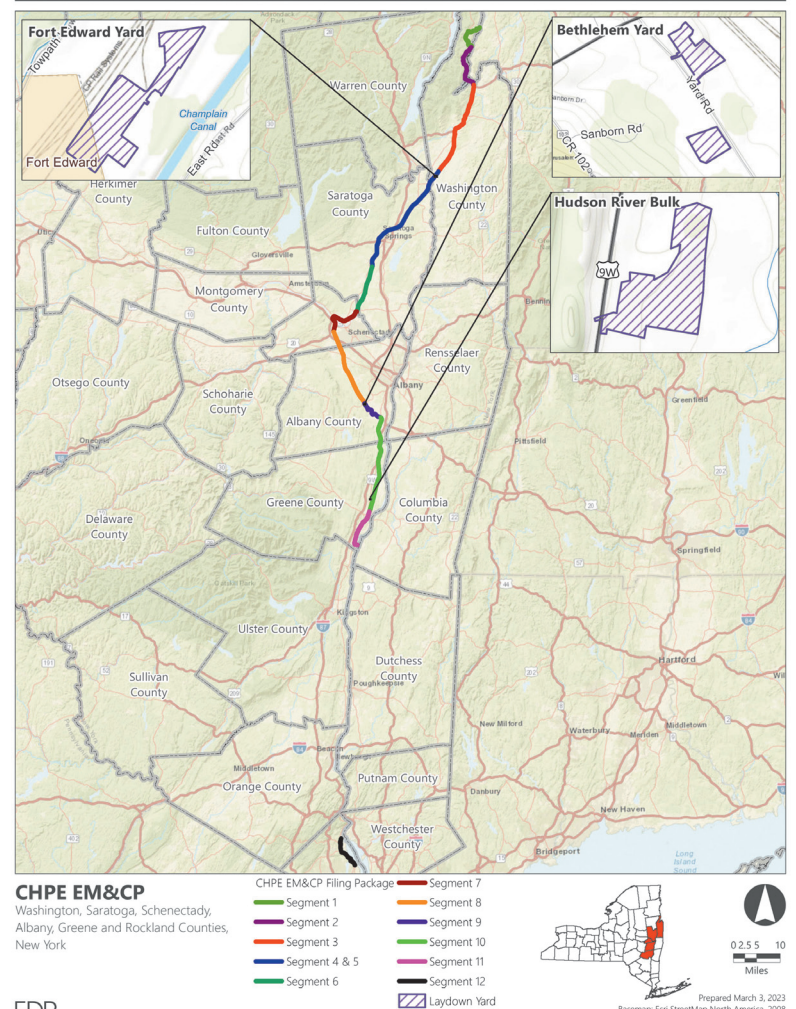

Economy leaves executives concerned

Majority of CEOs polled see a troubled economy, few expect to see it improve soon

LOUDONVILLE

— Fifty-four percent of Upstate New York CEOs say business conditions have worsened over the last year and only 19 percent, down from 36 percent a year ago, expect improvement in the coming year according to the 16th annual Upstate New York Business Leader Survey from Siena College Research Institute (SCRI) sponsored by the Business Council of New York State, Inc.

Only 23 percent of CEOs say the economy has improved this year and 54 percent up from 41 percent last year see worsening conditions in the next year.

“It’s impossible to sugarcoat the findings of this survey. CEO confidence is down dramatically from a year ago once again reaching the low point we saw in 2020 and greater now only than during the Great Recession of 2008,” said Siena College Research Institute Director Don Levy. “Only about 1 in 5 CEOs now say conditions have been and will continue to improve while about half say the opposite – conditions have and will continue to worsen.”

Thirty-eight percent, down from 47 percent last year, predict increasing revenues in 2023 while

26 percent, down from 34 percent, anticipate growing profits in the year ahead. Still, unchanged from last year, over half, 55 percent, intend to invest in fixed assets in 2023. Eighty-five percent say inflation is having a negative impact on profitability.

One-third of CEOs, down from 44 percent last year, plan to increase the size of their workforce this year, but 82 percent say that there is not an ample supply of appropriately trained local workers. Seventy-five percent are having difficulty recruiting for their open positions despite 72

percent offering increased wages and 53 percent being flexible with work hours. By 61-5 percent CEOs believe increasing the minimum wage to \$15 an hour Upstate would have a negative rather than positive impact on the economy and they oppose the increase by 59-31 percent.

