Man arrested for child porn

Local man arrested After State Police investigation

DELMAR - On Tuesday, May 4, State Police, with the assistance of the Troop G Computer Crimes Unit, the Internet Crimes Against Children Taskforce, arrested Jason Sammon, 39, of Bethlehem for promoting a sexual performance of a child and possessing of a sexual performance by a child, both felonies.

Sammon is accused of promoting and possessing images consistent with child sexual exploitation. His arrest followed an investigation and the execution of a search warrant at his home in Albany earlier in the day. The investigation stemmed from a cyber tip from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children.

Sammon was arrested, processed, and was

arraigned at the Bethlehem Town Court. He was sent to the Albany County jail in lieu of \$5,000 cash, a \$15,000 bond, or a \$20,000 partially secured bond.

Felony Assault in Ravena

RAVENA -On Monday, May 3, at 7:30 a.m. Coeymans police responded to a report of an injured female on Route 9W in the Village.

When police arrived, they located a 27-year-old female subject who stated she was assaulted. The victim was transported to Albany Medical Center Hospital for treatment of broken bones, lacerations and bruising.

After an investigation, Coeymans police arrested James Lawson, 34, of Ravena for assault, a felony, and strangulation and Menacing, both misdemeanors. He was processed and arraigned in front of Coeymans Town Justice Linda Eissing and released on \$1,500 bail pending further court action.

Motorcycle thefts

RAVENA - Coeymans Police received a report of a storage unit being burglarized on Route 9W and the theft of two off-road motorcycles on Monday, May 4 at approximately 1:00 a.m. A notice was broadcast and a State Police patrol unit observed two subjects in possession of one of the motorcycles.

NOTICE OF THE START OF CONSTRUCTION FOR SEGMENTS 8 AND 9 OF THE CHAMPLAIN HUDSON POWER EXPRESS PROJECT

On or about May 19, 2023, the Champlain Hudson Power Express Project ("CHPE") intends to begin site preparation and construction on Segments 8 and 9 of the proposed Champlain Hudson Power Express ("CHPE") Project. Segment 8 includes installation of approximately 16.99 miles of buried overland cable running from the Town of Rotterdam (Schenectady County) through the Town of Bethlehem (Albany County), primarily along railroad rights-of-way. Segment 9 covers installation of approximately 5.31 miles of buried overland cable in the Town of Bethlehem. The initial construction work will involve preparation of the site, followed by installation of the cable and associated work. Where possible, construction near residences and sensitive receptors will generally occur during daylight hours, though some limited activities would extend to later hours as needed.

On April 18, 2013, the NYS Public Service Commission (Commission) issued to CHPE a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need (Certificate), pursuant to Article VII of the Public Service Law (PSL), to construct and operate the CHPE Project. Upon receipt of a Notice to Proceed with Construction letter sent by the New York State Department of Public Service's Office of Electric, Gas and Water, CHPE will be authorized to commence construction activities for these Segments.



New lending library open at Plaza stocked by The Book House

ALBANY - A new lending library is born.

Stuyvesant Plaza unveiled a new miniature lending library in early April. This free lending library was stocked with books from The Book House, but will include others as people follow the theme of take a book, leave

The concept of the blue customized free library, according to Rachel Ferluge, Stuyvesant Plaza General Manager, was to inspire readers and expand access to books for the community. Because of the plaza's geographic location, a sharing library at the plaza provides access to reading to more people at any time, day or night.

"The partnership with the Book House was an easy one," Ferluge said. "They are a local, independent book store that has been in business at Stuyvesant Plaza for nearly 40 years. Susan Novotny, the owner, and her team have always been dedicated to sharing books with the community in many ways through readings, in-store events, book clubs, volunteerism and now, stocking our little free library.

Located in the plaza's breezeway between RAD Soap Co. and Primal Butcher, the library was constructed from an upcycled newspaper rack. It features quotations from famous authors displayed on the sides to encourage readers of all ages to choose and take a book.

The reception for the lending library has been amazing, Ferluge said.

"We have restocked the library multiple times since we revealed it in

early April." she said. "We chose April simply because we received the refurbished newsstand at that time. We intend to link the library to important themes throughout the year."

May is Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month, according to Ferluge. Readers can anticipate looking for some books by Asian authors and about Asian experiences.

She encourages people to drop off new or used books to the free library so others may enjoy what they have already read.

