DELMAR — What fire officials are categorizing as one of the largest fires in Bethlehem in 30 years has led Bethlehem police to arrest a 35-year-old Delmar man on Friday, June 2, for lying to the police about sparking the fire.

Juan W. Miranda, who lived in one of the burned buildings, allegedly was smoking a marijuana cigarette in the courtyard between

Fake plates, no license in a stolen truck

SLINGERLANDS - License plate readers on a Bethlehem police unit triggered an alert on Route 85 on Monday, May 26 at approximately 11:40 p.m. for a truck with a suspended registration.

Police officers stopped the Ram 3500 Dually and found that a check of the license plate attached to the truck was for a Ram 1500.

The officer interviewed the driver, Robert Duncan Jr., 55, of Albany, who provided a NY interim paper license and he said he put the plates on the RAM 3500 after purchasing it on Craigslist in another state. The officer also noticed that the inspection sticker was fraudulent and all the VIN numbers on the truck were defaced or covered.

The officers removed the covering of the VIN number and found that the RAM 3500 was reported stolen out of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department in North Carolina. Detectives were called in at this point and Duncan was taken into custody.

He was charged with criminal possession of stolen property over \$3000 and possession of a forged instrument, both felonies, and driving with a suspended license and aggravated unlicensed operation, both misdemeanors, and operating without insurance, operating an unregistered vehicle, operating with improper plates and operating without an inspection.

Duncan was sent to the Albany County jail until he was arraigned by Bethlehem Town Judge Andrew Kirby the next day. He was released on his own recognizance and is scheduled to return on June 20.

Asleep at green light, no license but had heroin

GLENMONT - Bethlehem police responded to a report of a car stopped on Kenwood Avenue at the intersection of the Delmar Bypass on Tuesday, May 27 at approximately 2:58 a.m. and found a blue Pontiac G6 in the road.

The light was green, the driver, a 34-year-old Delanson man, asleep at the wheel and the car in drive. Officers woke the sleeping driver and observed that he had dilated pupils, slurred speech and was disoriented.

The man also had an invalid license with 11 suspensions. He was given, and failed, field sobriety tests and tested negative for breath alcohol.

He was taken into custody for DWAI-Drugs.

At the police station, the man refused to take a breath or blood test and refused an evaluation by a drug recognition expert.

When police were doing an inventory of the Pontiac G4, they found seven glassine envelopes, two empty envelopes, two empty syringes and two glass pipes. The bags contained what was later

determined to be 2.02 grams of heroin.

The man was charged with DWAI-Drugs, aggravated unlicensed operation and criminal possession of a controlled substance, all misdemeanors, and operating a vehicle without a license and stopping on a highway.

He was given a bill of particulars and an appearance ticket for Bethlehem Town Court on Tuesday, June 6.

No lights, no license

DELMAR - Bethlehem police observed a 2018 Nissan Rogue traveling northbound on the Delmar Bypass with no tail lights illuminated on Monday, May 29 at 1:16 a.m. The officer stopped the vehicle and identified the driver, Donte Beck, 32, of Troy.

An investigation found he did not have a valid license due to 26 suspensions and only had a non-driver ID.

He was arrested and charged with felony aggravated unlicensed operation and ticketed for driving with no lights and operating a motor vehicle without a license.

Beck was issued an appearance ticket for Bethlehem Town Court on Tuesday, June 13 and released.

Bethlehem clarifies 'sanctuary city' status

Future financial ramifications for those with designation possible

DELMAR — In February 2017, Bethlehem passed a resolution affirming that its police department would continue to not ask individuals to share their immigration or citizenship status unless necessary to a criminal investigation or for the purposes of public safety. The procedures are consistent with sanctuary provisions often found in sanctuary communities, but the town is not, under any standing law, defined as such.

With New York City Mayor Eric Adams dispersing migrants across the state as part of a relocation program, the town's inclusion of sanctuary provisions may come with future financial responsibility.

"The challenge with 'sanctuary city' is that it means different things to different people," said Bethlehem Town Supervisor David VanLuven, who was on the board that adopted the 2017 resolution and voted in favor of it. "Based on the most common usage, we are not a sanctuary city because the town didn't pass a resolution declaring itself to be one."

The 2017 resolution was worded to prevent town personnel and volunteers from inquiring about or requesting proof of immigration or citizenship status unless necessary, in addition to pledging to respond to persecution on



the basis of immigration status — or any other legally protected status — with "appropriate priority and urgency." It was passed primarily in light of then-President Donald Trump's administration's ban on immigration and reaffirmed policies the town was already practicing.

Initially, some town members raised concerns about President Trump's threat to revoke federal funding from sanctuary cities. But since the 2017 resolution never identified Bethlehem as such, this never became a factor.

Bethlehem's decision to pass sanctuary provisions without naming itself a sanctuary city in 2017 now has material consequences, with NYC Mayor Eric Adams busing migrants across the state as part of a relocation program.

On Saturday, May 27, a busload of 24 migrants arrived at the Sure Stay Best Western Hotel on Wolf Road, even though

Colonie is not classified as a sanctuary city. Albany County Executive Dan McCoy issued a state of emergency and order on Tuesday, May 23, ordering that migrant families could be resettled in Albany County — a self-designated sanctuary city — with proper communication between the county and the agency presenting the families.