“Our index of business leader sentiment, a measure that considers both the current and future views of CEOs is down to 68.8 from 94.4 last year and about equal to 68.7 recorded in 2020 during the raging pandemic,” said Levy. “Two disturbing insights from these numbers. First, a score of 100 indicates equal levels of optimism and pessimism, we’ve got a long way to go, and secondly, in 2020, the current component was the problem as CEOs then predicted a better future, now both the current and future measures are over 30 points below 100.”

Leading a long list of challenges, 65 percent of CEOs, up from 56 percent, name adverse economic conditions. Eighty-five percent say that inflation is having either a moderately (52 percent) or substantially (33 percent) negative effect on their company’s profitability. And in response, 73 percent are turning around and raising the prices they charge their clients and customers. Only 14 percent think the recently passed Inflation Reduction Act will have a

positive impact.

“CEOs are struggling to maintain profitability in the face of inflation,” Levy said. “While governmental regulation, rising supplier costs, healthcare costs, taxes and energy costs all weigh on Upstate CEOs, many are raising their prices while still trying to cut their costs. Currently the solution to this Rubik’s cube is unclear to most CEOs. Is there a ray of hope? Sixty-seven percent of CEOs, up from 59 percent a year ago expect that their business will still be doing business in New York in ten years.”

Attitudes toward government

Only 11 percent think the government of New York is doing either an excellent or good job of creating a business climate in which companies like theirs can succeed. Over half would like to see the Governor and Legislature focus on business and personal tax reform and spending cuts while about 40 percent call for infrastructure development, workforce development and business development incentives. Looking to the future, only 17 percent are confident in the ability of New York’s government to improve the business climate over the next year.

By 89-5 percent, CEOs oppose paying the nearly \$8 billion Unemployment Insurance (UI) debt through increased payroll taxes paid by the

employer and 84 percent say increased UI taxes would have a very (33 percent) or somewhat (51 percent) serious impact on their business. Most, 60 percent, say that the Climate Leadership and Community Protections Act (CLCPA) will have a negative impact on their profitability and by 64-16 percent, CEOs think the CLCPA will have a negative rather than positive impact on the New York State economy.

“Loudly and clearly, Upstate CEOs say that Albany isn’t making it any easier for them to be successful,” Levy said. “Business leaders are telling New York’s leaders to cut spending, curtail regulation, and work to make it easier for businesses, the engine of New York, to be successful. At present, while 38 percent say that if they had it to do all over again they would locate their business in New York, a majority, 53 percent say that they would if they could have located someplace else.”

Disruptive technologies

Forty-three percent of CEOs say that they are either very (13 percent) or somewhat (30 percent) familiar with ‘Disruptive Technologies’, innovations that significantly alter the way that consumers, industries or businesses operate. The current use of disruptive technologies has

increased since SCRI last measured CEO adoption in the 2017 survey.

“More CEOs and their businesses are using various disruptive technologies today than were five years ago,” Levy said. “Virtually everyone now uses the internet and the ‘cloud’ and we’ve seen increasing use of cyber security, but while CEOs describe growth in using the internet of things, digital analytics and 3-D printing, many CEOs still see those technologies as the future and not the present.”

Currently, 80 percent of CEOs see disruptive technologies more as an opportunity for their business than as a threat and 52 percent say that the COVID-19 pandemic resulted in an increase in the use of disruptive technologies.

“We see the results of this poll showing that, as a whole, employers are still concerned about major policies the state is considering that will adversely impact their business while also being frustrated about the lack of assistance and relief being shown to the business community,” said Heather Mulligan, president & CEO of The Business Council of New York State. “Employers continue to work hard every day to manage a fluctuating economy, a shrinking workforce, and policies that dissuade them from investing and growing in New York.”

Pit stop for Velan Studios' 'Rift Rally'

TROY — Velan Studios announced it's had to roll in for a pit stop, delaying the anticipated release of Hot Wheels® Rift Rally due to supply chain delays.

The augmented reality racing game, based on the iconic die-cast toy car chain, was set to hit the market this week. According to an online statement shared on social media, the game should be released on Friday, March 31.