Novotny said the Book House will design and print up a batch of "bookmark coupons" to insert into each book in the free library while

supplies last.

For now, Stuyvesant Plaza will have just one lending library, but the plaza could add a second one in the future, Ferluge added.

"I hope the library encourages shoppers and residents to slow down, take a moment to either give a book and/or take a book. It's an unexpected surprise that I hope brings a little joy to our visitors' day," she said.

Complete Streets Project Continues

DELMAR- The Town of Bethlehem is moving forward on an initiative to implement transportation improvements along Delaware Avenue between Elsmere Avenue and the City of Albany, with the goal of creating a safer, more inviting environment for drivers and pedestrians.

The effort, known as the Delaware Avenue Complete Streets project—supported by a \$2.9 million federal transportation grant—began in earnest in February with the Town's hiring of the engineering firm CHA to conduct the design study. The design study will include the documentation of existing conditions and analysis of alternatives.

Examples of changes that the study will analyze include installing "gateway features"; adding highvisibility, signalized mid-block pedestrian crossings and refuge islands; providing consistent travel lane widths throughout the corridor; and consolidating existing driveways or reducing widths of driveway

While the study does not include a reduction in the number of travel lanes as originally envisioned, these potential changes—along with sidewalk improvements, landscaping, and lighting—can address longstanding challenges in this critical corridor for Bethlehem.

Albany Med receives \$1.2 million

NIH Awards Albany Medical College grant to Study Heart Failure

ALBANY – Scientists at Albany Medical College have received a \$1.2 million grant from the National Institutes of Health (NIH) to study heart failure, as part of a joint award with Thomas Jefferson University totaling more than \$2.3 million over four years.

According to the CDC, approximately 6.2 million adults in the U.S. have heart failure, a chronic condition that occurs when the heart can't pump blood as well as it should. One in 500 people have hypertrophic cardiomyopathy, a genetic disorder that causes the heart muscle to thicken and which can lead to heart failure. In both diseases, the rest of the body doesn't get enough blood to function properly, which can cause symptoms like fatigue and shortness of breath.

The research teams will focus on how the protein ryanodine receptor type 1 (RyR1) regulates cardiac function.

Using mouse models with both healthy and failing hearts, they'll test the hypothesis that RyR1 is initially expressed as an adaptive mechanism when the heart doesn't have enough energy to pump as well as it should. But when too much RyR1 is expressed, a vicious cycle ensues leading to muscle cell death and injury, and ultimately, heart failure.

"We'll also examine a potentially innovative therapeutic strategy that targets RyR1," said Yun-Min Zheng, MD, associate professor in the Department of Molecular and Cellular Physiology at Albany Medical College, one of the study's principal investigators.

"Drugs like dantrolene inhibit RyR1 and have

already been used to treat people who have a severe reaction to certain anesthesia drugs," she explained. "We hope to show that these drugs could also be an effective treatment for heart failure and hypertrophic cardiomyopathy."

Yong-Xiao Wang, MD, PhD, professor in the Department of Molecular and Cellular Physiology at Albany Medical College, and Shey-Shing Sheu, PhD, professor of Medicine, Division of Cardiology at Thomas Jefferson University, are also principal investigators.


Titled "Crosstalk Ca2+ Signaling between Ryanodine Receptors Type 1 and 2 in the Pathogenesis of Cardiac Hypertrophy and Heart Failure," the study is funded by the NIH's National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute.

Colonie High senior dies in 85 crash

two-car crash on Route 85 just south of the thruway overpass in the Town of Bethlehem.

"We were returning from a previous call for service and were on scene within 3 to 5 minutes of the time of being dispatched to the accident," Slingerlands Fire Department Chief Jason Tice saud. "Upon arrival, it was determined it was a two car accident, one vehicle/occupant requiring extrication/disentanglement."

According to reports, a Mercedes driven by Thomas McGrath, 71, of Slingerlands and a Ford Mustang driven by Michael Kleinke, 17, from Colonie collided nearly head on.

Calls to 911 went to both the City of Albany and Bethlehem and both municipalities sent first responders due to its location near the City line.

First responders began patient assessment on the occupants of both vehicles, performed vehicle stabilization, and began the extrication process as

it had been determined there was heavy entrapment of Kleinke in Mustang, but both drivers had to be extricated.

McGrath was freed by firefighters by prying open the Mercedes door, but the Mustang was a much larger problem, according to reports.