According to VanLuven, the town of Bethlehem has not been asked to provide housing for migrants by New York City or any neighboring counties. If this were to occur, Bethlehem does not currently have the resources to properly house migrants and their families, he said.

they are consistently booked," VanLuven explained. "I expect that this is a consistent situation across suburban and rural communities: We don't have large stocks of vacant housing or hotel infrastructure, or of large buildings that could be converted into housing."

Right now, the financial responsibility of taking care of migrants that have been relocated from NYC falls on the city itself, as a part of a long-standing "right to shelter" obligation. The policy has been in place for over 40 years, after a court in 1981 required NYC to provide temporary housing for any homeless person

seeking it. But in recent weeks, NYC Mayor Eric Adams has asked courts to suspend this policy.

Adams' request was made largely in light of the arrival of more than 70,000 migrants since last spring. While he said he does not wish to permanently suspend the right to shelter in the city, he is seeking "clarity from the court."

"Given that we're unable to provide care for an unlimited number of people and are already overextended, it is in the best interest of everyone, including those seeking to come to the United States, to be upfront that New York City cannot single-handedly provide care to everyone crossing our border," he said in a statement on May 23.

The Legal Aid Society and the Coalition for the Homeless have filed legal opposition to Adams' request, claiming that suspension of the city's right-to-shelter policy would force people to sleep in unsafe public places.

About two weeks prior to making his request, Adams loosened some right-to-shelter rules that were already in place, in light of the expiration of Title 42 on May 11. Changes to policies included relaxing a rule that required the city to find beds for people within a certain timeframe, and suspending a rule that prohibits families with children from being housed in congregate settings.

If the right to shelter is suspended, where the financial responsibility of taking care of migrants that have been relocated north of the city will fall becomes unclear. Right now, NYC assumes all of these costs, but if the suit goes through, some could be directed to the counties currently housing migrants.

"The financial responsibility of housing, caring for, and processing the applications of immigrants is the responsibility of the federal government, ideally working in partnership with state governments," VanLuven said.

Adams has made it clear that he is not receiving enough financial support from the federal government to properly take care of the city's migrant population. If the right to shelter is suspended, it is unclear whether other sanctuary cities within the state will be asked to provide this support instead, or if they even have the resources to do so.

Town holds first workshop

DELMAR - The first of three public workshops on town's zoning and subdivision code update effort took place Wednesday, May 31 at Bethlehem Town Hall. The workshops are intended to elicit input from town residents to update zoning and subdivision codes to, "reflect the vision, values and guiding principles of the...Comprehensive Plan" adopted in June 2022, according to the Town website. The last major update to town zoning rules was in 2016.

More than 120 residents attended the workshop where a brief overview of the process and an introduction to smart growth principles and land use were presented.

Residents then had the opportunity to visit three breakout stations focused on watercourse and floodplain protection, wetlands protection, commercial development, and small and large scale solar. In the groups, participants could ask questions, voice concerns, and submit preferences on each use.

Robert Leslie, Director of Planning for the Town said the process is expected to take about a year to complete.

"We expect to give the Town Board a plan to vote on in March 2024. The 12-month timeline we set is a realistic one to keep residents involved and focused on the process," he said.

The zoning update project is partially funded through a \$90,000 grant from the NYS DOS Smart Growth Planning & Zoning Grant Program. The Town allocated the remaining \$75,000 from funding received through the American Recovery and Reconstruction Act.

Bergmann and Prospect Hill was hired to assist with gathering public

input and help align zoning updates with the Comprehensive Plan.

Leslie said Bergmann and Prospect Hill was one of three firms that submitted a proposal to run the process.

"[It was hired based on the firm's] zoning code experience, its local and regional presence, and to comply with the minority-owned provision in order to receive the State grant," Leslie said.

Side discussions among attendees ranged from developers hoping for some give-and-take on wetland zoning and riparian buffers to residents with concerns about absentee Air B and B homeowners.

The Comprehensive Plan is based on six overarching principles; Interwoven Equity, Livable Built Environment, Harmony with Nature, Resilient Economy, Healthy Community and Responsible Governance and Regionalism, according to the Town's documentation.

When asked what is the most challenging aspect to a project like this, John Steinmetz, Planning Principal at Bergmann and Prospect Hill said, "Translating policy to regulation. It's more than science. There is a lot of law and it involves values, hopes, dreams, and more."

Before the advent of smart growth principals and urban planners, attorneys largely led rezoning efforts, he said.

In addition to the three public workshops, residents can provide input through the development preference survey accessible on the Town website Zoning page or emailing responses to the activity boards to BethlehemForward@TownofBethlehem.org. Residents may also submit comments directly to the Planning Board. For links and additional information visit the Town website.

From page 1 ... A spark to an inferno

9 and 11 Equinox Court shortly before the fire started and discarded the end into the yard. The spark triggered a fast-moving fire from what witnesses say was a buildup of highly flammable and fuzzy poplar seeds and brush near the house.

Miranda allegedly tried to extinguish the fire with 5-gallon buckets of water, which delayed calling 911.