"We appreciate your understanding," the statement read, adding that the developer will take the time to implement some final software improvements and, "one last tune-up before it hits the race track!"

The game is currently retailing for \$129.99 with a special collector's edition going for \$149.99.

Based in Troy, Velan Studios was founded in 2016 by game industry veterans Guha and Karthik Bala to uncover the pure magic of breakthrough technology and design to deliver revolutionary gameplay experiences.

Plug-powered airliner takes off

LATHAM — Plug Power Inc, a leading provider of turnkey hydrogen solutions for the global green hydrogen economy, today announced the historic flight of a regional airliner powered by the company's line of ProGen fuel cells.

Led by Universal Hydrogen, the hydrogen fuel cell-powered flying testbed took off at 8:30 a.m. for 15 minutes at Grant County International Airport in Washington state. Reaching an altitude of 3,500 feet MSL, the flight marked a significant milestone for both companies that partnered to make hydrogen-powered aviation a reality.

The 40-passenger airplane's powertrain is built with Plug's ProGen that have been adapted for aviation use. Plug's ProGen fuel cells support light, medium and heavy-duty electric vehicles in asset-intensive applications. They have proven to be ideal because they allow fleets to achieve greater range. Fuel cells are also free of carbon emissions, and weigh and cost less than batteries.

She mentioned this detail in a 2006 interview with CBS producer John Yacobian. He spoke with her as part of an application to nominate her as one of Bethlehem Central High School's notable alumni.

The conversation was filled with memories of her childhood. From the girl who acted out movie scenes in her mirror to one of the most famous actresses of all time, the beloved and Oscar-winning performer always speaks about her hometown with heartfelt appreciation and love.

Eva Marie Saint, who was born in New Jersey but raised in New York, continues to forge an incredible legacy in the local community. When she lived in Delmar, she resided in the heart of the area. Saint reminisced on her childhood homes in a 2018 *Wall Street Journal* article titled *Eva Marie Saint Before Marlon Brando and 'Waterfront'*.

In the article, she vividly described her strong connection to the outdoors. She found as much joy in pretending to be Tarzan on the backyard rope swing as she did in finding solitude in the woods.

In a 2023 conversation with Yacobian, she reflected on how her adventures in the woods and visits to the Normans Kill Creek filled hours of her days and allowed her to be

alone with her thoughts. Whether she was listening to the birds or watching the fish in the creek, her memories paint a glowing picture of a childhood spent appreciating nature.

"The seasons had a way of telling time," she said. She reminisced on learning to play the ukulele in a school summer program, admiring the fall foliage in the autumn, and ice skating in the winter.

A favorite pastime was when her parents would pack picnic lunches to take to Thacher Park. Playing baseball with her father and sister sparked a "lifelong" passion for the sport. When she had to throw out the first pitch at a Los Angeles Dodgers game, she said that she thought back to her days at the park.

A drug store at the Four Corners was a popular place for high school students to socialize outside of school. Saint remembers the seats lining the counter where she would sit and enjoy sundaes.

Residents in the community are eager to share their memories of Eva Marie Saint, especially from her school days. "The classes of 1941 and 1942 were particularly close," said local resident Sandy Paige Sorrell. "I attribute it to the war."

Sandy Paige Sorrell's mother, aunt, and father were classmates with

Saint in 1942. Sandy Paige Sorrell has made significant contributions to the town with pictures and information, including a photograph of what she believes is her mother at school with Saint.

Saint was once sent a school yearbook, and she expressed her appreciation for having an extra one. Karen Beck, president of the Bethlehem Historical Association, praised Saint's gracious responses to class reunion invitations.

Eva Marie Saint is instantly recognizable in her yearbook photos with her warm smile and halo of curls. Her nickname in the book is listed as Bubbles. The 1942 yearbook reveals a young woman who was deeply involved in clubs, learning, and school projects. Cheerleading, color guard, orchestra, basketball, and student council were among her many interests.

"She was very active in clubs and activities and was voted the girl with the most 'charm' in her senior year," said JoEllen Gardner, who is the public information specialist for the Bethlehem Central School District.

Saint revealed that she still knows the BCHS cheer by heart. Her first television appearance was as a cheerleader in a Keds commercial, where she used the BCHS cheer.

