DELMAR — Hidden off the deadend road is a time machine, as the suburbs melt into the quiet tranquility of Normans Kill Ravines Park on 70 Wright Lane. The park is on beloved ground for Delmar resident Olive Mae Wright Hallenbeck.

"People have no idea what that used to be back there," said Hallenbeck. What are now biking trails and the inviting landscape of the new park were previously hay fields and the sprawling farmland that belonged to the Wright family's 101 Acre Ranch.

Man reports accident at station, charged with aggravated DWI

DELMAR - A 40-year-old Glenmont man entered the Bethlehem police station on Wednesday, June 28 at approximately 8:06 a.m. to report he was involved in a two-car accident at the intersection of Route 9W and Feura Bush Road a half-hour earlier.

While a later investigation found no evidence of the accident, there was plenty of evidence, according to reports, that the man was drunk.

A patrol officer responded to the station to talk to the man and observed that he had no visible injuries, but did have his black polo shirt on inside out, had slurred speech, watery bloodshot eyes and had an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath.

A second officer arrived at the station and noticed that the man parked his 2005 Toyota Carolla in a parking space marked "Police Vehicle Parking Only, Chief of Police."

In the back parking lot of the police station, he was given and failed, field sobriety tests and tested positive for breath alcohol on a pre-screening device. The man was taken into custody for DWI and walked into the station.

When inside, at approximately 9:38 a.m., he provided a breath sample that returned a .28 percent BAC. The legal limit is .08 and the threshold for aggravated DWI is .18.

The man was charged with aggravated DWI and given an appearance ticket for Tuesday, July 18 for Bethlehem Town Court.

Further investigation by Bethlehem police found that there was no physical evidence of the accident in or around the roundabout, and a review of camera

footage the next day from a local business that has the intersection in its view from 5:30 a.m. - 8:06 a.m., showed no evidence the car was there.

DELMAR - On Friday, June 30 at approximately 12:02 a.m., Bethlehem police observed a white 2023 Jeep Cherokee traveling west on Delaware Avenue with no lights on. The Jeep turned onto Adams Street and across Kenwood Avenue when officers performed a traffic stop on North Street. Officers observed a

strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from the Jeep and asked the driver, a 43-year-old Delmar man, about his lights not being on and he turned them on.

After officers requested he exit the vehicle, they

NOTICE OF MODIFICATION OF ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT AND **CONSTRUCTION PLAN FOR CHAMPLAIN HUDSON POWER EXPRESS**

Please take notice that, on or about July 5, 2023, CHPE LLC and CHPE Properties. Inc. (collectively referred to as "CHPE") intend to request modification of an Environmental Management & Construction Plan ("EM&CP") for the Temporary Laydown Yards Segment of the proposed Champlain Hudson Power Express ("CHPE") Project approved by the New York State Public Service Commission ("PSC") on February 16, 2023. The proposed modification would add a temporary laydown yard on previously disturbed lands in the Town of Bethlehem (Albany County) which will be used for construction staging, marshalling, and storage during construction.

CHPE holds a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need (Certificate), pursuant to Article VII of the Public Service Law (PSL), to construct and operate the CHPE Project. The PSC approved CHPE's Temporary Laydown Yards EM&CP; modifications to that approved EM&CP which impact areas not previously included in the EM&CP review process require additional public notice and an opportunity for the community to comment. Details of the planned work locations, including an overview map of the proposed route, are available on the Project website at: https://chpexpress.com/overviewof-public-documents/environmental-management-construction-plan/. In general, construction activities for this Segment are anticipated to commence in summer 2023. Construction of the laydown yard will generally occur between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., with any high-noise construction activities occurring during daylight hours as much as possible.

The approved Temporary Laydown Yards EM&CP and Bethlehem Annex Laydown Yard Change Notice provide detailed information regarding how the temporary laydown yard will be constructed. The document describes and depicts the specific location of these yards including the Construction Zone and temporary work areas, as well as descriptions of work to be performed, plan and profile drawings, and protocols to be used during construction to protect the community and the environment, and to comply with the CHPE Certificate.

Four die in tragic New Scotland Fire

Small child and three adults perish, teen jumps from window

VOORHEESVILLE - A fast moving fire at a farmhouse at 64 Normanskill Road killed four people on Saturday, July 8.