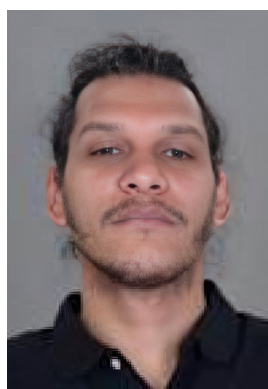
Later, in interviews with fire investigators, Miranda allegedly told a different story that led to the charge.

On Tuesday, May 30, at approximately 7:30 p.m. Slingerlands, Elsmere, Selkirk, North Bethlehem,

McKownville, Westmere and Delmar Volunteer fire departments responded to a fire at the Deer Run Apartment complex just off Kenwood Avenue for the report of a structure fire.

What they found was an inferno.

“Never in my 30 years of experience that I have been involved or in command where we arrived at a scene with two, four-unit apartment buildings fully involved with fire coming through the roof,”

Slingerlands Chief Craig Sleurs said.

The fire started at the four-unit apartment building at 9 Equinox Court and quickly spread to the building next door and the woods behind the buildings.

By the time firefighters arrived, the fire moved through the ravine in the rear of the two buildings and advanced back up the slope towards Kenwood Avenue.

“The fire burned down in the ravine and then came up towards Kenwood,” Sleurs said. “It was really roaring there.”

Fire fighters now had three distinct fires, and water to feed the various high-pressure hoses quickly became a problem at the scene.

“It wasn’t that the town wasn’t giving us water (through the hydrants), it just wasn’t enough,” Sleurs said. “With three separate fires at once and three tower trucks, three pumper trucks, three two and one half inch Blitz fire lines and four additional hand lines, it was never going to be enough water through hydrants alone in this situation.”

There is a fire hydrant 25 feet from the first building, but it is fed with one 8-inch diameter pipe connected to a main on Kenwood Avenue between two

other hydrants, according to Bethlehem DPW Superintendent George Kansas. It was functioning, but drawing water from all three hydrants at the same time limited water inflow to the middle connection. He estimated that the departments could draw between 1,500-3,000 gallons of water a minute from the line depending on the equipment pulling.

The bottom line is that they needed more water.

"We quickly realized we needed to set up an additional water supply with our tankers," Sleurs said.

Fire departments set up a 3,000 gallon temporary water pond fed by additional tanker fire trucks from Onesquethaw and New Salem to help supply the three fire attacks.

It took two hours to bring the fires under control. Departments had to return the next morning

to extinguish the rubble again after it reignited.

What was left was devastating to the eight families that lived in the two buildings. The Red Cross responded to the scene just after 9:30 p.m. to assist them. Slingerlands Volunteer Fire Department will be holding a fundraiser breakfast to benefit the families 8-12 noon on Sunday, June 18, at the firehouse on New Scotland Road, and the Albany County Burn Fund is providing assistance as well. Further information will be posted on the department's website and facebook page.

The start of the fire was under investigation within an hour, but the speed with which it spread was evident immediately.

The property has an abundance of poplar trees that shed a fluffy-white fuzz that is actually made up of seeds shed from female trees this time of year. The

seeds are rich in oil, which makes them burn faster.

According to one resident, piles of the substance were a foot deep in some spots where the wind pushed it.

"Last week there were piles of the stuff up to your knees," Randy Nemeckay, a resident of 11 Equinox Court, said. "I wish the owners cleaned up the property better."

The fire was able to spread on the ground and also through the trees, setting the second building and woods a blaze. Multiple residents also said that dry brush was not cleared from around the area after earlier storms and that added additional problems.

On Wednesday, the trees between and behind the buildings had gobs of white fuzz with burnt points hanging from between the leaves and the ground was again covered with seed fuzz in areas.

One thing the residents said clearly was how first responders handled the situation.

"I just don't have enough kudos for the police and fire people who did not want to use her name. "They were amazing, and without them, this could have spread and we all could have been out."

The Red Cross provided assistance to the eight families that were displaced the night of the fire.

"The Red Cross handed us cards for immediate needs. They were really good to us," Nemeckay said. "You just never expect this to happen to you, until it does."

He said that he lost everything in the fire as was evident by looking at the structures. The second floors on both buildings were completely gone and the contents of the interior strewn about the yard.

Other residents were looking for what was left.

"I did find a few things, but I am not sure I will ever get the smell out of them," one person said while holding some shoes and pictures. "It is just hard right now to think."



While no residents were injured at the blaze, several pets died in the fire, and one firefighter had to be treated for heat exhaustion. He had recovered the next day.

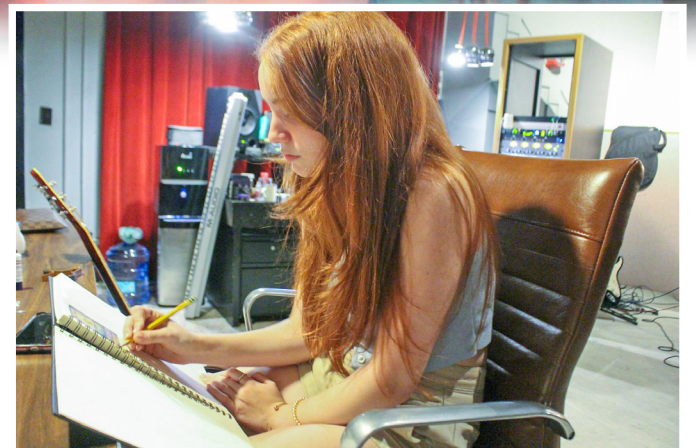

Local cafe highlights area artists

What goes into creating Uncommon Grounds' monthly art shows

SARATOGA — Regular customers of Uncommon Grounds expect more than coffee and bagels when they walk into any of the store's four locations. A board of seasonal specials occupies one wall of the cafes, but what adorns the other three rotates on a monthly basis as well. Only it's not harvest soup being exchanged for summertime teas here — it's a wide variety of local art.

