

Slingerlands Man Charged

Faces federal charges for aggravated sexual abuse of a child

SLINGERLANDS - A 73-year-old Slingerlands man was arrested by FBI agents on Wednesday, May 17 and arraigned in Federal Court in Albany for abusing a six-year old girl in his care.

Federal prosecutors charged Daniel Fuino with one count of aggravated sexual abuse of a child less than 12 years old and arraigned by United States Magistrate Judge Daniel J. Stewart and was ordered detained after reserving his right to seek a detention hearing at a later date.

According to the criminal complaint and statements made by prosecutors in court Thursday, Fuino repeatedly molested a child.

Fuino babysat the child at his home and brought her with him to Atlantic City, New Jersey, on weekends while the child's mother worked.

The complaint alleges that during those stays, Fuino photographed the child's genitals, digitally penetrated her, and forced the girl to perform oral sex on him.

The conduct is alleged

to have occurred over the past 11 months, beginning when the child was 6 years old.

Law enforcement has recovered images of the victim depicting some of the abuse from Fuino's electronic devices. The victim reported the abuse to her school last week after an elementary school presentation on inappropriate touching and sexual contact.

The charge filed against Fuino carries a sentence of at least 30 years and up to life in prison. A defendant's sentence is imposed by a judge based on the particular statute the defendant is charged with violating, the U.S. Sentencing Guidelines, and other factors.

This case is being investigated by the FBI Albany's Child Exploitation Task Force, which includes members of federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies, including the Colonie Police Department, Rotterdam Police Department, Saratoga County Sheriff's Office, and the State Police.

Assistant United States Attorney Benjamin S. Clark is prosecuting this case as part of Project Safe Childhood.

Aggravated DWI on Route 85

SLINGERLANDS - A 32-year-old Slingerlands man is facing DWI charges after an incident on Route 85 on Monday, May 22 at 12:06 a.m.

Bethlehem police responded to a call for a disabled vehicle in traffic near the Albany City line on the highway. When they arrived they found a gray 2022 Volkswagen on the shoulder of the road with two flat front tires that were partially shredded and its four-way flashers on.

Upon interviewing the driver, the officer observed a man still in the driver's seat and confirmed that he called police. The man said he got the flat tires a few miles back, but did not know where.

The officer also observed a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath. When the man exited the vehicle, he was unsteady on his feet, had slurred speech and had bloodshot and watery eyes.

He was given and failed most of the field sobriety tests, tested positive for breath alcohol on a prescreening device and was

taken into custody.

At the police station he provided a breath sample that returned a .20 percent BAC.

The man was charged with aggravated DWI, a misdemeanor, given an appearance ticket and released.

He is scheduled to return to Bethlehem Town Court on Tuesday, June 6.

Grand larceny at Kohl's, but much more

BALLSTON SPA - A man who is not a stranger to Bethlehem police was picked up by Colonie police at the Saratoga County jail on Monday, May 15 to face charges from a May 2022 incident at Kohl's on Central Avenue.

Guillermo Santiago, 50, whose address is listed at the jail but originally from Albany was charged with grand larceny, a felony. He was processed and arraigned.

Santiago was arrested in October after leaving the Albany County jail by Bethlehem police on a warrant after they were called to Tractor Supply in Glenmont on September 10. At that time, Santiago placed seven Carhartt jackets into a cart, left the store and drove away. Four days later, he returned to the same store and put six more Carhartt jackets into a bag and left the store.

He was arraigned by Town Justice Andrew Kirby, that time, and turned over to State Police for another outstanding warrant out of Clifton Park.

In November, Santiago was arrested by Colonie police in connection with a June incident at Colonie Center. That time he was transported from the Albany County Jail to face charges of robbery, burglary and conspiracy, all felonies. He was at the jail on other charges for other agencies. The June 10 incident at Colonie Center included five offenders and had two victims. He was processed and arraigned on those charges in Colonie.

It is unclear what happened after arraignment on May 15 in Colonie Town Court.

Two men, no licenses, but had heroin

SELKIRK - Bethlehem police observed a 2003 Ford Expedition traveling on River Road without an inspection sticker on Thursday, May 25 and stopped the vehicle.

Upon interviewing the driver, Nicholas Wager, 41, of Mechanicville, officers found through a DMV check that his license was suspended. He had 14 suspensions on it.


The passenger Scott Domine, 47, of Troy also had a suspended ID.