"Multiple extrication techniques and tools were used during the process," Tice said. "It took approximately 59 minutes to remove the one patient. The other patient was removed much sooner."

During the long extraction, according to Tice, Kleinke was treated throughout the incident by Albany Fire paramedics and an emergency medicine physician who responded to the scene from Albany Medical Center Hospital. After they got him free, he was transported to Albany Medical Center Hospital via Mohawk Ambulance.

"The other patient in the vehicle not requiring extrication (McGrath) was removed and transported by Delmar- Bethlehem EMS with unknown injuries," Tice said.

After both victims were transported to the hospital, their conditions were unknown until word filtered out that Kleinke had died.

The South Colonie School district posted an update by Superintendent Dr. David Perry on its website Saturday, May 13 that Kleinke, a member of the senior class, had died.

"Our entire South Colonie School community is devastated by this unimaginable loss. Our thoughts, prayers, and deepest condolences go out to Michael's family, friends and loved ones as they navigate through this incredibly difficult time," Perry wrote.

The school is providing support to the community.

"Our dedicated school counselors and support staff are available to provide assistance, guidance and emotional support to students and faculty members who may be struggling with grief or in need of someone to talk to. We encourage anyone in need to reach out to these resources for support," he said. "We extend our

heartfelt gratitude to the first responders and medical professionals who worked tirelessly to provide immediate care to Michael. Their efforts and expertise were truly invaluable."

The word also reached the first responders the same day.

"After returning from a call on Saturday, we were made aware that one patient

had succumbed to their injuries,"Tice said. "Chief Craig Sleurs announced this information to our members and conveyed that if any member needed assistance in dealing with this tragedy arrangements would be made."

We will update this story as more information about funeral arrangements becomes available. The crash is being investigated by members of the Bethlehem Police Department and the Albany County Crash Investigation Team. The team had Route 85 closed westbound for hours collecting data to find the cause of the wreck.

We will update this story when the findings are released.

Three injured in local plane crash

Cessna crashes on CSX property south of airport

SELKIRK - Emergency crews responded to a plane crash at the South Albany Airport on Thursday, May

At approximately 3:42 p.m., local fire, police and EMS were called to the airport for the report of a single-engine airplane that crashed and settled approximately 150 yards past the south end of the runway.

The Cessna 172 was piloted by Jacky Lo, 28, of Albany and the passengers were William Yetto, 35,

of Waterford and Thomas Kieper, 27, of Niskayuna.

"It landed in a field south of the airport on CSX property. The incident took place on takeoff," South Albany Airport President and Manager Ted Zabinski said.

A med flight helicopter had just taken off from the airport to answer a call when the crew saw the Cessna in the field.

"The med flight was taking off and saw what happened, then landed at the end of the runway," Selkirk Fire Chief Tom Neri said. "The medics jumped the fence and tended to the occupants of the plane."

The helicopter canceled its call and remained at the scene.

Fuel was leaking from the aircraft when fire crews arrived, but there was no fire, Neri said.

also the steering column to extricate the victims," he said. "The pilot was pinned by the column."

According to Neri, the plane looked as if it rolled sideways and then came to rest on its landing gear, rupturing one of the fuel tanks in the wing.

"It looked almost like it barrel rolled," he said. "There were puddles of fuel when we got there, but no fire."

Two people were

injured, one with back and leg injuries and the others were taken out on backboards as a precaution. All three were transported to Albany Medical Center Hospital, according to radio transmissions during the rescue effort.

"They were pretty shaken up, but it could have been worse," Neri said.

According to Bethlehem police, the National Transportation Safety Board was notified to investigate the crash. It will likely take several months for a report on the cause of the crash.

Fire companies and emergency personnel just cleared a vehicle collision where two men had to be extricated from vehicles on Route 85 and also responded to two other calls in Glenmont at the same time. Fire departments cleared those scenes to go to the airport.

SCHENECTADY — On May 17 - 21, Union College Theater and Dance Department presents SWEAT by Lynn Nottage at the Yulman Theater in Schenectady. Directed by Jean-Remy Monnay of the Black Theatre Troupe of Upstate NY, the Pulitzer Prize-winning

play Sweat explores the intricacies of race, class, gender, ethnicity, and labor relations.