Art Coordinator and Curator Fiona Neary grew up in a household chock-full of the store's history. Her father was the architect responsible for designing the first cafe, which opened in 1992 on Broadway in Saratoga. Soon after that, her mother installed some of her work in the shop,

becoming the first artist to ever show in an Uncommon Grounds. Neary described her own current role within the store as a full circle moment.

"They'd even bring me in when I was a baby to have breakfast," she said.

Neary is responsible for curating all of the art featured in Uncommon Grounds' four locations, which involves managing one show in Saratoga, two in Albany, and another in Clifton Park that all change on a monthly basis.

"I think they just want it to be a very cozy, homey environment to work and to have meetings in," she said.



"Having art on the walls is a part of that."

"I'll usually want to have a variety of different mediums," she continued, describing the curation process. "Sometimes there's a couple paintings and I'll add some photography into that, to make it a unique mix in each store."

the artist who produced it.

Jill Murphy is one such artist, who was invited by Neary to display in the Saratoga location this June. Murphy defines herself as an "Adirondack artist," since most of her oil paintings depict scenes

"I want to take them to some place that I really love," Murphy said. "I picked Saratoga because I have a load of paintings."

Since Saratoga has the most wall space, artists with larger portfolios will usually display in that location, Neary said.

Also showing their work in June are artists Andrew Fontaine, Diane Swanson and Tatiana Schynoll. Fontaine's art is currently up in the University Plaza location, Schynoll's work is on display in the Stuyvesant Plaza location, and Swanson's pieces can

be seen in Clifton Park.

Although this is Schynoll's first art show at an Albany location, her work has previously been featured at the shop

Neary said that artists will often email her asking to have a show, or submit an online registration form at uncommongrounds.com. Other times, she'll find work that catches her eye and personally reach out to

she encounters while hiking, canoeing and taking pictures up North. Her show is called "A Melody in Nature" and includes about 40 paintings.

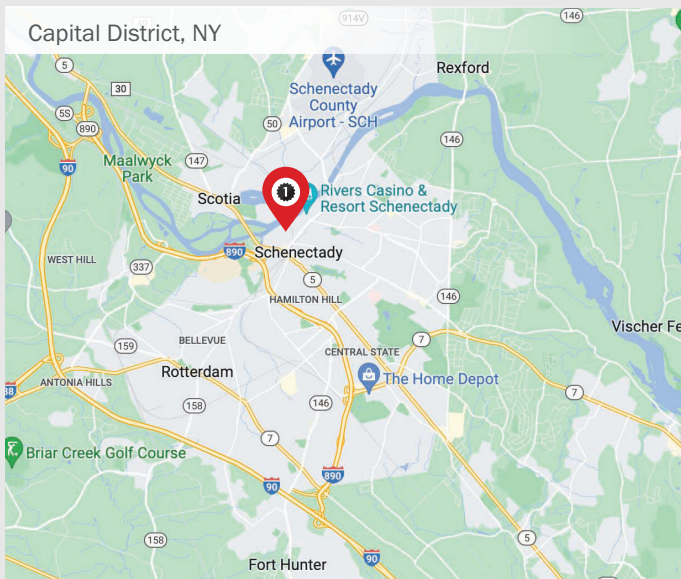

A summer of music

A trio of free concert series will keep the region rocking

ALBANY — Alive at Five, Rockin' on the River, and Summer at the Plaza Capital Concert Series lineups present a diverse array of performances featuring the area's most skilled original artists and vendors to enjoy this summer.

"It's going to be a great year for Alive at Five," said Keith Morales, special events coordinator for the City of Albany Office of Cultural Affairs.

Alive at Five remains an iconic Albany event. This year promises to host even more vendors than last year and a wide selection of musical talent.

Alive at Five kicks off on June 8 with Emo Pride Night, featuring the bands Hawthorne Heights and Bad Luck. Jam Night showcases the talent of Mihali and Side B on June 15. On Country Night on June 22, Matt Stell and Skeeter Creek will entertain at the family-friendly event.

Rock Night on July 6 has the talent of Plush and Super 400 performing, and July 13 celebrates Classic Rock Night with Sweet, Sly Fox, and The Hustlers.

July 20 features Reggae Night with The Skatalites and Dr. Jah and The Love Prophets. On July 27, Hip Hop Night will feature Rakim, DJ J-Ronin, and Camtron 5000. On August 3's R&B Night, concert-goers can watch Montpellier Jordan and DJ TGI close out the Alive at Five concert series.

"Alive at Five has so many different genres. It's exciting," said Morales. "When everyone comes out to each Alive at Five, they'll find a different experience every time."

The summer of music continues with Troy's quintessential series, Rockin' on the River.