Saint said that she had a "wonderful time" at school and that her teachers were "incredible." It was "a privilege to be in such a district," Saint continued.

"The teachers were very wonderful at Bethlehem."

Saint added that she was "never bored" at BCHS because there were so many arts and sports opportunities. "I couldn't have had a more productive experience," she said, adding that it prepared her for academic success later in life.

Saint's mother was an excellent seamstress who made everything Saint and her sister Adelaide wore. Her mother made all the dresses for the school dances that Saint attended. In a 2014 interview for Turner Classic Movies, Saint remarked how she and Adelaide were "the best-dressed girls in high school."

During their 2006 conversation, Saint told Yacobian stories about some of her favorite teachers and classmates. One of those memories was how some of her former classmates would come backstage after her theater performances to see her, and it brought Saint great joy to see them.

One locally archived newspaper clipping highlighted Saint's award-winning theater work in the Broadway play, "A Trip to Bountiful." The article added that Saint "is the leading lady in the forthcoming movie picture 'Waterfront,' starring along Marlon Brando."

On March 12th, the Academy Awards celebrated their 95th anniversary. Eva Marie Saint remains one of the few to ever win an Oscar

for their first role in a major motion picture, winning Best Supporting Actress for 1954's classic film "On the Waterfront."

Saint shines as a moral compass in a turbulent world of injustice as a star in "On the Waterfront." Her Oscar-winning performance is just one of many roles in her career that highlight her exemplary skills as an actress. Her portrayal of lost love is at the heart of her 1957 film co-starring Elizabeth Taylor and Montgomery Clift, "Raintree County."

In 1959, "North by Northwest" was released and nominated for three Oscars. Cary Grant plays a classic Hitchcockian man-on-the-run, while Saint is Eve Kendall, a complex secret agent. Saint masterfully plays a woman who must walk a fine line between Grant, James Mason's artful villainy, and her troubled past.

As "North by Northwest" approaches its 65th anniversary, it is another testament to her celebrated career. Her prolific work has earned her several theatrical awards, as well as an Emmy Award for Best Supporting Actress for "People Like Us" and four other Emmy nominations.

Her many film, theater, and television credits include roles in the films "Exodus," "A Hatful of Rain," "That Certain Feeling," "36 Hours," "Grand Prix," "Superman Returns," "Taxi!!," and "A Winter's Tale."

Her television work has spanned a wide range of roles, from portraying Cybill Shepherd's mother Virginia Hayes in the series "Moonlighting" to appearing in hit shows like "How the West Was Won," "The Love Boat," and "Frasier."

Saint has actively been involved in charity work with the Epilepsy Foundation and the Los Angeles-based Wonder of Reading program. She also established with her husband, director Jeffrey Hayden, the Saint-Hayden Humanitas Award.

Saint has two stars on the Hollywood Walk of Fame to honor her achievements in film and television. In recognition of her many outstanding achievements, she was locally inducted as a notable alumni of BCHS.

Saint remarked that she still thinks about those days of her childhood. She compared the community to a "big family" and credits her time in Delmar with helping her become a well-rounded person.

Warmly, Saint recalled growing up with a loving family and good friends. She described her childhood in the close-knit community of Delmar as 'wonderful years' in her life.

Registration open for CDPHP Workforce challenge

ALBANY — CDPHP and the Hudson-Mohawk Road Runners Club (HMRRRC) are pleased to announce that registration is now open for the CDPHP Workforce Team Challenge, a 3.5-mile road race starting and ending on Madison Avenue in downtown Albany near the Empire State Plaza. This year's race is set for Thursday, May 18, at 6:25 p.m.

The registration fee is \$30 for in-person or virtual participants. HMRRRC will be offering a free 90-day membership to all registered participants.

Local not-for-profit Trinity Community Center (soon to be renamed Open Table Community Center) in Rotterdam will receive important funds from this year's race. Trinity Community Center's Bread of Life Food Pantry currently operates three times per month. While poverty rates in Rotterdam are relatively low, the United Way's 2020 ALICE Report (Asset Limited Income Constrained Employed) indicates 39 percent of residents are below the ALICE threshold and 38.4 percent of children in neighborhood schools receive free/reduced meals.