"I was excited to audition, and I'm thrilled to help bring these stories to life," said theater and English major Maggie Kelley '24, playing the role of Tracey in Sweat. "This play is a beautiful window into the lives of these people who Nottage wrote

Lynn Nottage's play stemmed from her desire to seek out how poverty and economic stagnation were shifting the American narrative.' Drinks, secrets, laughter, and friendship are set against the backdrop of factory work and evenings spent at a familiar bar.

> When layoffs, injustice, and prejudice begin to dissolve friendships and family bonds, the characters find themselves fighting each other and themselves to stay afloat.

"It sends an important message about how friends become foes in the face of adversity, the financial struggle of small-town America,

and the impact of prejudiced thoughts and behaviors on a tight-knit community," said Sarah Wright '23, assistant stage manager and a biomedical engineering major.

"There's something so real and hardhitting about the story being told. As

someone who has lived in a small town for their entire life, I know people just like Tracey, Stan, Jason, and Oscar," she added.

Wright commented on the production process that she loves 'working with the theater department at Union, especially when we get the chance to work with guest directors and stage managers."

Monnay's work bringing culture and diversity to the local

theater recommended him for the role of director. He was drawn to the relevancy of the topics of family, love, immigration, and the working class discussed in Sweat. For Monnay, the play is about "the things that

Working with the students is a collaborative process infused with storytelling and delving into the deep messages of the play. Monnay said, "This production is so important to me because I get to work with the students and crew, who are such a pleasure to

work with. I love them."

He was enthusiastic about the energy and effort that the cast has put into this production. "I can't wait for Wednesday," said Monnay. "They're doing a great job, and I'm really proud of them."

"I'm excited for this beautiful community of actors to demonstrate their hard work on stage and share their love for theater to the audience," said De La Cruz.

Thomas Cole's paintings provide a snapshot of history

WMHT's 'Reframing an Empire' explores the context beyond the canvas

ALBANY - WMHT announced the launch of its latest multi platform project, "Reframing an Empire," which explores the history of New York state and the nation during the lifespan of noted landscape painter Thomas Cole.

Founder of the nation's first major art movement, now known as the Hudson River School of landscape painting, and subject of the Thomas Cole National Historic Site in Catskill, Cole's life and work coincide with a pivotal period in American history.

Before Cole's eyes and

on his canvas, the newly formed nation would find a vision of its identity born and its future questioned. American history fixates on 1776 and 1865, but in the period between lies a rich and under-explored territory. "Reframing an Empire" acknowledges Cole's paintings as a timeless treasure of the Catskills, and explores the people and context that extends beyond his canvas.

"This production explores a critical period in our history that helps us understand who we are today," said Betsy Jacks, executive director of the Thomas Cole National Historic Site. "In pulling apart the details that Thomas Cole painted into his iconic Hudson River School landscape paintings,

and considering what he left out, a fuller picture of America comes into focus."

The 10-part digital and on-air series examines the history and significance of New York state between the Revolutionary War and Civil War - a time that saw the abolition of slavery, the active possession of indigenous lands, major events around women's suffrage, and the construction of engineering feats such as the Erie Canal.

"While folks may be familiar with Thomas Cole's work and the Hudson River School, 'Reframing an Empire' explores the voices of artists and people also actively shaping the nation during this period of extreme transformation," said Will Pedigo, vice

president and chief content and engagement officer at WMHT Public Media.

Episodes in "Reframing an Empire" will explore the artistic contributions of Sarah Cole and notable landscape artist Susie Barstow, and focus on the lived experiences of Indigenous people, Black New Yorkers, and women as they actively sought the freedom and liberty promised in the creation of the United States.

Two episodes of "Reframing an Empire" are now available online. The first looks at the creation of the American identity, and the second delves into Cole's life. Additional episodes will premiere through the spring and summer, both on-air and online.

CHIME is amplifying voice of kindness

for the Adirondack Trust Company Festival of Young Artists.

"This is a yearlong creative journey that the students take," explained CHIME Conductor David Bebe. "It begins in September and October, when they select a theme for what they'd like to focus on "

The students have workshops on improvisation, creating musical motifs and mini-compositions based on the chosen topic, which are then shared with the artist-in-residence. The composition books are filled with the students' ideas for the piece.

"It's such a great project," said Yates Lead Teaching Artist Cathy Gatta. "The kids learn to compose music and work with a composer that turns their ideas into something that goes into rehearsals and concerts for their friends and family to listen to; it's a great experience."