"Rockin' on the River is back at Riverfront Park with four shows starting June 28 and running every other Wednesday until Aug.

9," said Olivia Clemente, executive director of the Downtown Troy Business Improvement District. "We are excited for Rockin' on the River to return with four shows to one of its former original locations, Riverfront Park."

On Wednesday, June 28, the first

performance of the year will be opened by Kristian Montgomery and the Winterkill Band. Headlining the event is the Grateful Dead tribute band from Clifton Park, Neon Avenue. On July 12, timeless music is celebrated by Legacy, dedicated to the classic ballads and anthems of Foreigner and Journey.

On July 26, Conehead Buddha will perform. The series comes to a close on Wednesday, Aug. 9, with upstate New York favorites Skeeter Creek.

"This event brings a lot of buzz and excitement in Downtown Troy," said Clemente. "We focus a lot on supporting our local bands, as you'll notice with our lineup, everything about Rockin' on the River supports local."

The 2023 Summer at the Plaza Capital Concert Series offers an equally exciting array of musical talent with its upcoming lineup. Iconic percussionist and singer Sheila E. will be featured at the Empire State Plaza's July 4 event, which is "one of the largest in the area."

"The Plaza is a great open-air space in Albany where you can come, bring your kids and enjoy free music. You can bring your whole family out," said Georgina Parsons, associate commissioner for communications and media for the New York State Office of General Services (OGS).

On July 12, concertgoers can watch the American alternative rock band

the Spin Doctors and the genre-defying band Cracker take the stage. On July 19, the legendary rock band Night Ranger will

continue to captivate audiences with their original and anthemic hits. The trailblazing Eli Young Band will perform their signature organic, live-show-focused country set on July 26.

On Aug. 2, trendsetting innovator Big Daddy Kane will feature performances by Roxanne Shanté and the iconic hip-hop group Black Sheep. Shanté is an American hip-hop pioneer, with her first single at the age of 14, titled "Roxanne's Revenge," setting the stage for her career as the first female rapper to have platinum singles and gold albums.

"The OGS team is excited to make the Empire State Plaza a space for all in the Capital Region to enjoy, particularly with our annual summer tradition of live performances like these great concerts," OGS Commissioner Jeanette Moy said. "The lineup for this year's Capital Concert Series includes something for everyone, with alternative, rock, country and hip-hop artists taking the stage and providing the public with evenings full of free entertainment."

"I don't have a purpose if I'm not an artist in some sort of way because of how I am," Corts said. "I've always been hardwired with the arts, and that's what makes sense to me."

This year, Corts performed as Rosie in "Mamma Mia: The Musical" at Bethlehem Central High School, and currently, she is co-producing two new music singles alongside Josh "Mirk" Mirsky at Foster House Studios in Albany.

Corts also made her first radio appearance and performed an acoustic set of her three singles "Temporarily," "Spring Cleaning" and "Crazy Too" during a segment with radio personality Chris Wienk of WEXT at WMHT Studios, Friday, May 19.

Her performance, according to Wienk, will be played on WEXT 97.7 FM and 106.1 FM Thursday, June 8, at 7 p.m. and 11:30 p.m. Videos to her singles will be posted online June 7

and June 8.

Wienk first heard Corts' single "Temporarily" from co-worker and radio personality Andy Gregory. Gregory received a note from Corts' father, Michael, about the single.

Gregory and Wienk played "Temporarily" on rotation, and they liked it. Wienk said the song possessed a good vibe and had nice phrasing in it.

Wienk was impressed with Corts and the overall poise she expressed in her songs and interview session.

"I was most struck by her performance poise. Sofia was confident, prepared, and was great fun to talk with," Wienk said. "She has a very good story to tell for such a young artist."

Special bond between Corts and Mirsky

Corts and Mirsky share a special bond that extends far beyond music. Mirsky



has seen Corts grow up as a young child, watching her perform in theater performances at school and in a local theater group, and Mirsky helped Corts co-write songs at just 13 years old. Mirsky and Michael are also childhood friends.

Corts reflected on the influence Mirsky had on her in her early years.

Inside Foster House Studios during a recent

rehearsal, she played two YouTube videos on her phone. One was of her singing to "Grenade" (Bruno Mars). The other one featured her and brother, Joey, listening to Mirsky's band perform the song, "Shady," on the studio couch.

"Those (songs) are nostalgic for me because that's what I grew up listening to," Corts said. "When I got older, I re-

listened to these songs and I really appreciated the genius in (them). ... This is cool because I'm working with Mirk rather than just listening to him."

Mirsky, who has produced music for Alica Keys and Jay-Z, remains in awe of Corts' talent and is overwhelmed by the influence he had on her career.

"This is cool for me to

understand the influence that I have on her and for her to be as good as she is, and I am still overwhelmed by that." Mirsky said. "It's validation on a different level that you don't often come across. ... These are the moments in life that I have to take all the way in and remember them."

Mirsky said he loves the creative journey that he is on with Corts and to be involved in the early stages of success for Corts is exciting.

"I'm going to be able to say, 'Hey I was there in the beginning.' I've been there since day one and it's great," Mirsky said. "We're making some beautiful stuff, and when I've shared it with people, nobody can believe it's coming from this young girl who is so well-developed at creating, writing, and bringing me these ideas to the table that are already well-developed."