Because the registered owner of the vehicle was not present at the time, the vehicle was towed. Before towing, an inventory of the vehicle revealed a pill bottle and red straw in the door. Inside the bottle were seven bundles of a white powder marked "Cartel."

The substance field tested for heroin. The two men were taken into custody for possessing the drug.

Wager and Domine were charged with criminal possession of a controlled substance with intent to sell, a felony. Wager was additionally charged with aggravated unlicensed operation, a misdemeanor, and ticketed for not having an inspection sticker.

Both men were processed and arraigned by Bethlehem Town Judge Andrew Kirby. Domine was sent to the Albany County jail until a preliminary hearing on May 26 and Wager was released on his own recognizance. He is scheduled back in court on June 20.

Friendship Singers share their joy

story of music? The stature? How you stand, movements of your arms, legs, body, eyes, mouth, what we sound like, and the very last thing is how the story is told."

Liddle said that sometimes the things she asks the singers to do on stage might seem ridiculous, but "we all wind up laughing somewhere along the lines and we have a grand time."

The Friendship Singers are currently preparing for their first two spring concerts. They will perform at The Eddy in Niskayuna Wednesday, May 31, and the Delmar Reformed Church Friday, June 9.

The June 9 concert, free and open to the public, will benefit Family Promise of the Capital Region, an organization that assists homeless families in the area. Spectators have the option to place money inside an available donation box at the concert. The donation, according to member Terry Strasser, is strictly voluntary.

Family Promise of the Capital Region has been addressing homelessness since April 2015, using trained volunteers and local congregations to help homeless families secure affordable and safe housing. "Graduated families" continue to receive aid and support.

Delmar is one of 13 host sites for the program. Other hosting sites nearby include Albany, Voorheesville, Rensselaer, Schenectady and Rotterdam.

Carolyn Beiter, a Friendship Singers soprano, is involved with the Family Promise organization at

Delmar Methodist Church. She and her husband will host a family from Peru for the second time at their residence for a week.

This is because the shelter can't take them at night," Beiter explained. "They don't have anyone at night, so the family comes in the late afternoon. We provide dinner for them and they stay for the week." Hall, and memory care centers providing care to Alzheimer's patients.

The Friendship Singers

Formed in 1982, the choir currently consists of 17 members ranging in age from their 60s to mid-80s. Old age and COVID took away some of the previous members. The choir features Liddle, a retired Bethlehem substitute teacher, on conducting duties; co-choreography and music accompaniment by pianist Peg Dorgan; and last through late-May or June.

The singers do not get paid and do it for the love of music and friendship, Liddle said.

"It's fun, and it's a place to come and make friends." she said. "A lot of our people had things happen in their life, and they've made friendships with other Friendship Singers."

Liddle remembers two special Friendship Singer moments that have stood out to her: teaching students choreography at Troy Savings Bank Music Hall, and watching a man moved to tears of joy during a performance at a local memory care center.

sang to people who didn't have anybody to visit them. They performed upbeat and sentimental songs. She realized during a visit to St.

Peter's Facility that music and dance have a profound way of making a difference in peoples' lives.

"We went to St. Peter's, a nursing home, and at the end of the program, one of the nurses came up to me and said, 'Do you know this man has never, ever showed any emotion about anything? One of the songs you sang, there was a tear coming from him," Liddle recalled.

She said she shared that conversation with the rest of the group, reminding them that they never know who they are reaching with their music.

"Don't give up. Just because they're not reacting physically to us doesn't mean that they're not there," Liddle said.

Several memory care residents at St. Peters sang and listened to the songs. One even played the "drums" with their legs and hands to the music, said Liddle.

"Music can reach them sometimes when nothing else does," Strasser said.

Liddle said singing is only part of what they do. They also want the audience to see them moving and reacting to the music.

"If you stand there and sing beautiful music and it's as dull as it can be, you might as well go to sleep. I want the audience to go "ooh" and pay attention to every single part that we do," she said.

Beiter said hosting the family is rewarding and not a burden.

The choir has previously raised money for To Life! and an Albany homeless shelter. At a prior event, they raised nearly \$1,800.

The choir performs six concerts a year during spring and the Christmas season. Their performances include musical standards for audiences to sing with and respond to at venues such as St. Peter's Facility, Troy Savings Bank Music

Most of the singers are from Delmar, but others reside in Albany, Niskayuna and Schenectady. The group is open to other seniors who reside outside the area. They must try out and be able to carry a tune.