After careful discussions with each student, bullying, environmentalism, and economic concerns were the most common themes suggested. The theme "Stop Violence, Show Kindness" was then voted on by the students.

After deciding upon the theme, as the months progress, the education work continues as well. The goal of empowering young musicians and assisting with their musical, personal,

and social growth through music is part of the process.

This year's artist-in-residence is North Carolina-based composer and writer of "Note to Self", Adrian Gordon. He noted the 'timely' theme and the student collaboration. "They gave a lot of feedback, which guided my composition process," he

said.

"I got to ask them several questions about what they envision music looking and sounding like, what words come to mind, and

what prominent instruments they want to hear," added Gordon, calling it "a

partnership between myself and the students."

"He would take little bits from the parts of all of our music and put them into this song," said student Benjamin Campana, when describing his 'excitement' about the upcoming performance. Gordon interpreted the words that the students gave him, utilizing biting string signatures and bass drums to convey the message of the music. "I was guided by human emotion," he said.

"Throughout the music, there are aggressive and violent parts of the music," said Gordon. "Then it moves into a hopeful section. The violence comes back, and then it moves into sadness. From there, I try to emulate hope triumphing over death and sadness."

Fifth-grade student Campana has been playing in the orchestra since the second grade. As a violinist in the orchestra, he said, "I think it's a really good song because it shows how there's violence and no hope, but as it progresses, it gets better

and sounds better. It shows how people can overcome violence with happiness."

"Their idea of kindness prevailing or hope prevailing shines through at the end of the music," said Gordon.

Bebe highlighted the 'honesty' of the performance. "They're giving their own

honest perspective on the world... It's a remarkable journey in one year," reflected Bebe. "I never tire of seeing students grow and achieve new things."

"It shows what the values of our children are," added Bebe. "It shows what they see in the world, what they have concerns about, and what they think is possible."

A simple, flavorful salad to whip up in a snap

When preparing meals at home, cooks know that it helps to have a few simple, easily prepared dishes in their culinary repertoire. These are dishes that don't require too much planning and utilize certain staples that are present in everyone's pantry. Such is the case with this recipe for "Crunchy Cucumber Salad with Crushed Peanuts" from Ruta Kahate's "5 Spices, 50 Dishes" (Chronicle Books). Most of the ingredients for this flavorful salad are likely already in your kitchen, and it won't be long after you begin preparing the recipe that you'll be sitting down and enjoying a meal with family and friends.

Crunchy Cucumber Salad with Crushed Peanuts (Serves 4)

- English or other unwaxed cucumbers, chopped into 1/4-inch dice (about 3 cups) medium green serrano chile, minced (seed first if you prefer)
- cup peanuts, preferably raw, but toasted, unsalted ones will do
- tablespoons lemon juice, or more if needed

- to 3/4 teaspoon sugar
- teaspoon cayenne tablespoon canola oil
- teaspoon mustard seeds



pulse the peanuts until they are reduced to a coarse powder. (You don't want big chunks of peanuts, nor do you want a fine powder; stop grinding somewhere in between!) Add the peanuts to the

cucumbers along with the lemon juice, salt and sugar, and mix well. Taste and adjust the salt, sugar and lemon juice as needed. The salad should be slightly tart.

Make the tadka: Place the cayenne in a little pile on top of the salad. Do not stir it in yet. Heat the oil in a small skillet or butter warmer over high heat. When it begins to smoke, add the mustard seeds, covering the pan with a lid or spatter screen. As soon as the seeds stop sputtering, pour the oil over the cayenne. Stir the dressing in and serve at room temperature or cold.





repetitions. Grogan's method encourages hitting 'momentary muscle failure' by lifting and lowering the weights for five seconds in both directions for repetitions that are ten seconds long.

"The truth is this: no matter who you are or what your level of fitness currently is, all human muscles are physiologically the same. In other words, they all fatigue in the same way," explained Grogan. "Since the method I teach focuses on reaching momentary muscle failure, this means we

can all respond the same to this exercise."

Consistency can be a struggle while keeping a workout routine, and Grogan acknowledges how busy schedules can keep someone from achieving their personal goals. Regardless of a person's fitness level and time, he accommodates the individual's unique needs.

"There are so many people going to the gym... they give up because they don't see results," said Grogan.

Speaking of his own personal experience, he noted, "I didn't have more time to workout. I was only working out three to four times a week and wasn't happy about

However, Grogan noted that he has "only seen results" since starting his