Corts' songs were shared with Troy native and lifelong musician, Peter Iselin. Iselin, who has been in the music industry for over 30 years, 13 of which were in Los Angeles, CA, was put onto her music

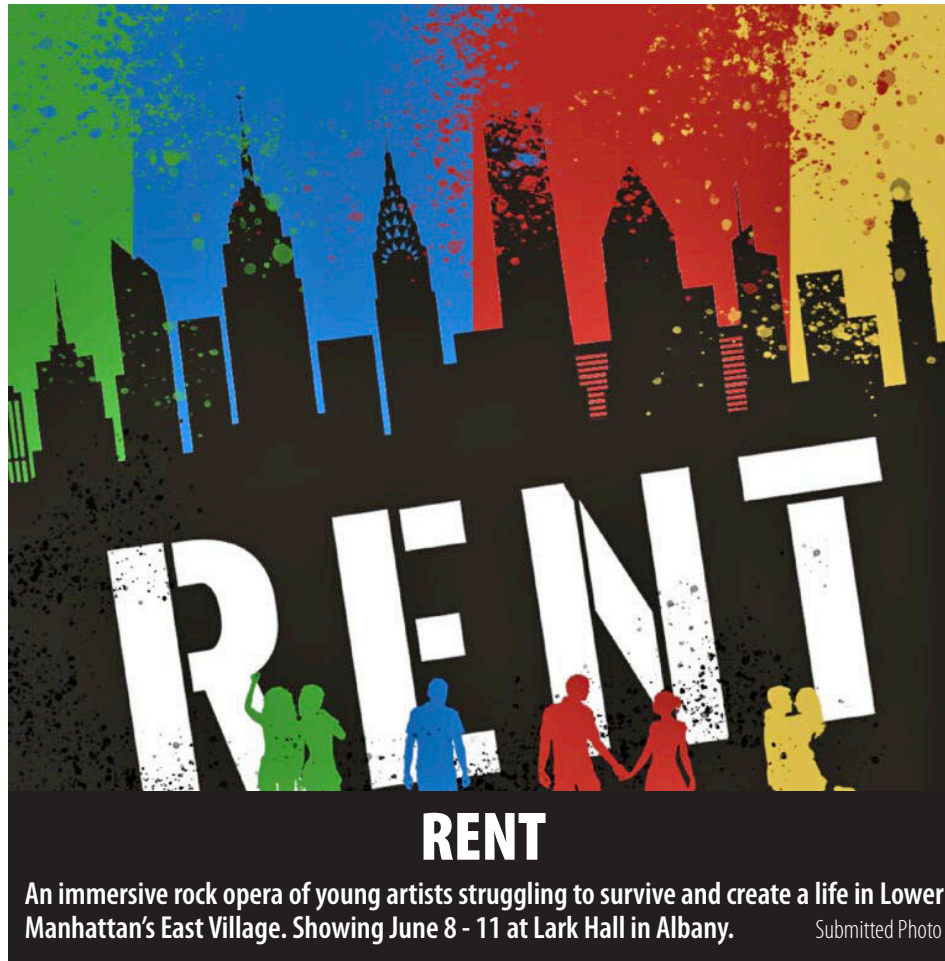

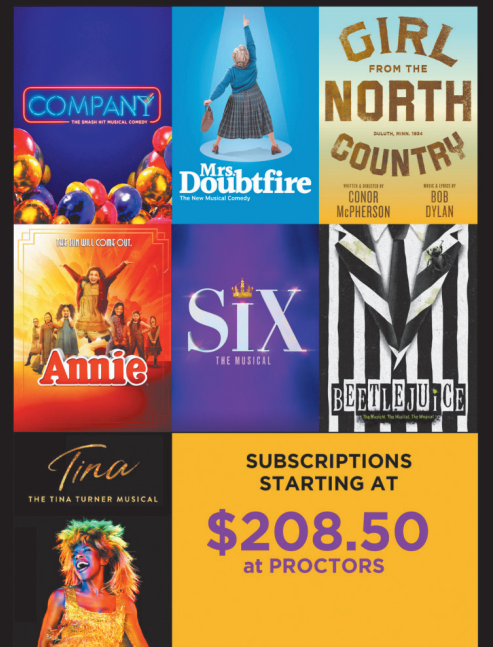

A case for helmets

Some cyclists may shun this life-saving equipment, but the consequences could be serious

DELMAR — Squirrels and rabbits aren't the only creatures scampering about, reveling in the Capital District's magnificent springtime. Bicyclists are out in full force in our parks and on our bike paths, streets and even major roads, enjoying the sunshine and the feel of the gentle wind on their faces. Sounds idyllic, but a danger lurks that all too many cyclists ignore — the necessity of wearing bike helmets to protect their brains if an accident occurs and they fall

on their heads.

A 45-year-old male engineer named Walter, who did not want to use his last name, was soon to move permanently to Albany County in 1991. He was a skilled and careful biker, often joyfully riding 30 or 40 miles on weekend afternoons.

One Saturday morning, Walter biked to Westchester, where witnesses say he hit a pothole in the road, sailed through the air, and landed on his face.

Walter immediately lost consciousness and was taken by ambulance to the

nearest hospital, having permanently lost half his teeth. Luckily, he was wearing a properly fitting helmet, which split into two pieces.

