

Fire rips through River Road Residence

SELKIRK - Another weekend fire ripped through a local residence on Saturday, but all members of the family escaped and local volunteer departments were able to contain the blaze.

At approximately 7 a.m., Bethlehem police received a call from 201 River Road reporting a fire at the home.

When officers arrived at the scene, all occupants of the house were already out, but the house had heavy fire and smoke coming from a secondfloor bedroom. Selkirk Fire Department personnel and equipment arrived at the scene shortly after, and began fighting the fire.

The damage was limited to one upstairs bedroom and one occupant was taken to the hospital for smoke inhalation.

Two of the family's cats perished in the blaze.

Selkirk was assisted by Delmar, Elsmere, Slingerlands and North Bethlehem Fire Departments and Delmar-Bethlehem EMS.

According to police, the fire is under investigation to determine the cause and origin of the fire.

Man arrested again for 2020 burglary and credit card theft

ALBANY - City police arrested a 31-year-old man on unrelated charges on July 5 and found that he was wanted for not showing up to Albany County Court to face a series of burglaries in June 2020 in Bethlehem.

According to reports, Richard Agley, of Albany, allegedly broke into a home on Euclid Avenue in Delmar in June 2020 and attempted to break into another.

He allegedly stole cash and credit cards that were used in Albany. Bethlehem police detectives interviewed

Agley a week later and arrested him on charges of burglary and grand larceny, both felonies, and criminal mischief and identity theft, both misdemeanors. At that time he was arraigned on the charges by Bethlehem Town Judge Andrew Kirby and sent to the Albany County jail until a preliminary hearing in August 2020 in Albany County Court.

He did not show up and on November 9, 2020 County Judge Andra Ackerman issued a bench warrant for Agley.

On July 5 he was processed on the warrant and sent from Albany City Court to the Albany County jail.

Uniting Bethlehem candidate restored to November ballot

State Supreme Court judge overturns Albany BOE decision

ALBANY - A judge reversed an Albany County Board of Elections decision to not allow a Glenmont man on the ballot this November because he did not have enough valid petition signatures.

Albany County State Supreme Court Michael Mackey issued a decision and order on Friday, July 7 that restored Kellin Rowlands to the ballot as a candidate for the Bethlehem Town Board under the Uniting Bethlehem party after he was removed by the Board of Elections on June

The removal was initiated based on objections filed on June 5 by Bethlehem resident, Jeff Baker, for 256 of the 1,078 ballots submitted by Rowlands on May 26. Baker is a member of the Bethlehem Democratic Committee and serves as its 2nd Vice Chair.

According to the decision, "Baker alleged that certain line-by-line signatures were...illegible, did not contain the first name of the individual who allegedly signed the petition, were printed, or otherwise could not be matched to voter registration."

In its review of Baker's objections, the board of elections agreed with Baker, but did reduce the number

of invalid signatures to 156 and conceded the board miscalculated the number of signatures by one, leaving Rowlands six signatures short of the required number of 928 needed to be on the ballot.

Rowlands hired attorney Matthew Clyne to review the objections and represent him in the proceedings. Clyne is a former Albany County Board of Elections Commissioner and is very familiar with objections to petition signatures.

After the BOE made its final determination, Clyne filed with the court to review the case and provide evidence the signatures were

"It is really hard to compare signatures [on petitions] to those on file," Clyne said. "Lots of the signatures on file are coming from DMV or other sources and are not of good quality."

Clyne explained that the use of digital recording is not the same as a "wet ink" signature and that people's signature may also change over time or because the method by which they are recorded is different.

At the Supreme Court's evidentiary hearing on June 27, Clyne provided, and the court accepted evidence through witnesses and affidavits that supported the signatures of 10 people. In addition, Mackey reviewed the signature comparisons provided by the BOE, himself, and validated an additional 15 signatures.

"The court has compared the signatures of the [15

voters] with the signature cards on file with the Board and finds that they substantially compare and are valid," he wrote in the ruling.

The decision orders the BOE to put Rowlands on the ballot. Baker said that he will not appeal but also said the BOE may on procedural grounds.

"The Board of Elections is not made up of Dems," Baker said. "This is a rare opportunity where both sides, Dems and Republicans, came together. Both sides had problems with [Rowlands] petitions."

Because this case is not for a primary and the election is in November, the court's timeline for appeal will not be as short. The usual time allowed for an appeal in an election case is usually a matter of a few days. Spotlight News will report on any appeal when

For now, Rowland said he is moving on.