Rehearsals take place every Tuesday starting in mid-September to December. Rehearsals begin again during the second week of January and rehearsals because they don't want to miss singing with their friends.

Liddle said people often stop her to ask about the group's upcoming events.

"We've had people that call us in the middle of the year (asking), 'When is your concert going to be," Liddle said. "When they recognize you and you're in the supermarket, they go, 'I

I remember when SSG Jimenez's remains were recovered.

I was deployed in Diyala Province, Iraq.

This week, my colleagues and I passed the SSG Alex R Jimenez Military Family Legacy Act, which dedicates state resources to help the loved ones of service members expedite their journey to citizenship.

Consider the sacrifice the Jimenez family has made on our behalf. Consider how they faced persecution with patriotism. I am in awe of them. I know that we dream the same American Dream.

On Memorial Day, safeguard the memory of those who gave their lives in defense of our country. Keep it free from bickering and above the daily pitfalls that can rule our moods. Honor their sacrifice, their memory, and their families. Embrace the shared duty called citizenship. Seek what's right, and not what's convenient.

An artistic face lift for a historic building

Washhouse Mural installed at Shaker Heritage Society

COLONIE — When members of the Shaker Heritage Society began talking about boarding up some of the site's broken windows, Executive Director Johanna Batman wanted to use something more attractive than plywood. The result was an 18-panel mural painted by recent SUNY Albany graduate artist Phoebe Rotter that occupies an entire face of the Washhouse building at the Shaker Heritage site on Meeting House Road.

Rotter's initial sketches focused on the Shaker gift drawings she found in books borrowed from the Society's library. Not wanting to simply copy what could be found in a book, she decided to focus on photographs of the Shakers themselves.

"I wanted to incorporate hands specifically because so much of what we can see as Shaker legacy are the things that their hands built," she said.

While some of the hands appearing in the mural come from old photographs, others are instead modeled after her own.

"The Shaker spirit drawings are unique because

for the most part the Shakers actually rejected art and ornamentation as unnecessary," Batman said.

She described the gift, or spirit drawings that Rotter's work takes inspiration from as an exception, coming out of a religious revival in the early-to-mid-1800's, and done primarily by young women.

According to Batman, part of the project's aim is to honor women's history in particular at this site.

"The Washhouse building that this artwork was installed on was primarily a women's work space," she

Rotter was connected to the Shaker Heritage Society via the non-profit arts organization, Albany Center Gallery. Batman first started talking with the gallery's Executive Director Tony Iadicicco about possible collaborations almost four years ago, but it was not until after her organization received a legislative grant — initiated by Assembly Member Phil Steck and disbursed by the State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation — that they were finally able to put their partnership to use.

"The new mural ... is a beautiful representation

Paddling challenges encourage outdoor exploration

Three Adirondack waterways highlighted

ALBANY — The Adirondacks, a well-known paddling destination, now offers three paddling challenges to encourage people to explore and connect with the vast landscape, which includes over 3,000 lakes and ponds and 30,000 miles of rivers and streams.

"It's an exciting addition to the existing challenges that we already have in the Adirondacks," said Sydney Aveson, communications coordinator at the Regional Office of Sustainable Tourism (ROOST). "We have a lot of hiking challenges. The paddling challenges are a fresh take."

The three challenges are in Saranac Lake, Schroon Lake, and Tupper Lake, and Schroon and Tupper are



comprised of three routes and Saranac has five. Each finisher recives a patch and all the routes are beginner and family-friendly, and more experienced paddlers can also enjoy the routes. For more details about the routes, visit paddling. com/learn/three-paddling-challenges-in-the-adirondacks.

Aveson said that "because they're separate challenges, they celebrate the different areas" of the Adirondacks. Two of the new paddling challenges are pond-hopping experiences and are the only routes to provide this unique experience.

"It's approachable for new paddlers and families," said Aveson. "Also, for experienced paddlers, with the way that the routes are laid out, they're combined back to back. An experienced paddler can paddle them all in one day in what's called an 'Ultra."

Tupper Lake offered the first waterbased challenge in recent years.

"It kicked everything off," said Aveson.

Collaborations between ROOST, community leaders, and business owners helped initiate the challenges.


Aveson said one of the most crucial things people should know before tackling paddling challenges is the importance of ensuring that their boats are clean and dry between paddles or before moving to a different waterway.