He regained consciousness in the hospital, but experienced a complete personality change, greeting all his relatives who raced to the hospital loudly and effusively, as if he were a political candidate running for office. Walter had no idea where he was.

He didn't regain his senses for eight hours and suffered from headaches and

pain for weeks afterward. Walter said his dental work took nearly a year, and doctors told his wife that had he not been wearing a helmet, he would have either died or suffered a traumatic brain injury, with likely lifelong consequences.

Another bike helmet story had a much more tragic ending. An Albany County resident named Joseph signed up for the Tour De Cure race benefiting diabetes seven years ago. His wife said that on the day of the race, her husband was exhausted, failed to eat nourishing food

that would sustain him on the long ride, and worst of all, wore a helmet with an anchoring strap that was too loose.

As Joseph was going down a steep hill at rapid speed, the tube of the rear wheel blew, exited between the rim of the wheel and the tire, wrapped around the gear mechanism, and instantly stopped the bike. The force threw him to the pavement, splitting the back of his head.

A helicopter took him to Albany Medical Center Hospital, where he was put on life support. After 16

days, the decision was made to stop treatment. Joseph died 20 minutes later.

Suffering post traumatic stress, Joseph's wife did not ride her bike for years.

Although the passage of time helps, she still grieves for her husband, whom she dearly loved. She cringes when she sees people riding without helmets.

"I believe they should be universally required," she said.

New York state, however, only requires children 13 or younger to do so.

A case for helmets

Research, as well as interviews with about 30 Delmar residents of all ages, indicates that helmet use is spotty and is strongly age related. Sex plays a role as well, with men much more likely to shun helmets than women.

Elementary school age students, often required by their parents to wear a helmet, nearly always do so. Fifth grader Madeleine Walthall was particularly

emphatic in her support.

“I don’t want a head injury,” she said. “It can ruin the rest of your life. It’s common sense. I wear a seat belt, so of course I wear a helmet.”

Eleven-year-old Scarlett Snow agreed, claiming that she never climbs on her bike without first donning her helmet.

Middle and especially high school students tended to be less enthused about

helmets than younger schoolchildren.

High schooler Zack Shekhler said he is always helmetless going to and from school.

“It’s uncomfortable and it’s just more stuff you have to carry,” he said.

A group of high school boys, all friends, said they only wore helmets on major highways, but almost never on small streets in their neighborhood.

They refused to state their names, worrying that their parents would be angry and possibly punish them. Other teenagers strongly disagree.

“I’ve worn a helmet ever since I learned to ride a bike. I’m an intelligent person, and I can’t imagine having a cognitive disability for the rest of my life,” high school student Owen Karmel said.

Similar views were expressed by teenager David Bethman.

“I’m convinced that many drivers don’t like sharing the road with bikers and like to ride fast,” he said. “The reasons people have for failing to wear a helmet are stupid. I’d rather wear one than have my brains scattered all over Delaware Avenue.”

Other excuses to not

wear a helmet mentioned by students, social scientists, and several local social workers: not wanting to sweat or mess up their hair, denying the possibility of crashing or of the dire consequences that can follow, discomfort, annoyance, believing themselves too old and too “cool” to wear a helmet, or rebelling against parental instructions or rules.

Peer pressure undoubtedly plays a role. Perhaps the most important reason for teen helmet refusal is the common feeling of invincibility at this age. “Sure there

might be a few risks, but it certainly won’t happen to me,” was a frequent answer to “Why not?”

Few riders were aware of the dangers they could not control on the road, even if they were experienced riders. Possible reasons for a crash are numerous, with cars hitting them high on the list.

Additional hazards: other bikers knocking them off their bikes, bike defects, a sudden burst of blinding sunlight on a cloudy day, animals such as squirrels or rabbits racing across the

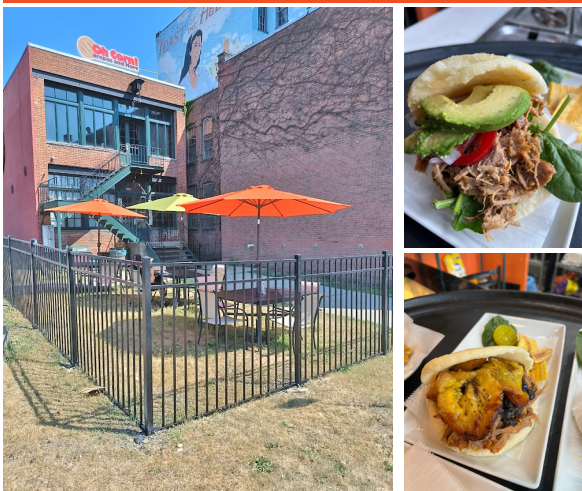

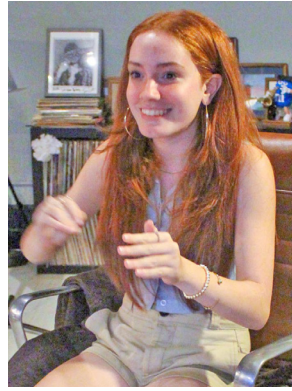

Child and TLC. Along with ’90s pop influences, Corts makes it her mission to bring meaningful songs to airwaves and stages.
“Music these days is just ... there’s no meaning to it. It’s all just to make a song, make a hit.” Corts said. “Songs back then, music spoke to people more. These artists in the ’90s devoted their lives to music and I just want to bring that back.”
Corts also wants to introduce potential fans and peers to new musical genres and doesn’t want to