Teams and individuals are encouraged to make contributions to this important initiative at the time of registration.

The CDPHP Workforce Team Challenge is organized by and serves as a significant fundraiser for the HMRRRC. In addition to raising funds for local charities, the race also helps to fund HMRRRC's college scholarships, grants, and free race programs for local youth.

Registration at the \$30 entry fee will end on May 1. If the race hasn't reached its registration cap, registration may be extended at a higher rate.

Suspect charged in Port area robberies

the night of the original contact that showed Mason was near the residence.

Businesses at the Port of Albany were hit again on the weekend of August 13. Several businesses near Sims Metal Management, including Port Welding and Roberts Towing had items stolen.

Sims reported an alarm activation at 2:21 a.m. for someone possibly committing a Larceny. The owner of Port Welding found that \$3,381.00 worth of tools were stolen from a locked truck on the property and 300-400 feet of copper welding wire was missing when he arrived at work on August 14. Roberts leases space from

the welding company and a larceny took place there as well over the weekend.

A break in the case came when Sims contacted police for an August 12 incident where a man entered its property with a gas can and filled it at the company's gas pump. The suspect was familiar with the layout of the yard and knew how to access the pump.

The staff at the company identified Mason as the alleged thief due to him appearing on company surveillance footage multiple times during the prior year.

Detectives from Bethlehem traveled to the York County Prison to pick

up Mason on Wednesday, March 7, after he was arrested in February on a fugitive of justice warrant and Mason later waived his extradition to return to New York.

He was charged with multiple counts of burglary, grand larceny and criminal mischief, all felonies, and criminal trespass and petit larceny, both misdemeanors.

Mason was arraigned by Bethlehem Town Judge Ryan Donovan and sent to the Albany County jail until a preliminary hearing on Monday, March 13.

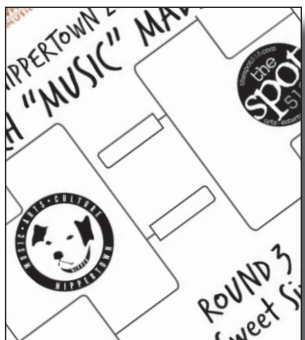

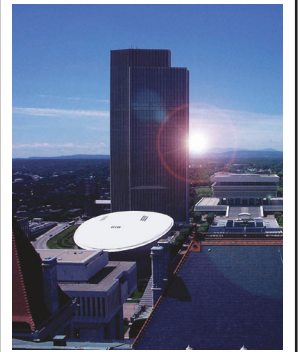

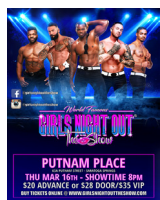

Debuting off the record is a new single titled "World is on Fire," featuring Sydney Worthley. Guitarist Matt Delgado describes working with her as "awesome."

"It felt like we'd known each other for years," said vocalist and founder of the band, TJ Foster. Foster wanted Worthley to be on the record after hearing her perform live, and they connected over songwriting and local music.

While writing "Bad Man's World," he thought Worthley would be the perfect vocal accompaniment on the track. "We sent her the demo tracks," said Foster. "She sent back a ton of vocal ideas— the rest is history."

Suburban Mayhem unites the band's differing styles. Bassist Levi Jennes is influenced by Progressive Rock, while Matt Delgado is inspired by alternative music. TJ Foster cited Death Cab for Cutie as a musical influence; drummer Chad Flewwelling's style is shaped by heavier rock.

"The variety of all those influences encapsulates all that we do," commented Delgado.

Levi Jennes remarked on the record's similarities with its progressive rock origins: "The album starts and ends with a theme... lyrics that connect together without being a concept album."

The record is not a concept album, but there is a strong vision behind every song.

"It's more about looking outward," said Foster. "The first record was very inward focused, about the things happening to me— physical health and mental health issues. Going into this one, for a number of reasons, I didn't want to do more of the same."

He noted that "a lot of these songs fell into place naturally with those sorts of themes" about the social and political climate that surround their lives. The album intentionally delves into these topics with a nuanced eye.

Levi Jennes agreed: "As you get older, you realize the mayhem going on around you. All of the real-world things that are

on this record existed when we were kids, but we didn't know it. Now that we're older, we see it."