"Clean, Drain, Dry'is a simple three-step process that all boaters can follow to prevent the spread of invasive aquatic species, which can threaten a healthy ecosystem," she

Boaters can do their part by finding a decontamination station to wash their boats before entering another body of water. To find a decontamination station, Aveson recommends visiting the Paul Smith's College Adirondack Watershed Institute website at www.adkwatershed.org.

"One of the things that I appreciate about paddling is that it's affordable and accessible," said Pamela Bentien, who is an avid paddler and involved with the Adirondack Mountain Club (ADK). "There's a wide variety of places to go."

TLC and Shaggy

One of the biggest-selling female groups of all time, TLC rode a blend of post-new jack swing R&B and pop to superstardom during the '90s. Tionne "T-Boz" Watkins, rapper Lisa "Left Eye" Lopes, and Rozonda "Chilli" Thomas appealed equally to pop and R&B audiences, blending catchy hooks and bouncy funk with a playful and confident attitude. Their sound was reflected in their image, equal parts style and spirit, bolstered by a flamboyant, outrageous wardrobe. After their starmaking second album, CrazySexyCool, the group fell into disarray and took over four years to record their follow-up, Fanmail, though the hits kept coming. By the end of the '90s, they had three multi-platinum albums and nine Top 10 Hot 100 hits to their credit. Tragedy struck in 2002 when Lopes was killed in a car accident, but Watkins and Thomas sporadically performed and recorded as TLC into the late 2010s. Shaggy emerged in the early '90s as the biggest crossover success in dancehall reggae. Not only did he become the genre's most commercially potent artist in the international market, but he managed to sustain a lasting career over the coming decade thanks to wildly popular albums like 1995's breakout Boombastic (featuring the chart-topping single of the same name) and 2000's multi-platinum Hot Shot. Perhaps in part because he wasn't based in Jamaica, he never really needed to have it both ways; virtually ignoring the hardcore dancehall crowd, Shaggy's music was initially geared toward good times, a friendly (if horny) persona, and

catchy party anthems. While he wasn't shy about lifting hooks wholesale from pop hits of the past, he also had fairly eclectic tastes, giving his records a musical variety lacking in other dancehall stars. Using AI to fight cancer

RPI and Albany Medical College Researchers Awarded \$3.3 Million to Improve Breast Cancer Treatment

ALBANY - Researchers from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (RPI) and Albany Medical College were awarded a \$3.3 million grant over five years by the National Cancer Institute to use artificial intelligence (AI) to improve targeted drug therapy in HER2positive breast cancer treatment. HER2-positive breast cancer tends to grow and spread quickly, but targeted treatments improve outcomes.

The research is being led by Xavier Intes, Rensselaer professor of biomedical engineering and co-director of the Center for Modeling, Simulation and Imaging in Medicine, and Margarida Barroso, a professor of molecular and cellular physiology and director of the Imaging Core Facility at Albany Medical College. RPI and Albany Medical College have collaborated continuously for over a decade focusing on treatments to improve human health supported by six major grants. This grant propels that collaboration forward using modern AI tools.

Targeted drugs are an important part of many cancer therapies to improve specificity and reduce negative side effects. However, resistance to targeted therapy often occurs, preventing longterm, disease-free survival in many patients.

This grant will fund research in HER2-positive breast cancer where it has been proposed that intratumor heterogeneity (ITH), in which cells within the same tumor have different profiles, and microenvironmental factors play a key role in treatment failure. Hence, a better understanding of the underlying mechanisms of HER2 therapy resistance and their relationship with ITH, as well as with the host and tumor microenvironments, is essential for the development of new strategies to improve patient outcomes.

Preclinical longitudinal, non-invasive imaging approaches that can dissect and quantify heterogeneities at the level of multiple tumor features such as drug-HER2 engagement, glucose metabolic levels, and vasculature are lacking. Currently, these parameters can only be assessed through ex-vivo invasive means, using tissue removed from and then returned to the patient.

"Through our research, we will develop a novel mesoscopic, multimodal preclinical imaging approach to test the hypothesis that the distribution of antibody-based therapeutics across tumors mediates not only drug efficacy but also the advent of tumor resistance," said Intes.

The team will use mesoscopic fluorescence molecular tomography (MFMT) to dissect tumor heterogeneities at near cellular scale resolution in live, intact animals.

Barroso will also collaborate with Sandra Shin, MD, chair of the Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine at Albany Medical Center, to correlate histopathology with these novel optical imaging approaches.

"Ultimately, we hope this imaging technology will allow biologists and clinicians to see exactly how a drug binds to a tumor, providing a better understanding of how tumors adapt or change during treatment," said Barroso. "This could help determine a particular drug's efficacy on a specific tumor, a key element of tackling drug resistance."