keep her music, or songs she likes, for herself. Most importantly, she is looking forward to the future.
Corts hopes to perform more, come out with more songs, and do bigger things, she said.
“As I move forward further, I’ll look back and be like, that’s crazy. I recorded my first song when I was 14 – that’s just so weird, but it’s also normal.” Corts said. “It’s just how life is now.”
As for advice to young aspiring talents dreaming to make it big one day, Corts

sums it up this way.
“When inspiration comes, you just have to take it and do it and always document everything. If you’re a writer and if you think of something, write it down. If you’re a musician and if you hear something, record it. Because then you always forget. You think you remember and you don’t. That’s the thing and then you lose this really awesome thing that could have been. You just missed out on your own opportunity. You just made it your own fault.

road, rocks or bumps in the road, traffic cones or other obstructions, or children suddenly running in front of the them, requiring an emergency stop. All can result in serious head injuries or death if a cyclist's head hits unforgiving concrete.

According to attorney Michael Kaplen, a renowned specialist in the field of brain injuries, and chair of the New York State Brain Association, traumatic brain injury is an all too common result of a bicycle crash, especially when the rider fails to wear a helmet. Besides death, cognitive decline is manifested in an inability to think clearly, which sometimes lasts for a lifetime. Emotional and behavioral changes often occur, as do depression, speech, reading, writing and

communication difficulties. Worst of all, there is a high risk of suicide. Wearing a helmet is a small price to pay to lessen the chance of experiencing these terrifying aftereffects of a bicycle accident.

Local cafe highlights area artists

in Saratoga on three separate occasions, beginning in 2016. The pieces she has chosen to exhibit in Stuyvesant are part of a portfolio entitled "In Full Color," which consists of abstract oil and encaustic (wax) paintings.

"I'm really hoping that my body of work enlivens the space," Schynoll said.

Like most of the art that Uncommon

Grounds features in its shops, both Murphy and Schynoll's work is for sale. According to Neary, artists receive 80 percent of the profits made from these sales, while Uncommon Grounds retains 20 percent. Customers are able to buy work directly at the register and then pick up their purchases at the end of the current month or beginning of the next one, when the show has officially closed.

Installing the work is usually a joint effort between Neary and the artists themselves.

"We'll have a lot of communication back and forth about what looks the best," Neary said. "We'll make sure both of our visions line up for it."

"It's a really fun position for me to be in because I am also an artist," she continued. "While I'm talking with these artists throughout the month, and specifically when we're installing, I get to ask them questions about their process, and it's really enlightening for me to just hear about how other people create art."

As far as future plans go, Neary is considering the idea of featuring some children's work. She would also like to curate more group shows.

"There's a high percentage of one-artist shows because many people like filling the shop to display their body of work and prefer

that, but I also always love it when there's a group of artist friends that want to work together," she said. "Sometimes I also will put two people together if they don't have enough on their own, when I think their style will match, and that's magical."

Schynoll remembers going to the shop in Saratoga frequently while growing up, especially after class in high school.

"I think it's really great that Uncommon Grounds has rotating art exhibitions, so customers can see a different set of work throughout the year," she said. "Uncommon Grounds has been a big part of my life, so I'm really happy to exhibit my work there."

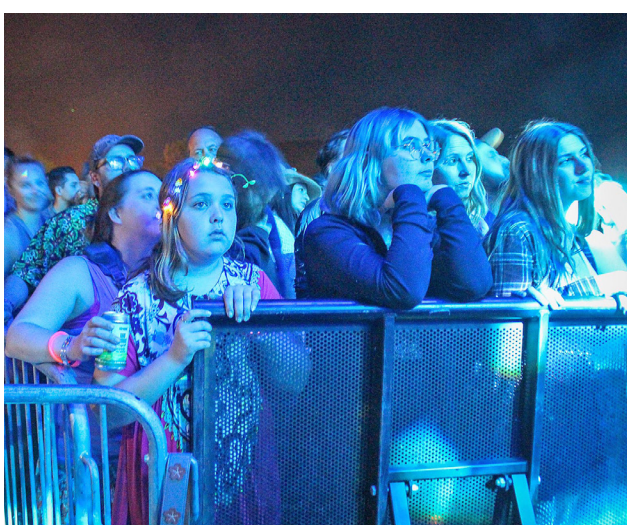
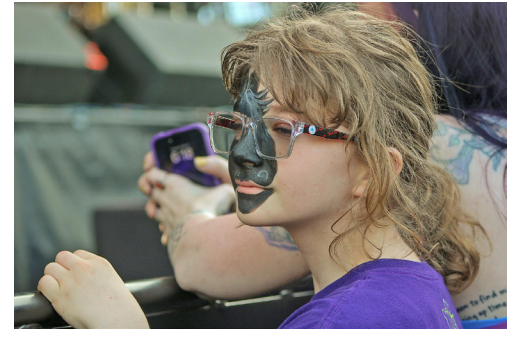