"I liked playing with the idea of the suburbs when I was young versus now that I'm older," said Foster. The word *dichotomy* is used by the band to explain the parallels that unfold within the album, and Delgado pointed out its "tongue-in-cheek" self-awareness.

E.R.I.E is embracing their self-described 'real-world' perspective, and they're eager to add the record and their band to the canon of the local music and arts scene.

Foster recalled E.R.I.E's origins as a 'pet project.' The band stemmed from Foster's unexpected time in the hospital. Reflecting on his experience, Foster made a record and founded the band afterwards, which he joked was "a little backwards but worked out."

The band name has special meaning for Foster. The name E.R.I.E is a collage of the last two letters of each of his daughters' first names, the dots mirroring his youngest daughter's nickname.

"This band is our source of mental catharsis," said Foster.

"We've been playing our instruments for most of our lives," commented Chad Flewwelling. He describes it as "the best" to be playing music with his friends.

"We're four guys who genuinely love what we're doing, genuinely love our scene," Foster said, adding about the band's future. "We're excited."

the Gulf of St. Lawrence. Alternately titled The Seneca Discover the French and Jacques Cartier Discovers the Indians, the murals depict the 16th-century encounters from two points of view. Benton took liberties with the timing of two actual events in his representation, however, combining them into a single scene for, he noted, "the sake of historical meaning." In spite of the inaccuracy, Benton had thoroughly researched the subject, studying Cartier's accounts and working with prints made shortly thereafter, as well as a model of the ship. In addition, Benton noted, the "Indian costumes, war clubs, head dresses etc. are for the most part based upon exhibits of Iriquois [sic] life in the State Museum at Albany, N.Y." 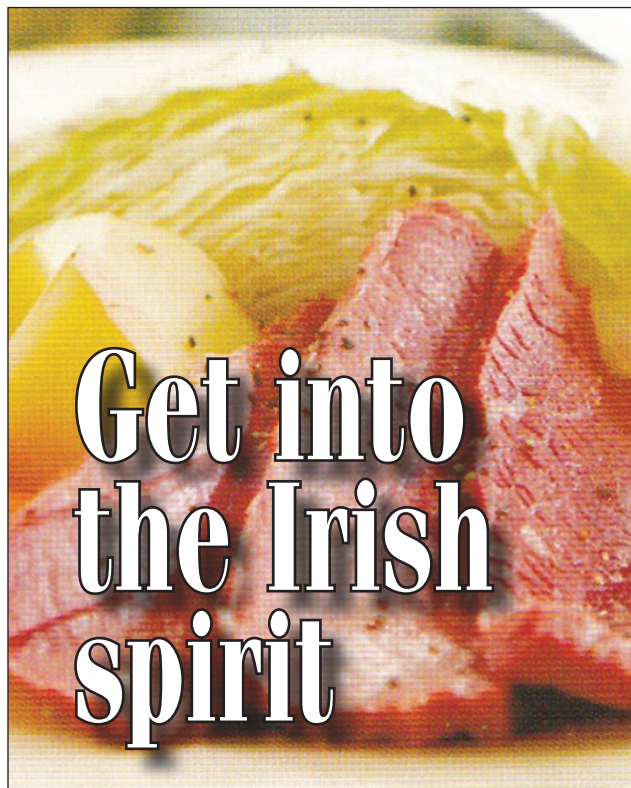

When cooking St. Patrick's Day dinner this year, the process can be made even easier with the use of a slow cooker. Corned Beef and Cabbage

INGREDIENTS: Makes 6 to 8 servings

- 12 new red potatoes, quartered
- 4 carrots, sliced
- 1 corned beef brisket (about 4 pounds)
- 2 onions, sliced
- 3 whole bay leaves
- 8 whole black peppercorns
- 1 head cabbage, cut into wedges

1. Place potatoes and carrots in bottom of slow cooker. Add brisket, onions, bay leaves, and peppercorns. Add enough water to cover brisket. Cover; cook on low 4 to 5 hours or on high 2 to 2 1/2 hours.
2. Add cabbage. Continue cooking on low 4 to 5 hours longer or on high 2 to 2 1/2 hours longer. Slice brisket against the grain, and serve with vegetables.