At approximately 5:15 a.m. a woman called 911 to report the fire and say she was trapped in the house with a 5-year-old girl. The pair could not escape the room due to an air conditioner in the secondfloor window.

Dispatchers tried to help the woman find another way out of the structure, but were unable to do so before they lost contact.

When firefighters arrived, the house was fully involved, said New Salem Fire Chief Steve Ayers.

"We knew right away that people were trapped and we had to get inside," he said. "When the call came in we immediately called (other departments) in."

Ayers and firefighters from Slingerlands and New Salem, who were first on the scene, attempted to go through the front door.

"We gained entry through the front door, but the fire was so intense. The heat pushed us back," he said.

According to Ayers, a firefighter from New Salem arrived with his civilian car

and had a ladder on the roof and was able to access the room on the second floor with the air conditioner by prying it loose, but the heat and smoke was so intense, they could not access the room.

"It was just an awful scene," Slingerlands Chief Craig Sluers said. "When the water falling on your head from (fire department hoses) was burning us we could tell the intensity of the fire."

The house was a farmhouse built in the early 1900s and also had a metal roof that kept the heat in, according to firefighters.

The family ran the Circle Tree Farm on the property and sold a variety of goods including eggs, flowers and firewood.

The Neander family has farmed the land for generations. Arthur (AJ) Neander, 35, has been running the farm since his mother Ann died last November. He perished in the fire along with his uncle Dale Denato,64, who was disabled and AJ was caring for, according to the Go Fund Me for the family.

Rebecca Montersosso, 40, who made the initial call and daughter Emily Neander, 5, died inside.

Emily was a student at the Voorheesville Elementary school and the district released a statement Sunday.

"This is heartbreaking news," Superintendent Frank Macri said. "The loss of a student is always tragic, but this is compounded by the community's loss of several members of the family. On behalf of the school district, I want to express my heartfelt sympathy to those who loved and cared for the family."

Macri notified district staff and families Saturday of the tragedy, and the school's crisis team was activated to develop a grief support plan for students and staff in need.

AJ's 15-year-old son Anthony jumped from a second-story window and was the lone survivor of the fire.

Friends of the family have set up a page to help with funeral expenses at gofundme.com/f/ community-tragedy.

"As we all know funeral services are costly for one person let alone four. So I am starting this to help with the funeral expenses and the expenses of getting some new things for Anthony as everything he owned has been lost due to that fire," the page said.

The New Salem Fire Department is also meeting Wednesday to discuss what to do to help the family, Ayers said.

The cause of the fire is under investigation.

Firefighters from New Salem, which covered the district where the fire happened, Delmar, Westmere, Voorheesville, Elsmere, Slingerlands, McKownville, Onesquethaw, Selkirk and North Bethlehem all responded.



Town opens safe space to exchange goods

Area is covered by video surveillance cameras

DELMAR — There is now a safer place in Bethlehem to exchange goods that are bought and sold on electronic marketplaces.

On Wednesday, June 7, the Town of Bethlehem and the Bethlehem Police Department installed an e-commerce parking exchange zone at Town Hall on Delaware Avenue.

"When meeting others to buy or sell something from an internet post or app, it is important to take necessary safety precautions," Police Chief Gina Cocchiara said. "Our designated ecommerce parking exchange zone is under 24-hour police dispatch surveillance."

The exchange zone is marked with a sign in the first parking spot closest to the east side of the Bethlehem Town Hall building at 445 Delaware Ave.

Town workers trimmed trees to allow better visibility for the

surveillance cameras. The idea has been implemented in other towns in the area, and Cocchiara said she modeled it after what East Greenbush police established.

"I communicate often with other chiefs in the area, and we thought this was a good idea for our community," she said.

Police recommend, if possible, exchangers should bring someone with them and offer to exchange money with an app instead of using cash or checks.

"If you choose not to use our e-commerce parking exchange zone, it is important to meet in a public place, well populated and preferably during the daylight hours," she said.



Reichman wants to also battle against teenagers born in the Generation Z demographic who want to stay inside their homes more as they lack personal engagement on a daily basis. Many of Reichman's peers didn't take part in the school's Eagle challenge for mental health and the winter dance due to lack of attendance.

Reichman wants to help his peers get off their screens, interact in their town with friends, and take part in fun community events that encourage people to come together.

History of the Cabaret

The idea of the cabaret came about as an experiment during a Bethlehem First Night around six or seven years ago. DeCancio, a member of Bethlehem Opportunities Unlimited, wanted to find out with the high school principal what high school students wanted to do for an event.