"They [Democrats] observed my candidacy to be a real threat," Rowlands said. "I am coming to this with very little experience. I am not part of the two major parties. I am the little guy

Rowlands says that he can now open a campaign account and begin the race.

"I am in full-on campaign mode now. We have built out a campaign team and will begin fundraising," he said. "My next step is to get out of the blocks fast and hard."

Body in Hudson River identified

SELKIRK - Firefighters pulled the body of a missing Albany woman from the Hudson River near Henry Hudson Park on Tuesday, July 11.

The body was identified as Okelly Yhap, 29. Yhap was last seen on Sunday, July 9, in Albany. Albany police issued a statement the day after she went missing.

Calls to 911 from two sailboats on the river came in at approximately 11:33 a.m. for a body floating one eighth of a mile north of the park on the east side of the river.

Bethlehem police, Delmar-Bethlehem EMS, Albany County Sheriff's Department and Selkirk Fire Department were dispatched to the scene.

"We dock our boat on the south end of the [Henry Hudson] park, so it was close for us," Selkirk Fire Chief Tom

Neri said. "The Sheriff's Department sent their boat up from Ravena, and we both commenced a search of the river."

The Selkirk boat did not locate Yhap on the first trip down the river, and there was limited information from the callers about the exact location. Selkirk met up with the Sheriff's Department boat well to the south of the park and together they headed north and eventually Selkirk located the body.

"We had a member of EMS and a Bethlehem police officer on board, which is required as a witness when we pull someone out," Neri said. "It is easier now that the Bethlehem police have body cameras."

The boats returned to the fishing dock at Henry Hudson Park and the Albany County Coroner took possession of the body for an investigation.

The Times Union reported on July 10 that Yhap was vulnerable because her family reported she was hearing

> impaired, had a history of depression, and had been off her medication. She was last seen at 5:30 a.m. Sunday on Alexander Street, between Clinton and Elizabeth

Yhap was the older sister of Katrina Thomas, who was

10-years-old when she was killed by a stray bullet in 2008, the paper reported.

This is the second of three bodies pulled from the stretch of the Hudson River from Troy to Bethlehem over the past seven days.

The two others were pulled out near Troy, one on Saturday, July 15 and the other on Wednesday, July 12. Both are under investigation.


According to reports, the officer pulled behind the vehicle and made contact with the occupants

Rail Trail bridge fails during construction

Investigation underway to determine cause of buckled steel

SLINGERLANDS - All work on the new county rail trail bridge stopped Wednesday, July 12 as the structure buckled. An investigation is underway to find the cause and determine a new plan for the span.

According to Albany County, workers were pouring concrete for the road bed when the steel beams sagged and buckled. No one was injured on the site.

"Construction has temporarily stopped on the bridge until an investigation is conducted to determine what happened and why," Albany County Director of Communications Mary Rozak said.

We will report the cause when the information becomes available.

The old bridge was a 100-year-old relic from the Delaware and Hudson Railroad. It is being replaced by a new, twogirder bridge. The \$1.9

million span will replace the aging, 42-foot-long structure, while raising it to 15 feet, 6 inches above the roadway to meet state requirements.

The County had obtained the bridge in 2008 despite a report that deemed the metal structure and surrounding concrete to be in poor condition. The span has since been



incorporated into the popular rail trail used by pedestrians and bicyclists between Voorheesville and Albany.

Two years later, the County was prompted to make temporary repairs following a New York state Department of Transportation report that warned the bridge's "load carrying capacity" was in

Construction on the new bridge was slated to begin in the summer of 2020; however, the outbreak of COVID-19 that spring halted those plans. A lawsuit with Sprint Communication was settled last year, with the County agreeing to cover costs of moving communication lines that currently run

along the bridge.

In 2019, the County estimated that the bridge was struck by nine times over the preceding 11 years. A Queensbury motorist was arrested in 2021 after driving the cement truck he was operating into the bridge. The truck was lodged underneath the bridge for hours, causing the roadway to be closed before the truck could be removed.

The new construction is expected to allow the neighboring Slingerlands Fire District to travel under the bridge, improving response times. The southern sidewalk on New Scotland Road will be removed, allowing for an ADA-compliant sidewalk on the opposite side. The wider roadway should also provide shoulders for cyclists.