"For more than a decade, NCI has been recognizing the importance of this cross-institutional collaboration and the unique skills and expertise each researcher brings to the collaboration," added Alan S. Boulos, MD, '94, The Lynne and Mark Groban, MD '67 Dean of Albany Medical College. "The studies supported by this new grant will have a significant impact on the future of cancer diagnostics and therapy."

"Breast cancer is such a prevalent disease that we all know someone affected by it," said Shekhar Garde, dean of Rensselaer's School of Engineering. "I am pleased that Drs. Intes and Barroso are combining the power of engineering and medicine with modern artificial intelligence tools to advance our understanding of this particularly virulent form and improve patients' quality of life."

'Rent' in the round

'Hey, I know this is crazy but I want to open a theater program, I want to do "Rent." I want you to reprise Collins. I want you to direct, and let me know what you think." Archina said. "I was thinking, 'Oh this guy is crazy. I'm never going to hear from him again,' and after months and months of just meeting and talking over coffee, it turned into this huge project."

Previously, Archina reprised his role of Tom Collins in "Rent" with another theater production at The Egg Performing Arts Center. "Rent" remains special to Archina as it was the musical that first introduced him to theater in high school and helped him later come out as a member of the LGTBTQ community through his friend and castmate, Justin DeMaria (Pacifica Rim) who portrayed Angel before passing away postproduction.

'Rent"is the reason why I love theater. It's why I do it. I've been involved in almost every aspect of the musical." Archina said.

Prior to the pandemic, Snide performed nationally and internationally as a dancer and actor. He performed alongside celebrities such as Taylor Swift, Jennifer Hudson, Judi Dench, and James Gordon in the film adaptation of "Cats," danced with Robbi Fairchild from the New York City Ballet, performed in West Side Story on Broadway, and portrayed Billy Elliot in London as a teenager.

When the pandemic began, Snide returned home to Albany, and he and sister, Jenna Snide, founded Capital District Arts Initiative. Currently in its three-year run, the siblings and their team have their own production company, teaching ballet and dance to aspiring students and a theater program in development for children and adults on Troy-Schenectady Road in Latham.

This will be CDAI's second produced musical. Having made his American professional debut with "Thirteen: The Musical," Snide put the production on again with his students. "Rent" will be the initiative's first adult professional musical.

CDAI has received support from local small businesses on the projects and in turn, the businesses are excited to see what CDAI is all about and its mission to bring arts empowerment in the community, Snide said.

Snide said he would not be where he is in his professional career without the support of the faculty at Lisha Kill Middle School, second grade teacher Michael Carvaric from Veeder Elementary School who provided Snide the lead role of the Stinky Cheese Man in the second-grade play, and Veronica Delancy Smith, his third-grade teacher who read books like it was a Tony-Winning award performance to Snide.

"When I told my eighth grade teachers that I was going to move to London

and pursue my dreams, they were like, 'Great, how can we help?" Snide said. "I had those people in my life, and I want to be that person for someone else."

Snide hopes to achieve that same level of support that he received from his teachers and from his professional experiences to help inspire artists to pursue their dreams in the world of theater and dance, both as a hobbyist or professionally.

"I hope to achieve that same level of inspiration that I got right here in Colonie." Snide said.

"Rent" will be an immersive experience for all viewers at Lark Hall.

"Traditionally, in a theater the audience sits there and people act on stage. Our production means that the actors are actually immersed within the audience." Snide said.

Attendees can buy up to three ticket types. They could be sitting on stage on Mark and Roger's couch in their apartment, another section will have the audience placed along a wall, and general admission will allow viewers to sit in the round while the actors act right in front of them. Both the viewers and actors will be together in one shared space.

"People have been asking, 'Where's the best place to sit?' and there's no best place," Archina said. "Anywhere you're going to sit, you're going to get a completely different show, and it's going to change everytime you come wherever you sit. It's an incredible movement all around you that you really just can't find in other productions."

This production of "Rent" will be different from others.

"Here the audience is lined up all along the wall in a giant circle, and in the middle of this big bar is the cast," Archina said. "We're running around the tables, set pieces and we're changing costumes right in front of you. It's the most immersive thing I could think of."

Archina said sometimes the audience can't feel the community in community theater, but they will with this production.