The high school principal and DeCancio created a Google poll with five to ten options of things that students wanted to do and the main thing that kept coming up was a cabaret-style night. Each First Night event attracted 35-40 students to perform in front of an audience.

The cabaret event during the first night helped DeCancio create a town youth advisory council. Children and teens could voice their concerns about the things that are needed in their community in the council.

We live in a great town but what can be done better? There was talk about a lack of programming for younger kids, tweens, teens, under-tweens, and for seniors." DeCancio said. "I organized the meeting with Heather, Jason, and the kids and they sat around here and spitballing ideas and cabaret just kept on rising to the top."

Cabaret, according to DeCancio, was something that the children wanted to do. The event will also have the assistance of high school music director, Mr. Jason

Dashew, who will provide sound and accessories for the students.

The history and heritage of the Normans Kill Ravines Park

The Wright family's attachment to the property can be traced back to Walter Wright. Shortly after his marriage to Olive Tolhurst McNary in 1910, the newlyweds, along with his parents and siblings, moved to the farmland on North Street.

The 1913 Family Directory of Delmar records the two families living next door to each other. Since then, members of the Wright family have continued to live there for over 100 more years. Wright Lane would then be named after the family farm, a common practice of the era.

The history of street and place names is unique to every town. "In the 1900s, the name went along with who the property owner was," explained Susan Leath, former Town of Bethlehem Historian and active Bethlehem Historical Association member.

"Often the street names were named after the people and the families that lived



there. That's one way to remember who the families are," added Leath. With the passing of time and the creation of subdivisions,

street names gradually have dwindled in their association with the original families that lived on them.

After turning eighteen, Hallenbeck left the farm when she married. However, her fond memories illuminate a vivid picture of her childhood spent at 101 Acre Ranch.

"The barns are what I'd like to have remembered," she said. The property's barns have since been demolished. The barns were multipurpose and essential to transitioning the farm through several stages of growth and the property's evolution over the decades.

101 Acre Ranch boasts a rich equine history, dating to Walter Wright's Riding

School in the 1930s and early 1940s. Advertisements from the school praise Wright's 'exceptional' horses and the benefits of horseback riding

as an activity for everyone. A favorite memory of

Hallenbeck's is spending time horseback riding. As a young girl growing up on the farm, Hallenbeck had a horse named Silver, named after The Lone Ranger.

"I could ride all the way out to the railroad track," she said. Hallenbeck would ride Silver, where the Ravines biking trails now stretch out. "It didn't look then like it does now," she quipped.

Later, the farm became actively involved in the dairy business, with Hallenbeck

recalling how "Grandpa Wright had dairy cows."

"It was a lot of work to keep that place going," she added. There were no snow plows; winters were difficult to combat at times and bred a sense of endurance. Tractors would help haul them out of snow banks on the road to the farm.

On a recent visit, Hallenbeck saw the newly paved road at Normans Kill Ravines

Park. "Bethlehem has gone from a little quaint place to a beautiful town," said Hallenbeck. "When I grew up, there were dirt roads. Back where the park was, it was almost like a secret because it was a dead-end road. Over all the years, it's changed."

Hallenbeck's goal is for the park to commemorate the Wright Family's heritage and for people to realize the land and that her family "lived there and made a living off that land."

"I would like to bring awareness to what the land was," said Hallenbeck, "and would like it to be recognized for the Wright Family."



Possessed with a serious swagger and a slightly steely edge, two traits that treated him well on full-throttle rockers like "She's Country" and "Crazy Town," Aldean also had a way with a ballad, and these two gifts helped him become one of the biggest new country stars of the 2000s, racking up hits like "Big Green Tractor," "Dirt Road Anthem," and "Take a Little Ride." Aldean stayed on the top of the charts for the better part of two decades, reaching number one on Billboard's Country Airplay chart nearly every year between 2005 and 2020. During this time, he cannily adopted some current trends -- "Burnin' It Down," the doubleplatinum hit from 2014, incorporated R&B rhythms -- as he quietly emphasized his softer side, one that was showcased well on "If I Didn't Love You," a duet with Carrie Underwood which was the first hit from Macon, a 2021 album that had a companion in 2022's Georgia. 

slowly to prevent clumping. Pour mixture over melted butter. Do not stir.