"You will feel the love that we've all poured into each other," he said. "Wherever you sit, you're going to be a part of it with

Things to expect during a set change

"There's so many moments where the actors break the fourth wall, and we'll include you into the story. And what's great is that when you're watching 'Rent' on stage, there will be a movement of something to know that you're in a different room." Archina continued.

With this staging,

attendees can expect to see Mimi at the balcony singing "Out Tonight." The characters, Joann and Mark will be on stage for Maureen's protest, and viewers will watch the cast sing "Christmas Balls" in the middle of the room.

Rent and Pride Month

"Rent" has a connection with the LGBTQ community within its story lines. From the 1980s to the 1990s, the AIDS and HIV epidemic was at its peak, and talking about AIDS and HIV was controversial.

"The story is true, the AIDS crisis in the 90's, and I think a lot of people actually know individuals who have passed from that illness." Akita, the actor playing Mimi, said. "And us portraying such a beautiful story about life and death within that community is going to be really beautiful for people to see it in an immersive space. ... I've learned a lot about that time period and by playing this role as Mimi Marquez, it's going to be a beautiful story to tell."

Musical Director Clarke Stevens said the story resonates with all kinds of

people.

"Even if people don't have a connection to the LGBTQ community threads, there's always the connection to just disease, addiction, and having something take place in New York City that's always appealing to everybody just because of the edge and diverse cultures and populations," he said.

Snide praised the cast of "Rent."

"There are a lot of people in my production of 'Rent' that are wickedly talented and could absolutely have taken on New York City, but they knew for themselves that they were happier here." he said.

Burkus said Lark Hall is the perfect place to stage the production.

"I just can't wait to share this story and hope people come to see it and enjoy it, get a message of hope and like the song, 'There's No Day Like Today,' she said.

"Come see the show. It's going to be amazing. I'm really excited for what CDAI is going to be bringing to the Capital Region in the future." Akita

Try your hand at homemade stock



he pinch of inflation has been felt in homes across the globe in 2022. A trip to the supermarket has been more costly for much of the year. Those who are splurging on special ingredients for recipes may waffle over whether or not to indulge. However, if certain ingredients can be used to create multiple meals, then that added expense may be easier to swallow.

Many home cooks know to save the bones from poultry, ham and even beef to make delicious stocks. Stocks often are the bases for soups and sauces. They also can season stir-fries and other recipes. A flavorful stock can be made from seafood, particularly the shells of crustaceans. After enjoying a meal featuring lobster, turn those discarded lobster shells into a stock that's perfect for bisques and more. Try this recipe for "Lobster"

Stock," courtesy of the United Kingdombased seafood company W. Harvey & Sons.

Lobster Stock Serves 2

Shells from 2 to 3 cooked lobsters
grams butter
small onion, chopped
celery stick, chopped
sprigs fresh thyme
tomato, roughly chopped
teaspoon tomato puree
teaspoon brandy
ml dry white wine
liter chicken stock

Melt the butter in a large saucepan, add the onion, carrot, celery and thyme, and fry over a medium-high heat for 3 to 4 minutes.

Meanwhile, break or cut up the lobster shells into small pieces.


Add the lobster shells to the pan and fry for 2 minutes. Add the tomato and tomato puree and fry for 1 minute more.

Add the brandy and white wine, and set alight with a match, to burn off the alcohol. Take care and stand back as you do so. When the flames have died down, add the chicken stock. Bring to a boil, lower the heat and leave to simmer for 20 minutes.

Transfer the mixture to a blender, in batches if necessary, and blend to a coarse puree. Strain through a muslin-lined sieve into a clean pan, squeezing out as much of the liquid as you can. The stock is now ready to use or freeze for later use.

You can either freeze the lobster shells to make stock at a later date, or freeze the stock once made for future use. Multiply the stock ingredients as needed for a greater number of servings.

Most of Rotter's work was completed during March at the Albany Center Gallery's Arcade Building. She started her drawings small, using a

projector to slowly scale them up in size, then retraced all of her work onto wooden panels.

"I went over it with house paint so that it would last in outside application," Rotter said. "That's how I like to work in large scale — piece by piece."

The project was installed in April, and those involved

are calling it a temporary installation.

"It'll be up for the life of the materials basically, so we're estimating five to seven years," Batman said.

She added that the Washhouse is a "high priority target for rehabilitation," in addition to several other buildings on site. Plans for restoration are currently in the works.

"In the interim, and maybe beyond, using those buildings as a canvas for art is a wonderful way to beautify the site," Batman said.