Second-hand apparel market thriving in Bethlehem

on Adams Place in Delmar, which has been operated by the First United Methodist Church for the past 31 years, sells the same categories of items, but for women, men and children, and receives its inventory through donations. Treasure Cove even sells resale socks, but draws the line at used underwear.

While The Closet Shop includes couture items among its offerings, the other two shops do not.

Nationwide, the second-hand apparel market has grown by 24% since last year, and predictions say it will continue to grow as people move away from buying full-priced clothing. One recent report by the consignment company ThredUp stated that the U.S. second-hand market is expected to more than double by 2027, reaching \$70 billion. According to the report, increased second-hand clothing sales is being driven by consumers seeking value, as well as younger purchasers – particularly Gen Z – for whom sustainability is a major factor.

At Bethlehem's three resale shops, both factors weigh high on customers' minds. With most adult items priced between \$3 and \$5 and infant, toddler and children's items at \$1-\$2 at Treasure Cove, the prices are "incomparable," according to Taylor MacMillan, 28, who grew up in Bethlehem. MacMillan said he exclusively shops at thrift stores and had just gotten three shirts for \$3.

"One person's garbage is another person's treasure," said his dad Stephen MacMillan, who was shopping with him. "You use your money wisely here."

Jessie Reinhart, a Delmar resident and mother of three, said she shops at Treasure Cove because the prices and quality are good.

"I have three kids so prices are important," she said and added that because of inflation, "I am trying harder to get what I need here, like to find shoes for the kids and not just get random cute extras."

"I love it here. Where can you go and spend \$10 and get 10 things?" said Stacey Troeger, who used to live in Delmar and was shopping on an "everything for \$1" sale day.

"We get people shopping here from across the economic spectrums," said Nancy Hodge, a 20-year volunteer at Treasure Cove.

Treasure Cove's shoppers are multicultural and come from all over the Town of Bethlehem, Albany, Ravena and Voorheesville, added Liz Lane, another Treasure Cove volunteer.

Anna Compas, Treasure Cove's Manager and a volunteer, said she thinks inflation has "definitely" resulted in increased sales.

"People come in and say, for example, how much a swimsuit costs at a department store, but they can get it here for a few dollars," she said.

At The Closet Shop, a consignment-based store open since 2004, prices are "reduced," but not inexpensive like a thrift store, said owner Susan Eyer.

She explained the economic appeal of high-end resale purchases. Her customers tend to be middle and upper middle class professionals, ranging in age from their 30s-60s.

"They like fashion, like to look good and are value driven," she said. "Luxury holds a value and it's based on perception."

She brings her customers "really good quality items" that might otherwise be "inaccessible" to them because of price.

Something Olde, Something New owner Karen Moses said, "It's not like people aren't going to shop [because of the economy]. People are just more aware of where their money is going, so we attract more people."

Other resale customers cited the importance of

sustainability. Aileen Bievenue, a Slingerlands resident, is a "regular" at Treasure Cove. She noted that 90% of clothes go into a landfill.

"I grew up needing to thrift, and then there became a reason to thrift," she said, and added that her sons are "thrifting" too for sustainability.

Other customers agreed.

"I try to recycle and reuse as much as possible and I try to shop small," said Kelli Laque, who works nearby.

Nina Beauchane, a Something Olde, Something New Customer, who lives in Glenmont, said she shops resale because of price and sustainability.

"We have become a throwaway society. I like the uniqueness of sustainability shopping," she said, "and you can also score a great designer piece."

Sustainability motivates consignors as well.

"Consigning can be about sharing and keeping things out of the landfill", said Eyer.

Like many of her customers, recycling is a focus for The Closet Shop's Ever

"I believe in recycling. I got into this business because I love the idea of recycling," she said.

Neither The Closet Shop nor the Treasure Cove accepts the "Fast Fashion" found at popular retailers like H&M and Shein in their stores because of its negative environmental impact.

Treasure Cove donates its sales revenues to the Church's mission projects and to several selected charities, including Habitat for Humanity Albany, the Albany Refugee & Immigrant Support Services of Emmaus, Inc., clinics in Mozambique and Sierra Leone, Help For Ukraine and to Native Americans in Oklahoma. All three shops donate unsold/unclaimed clothing to a variety of charities, such as Equinox and to people in need.

However, value and sustainability are not the only factors propelling customers in the door at the three local shops. All three shops report "community" is an essential part of the resale experience that brings customers back, sometimes every week.

"We have about 50 regulars who come in every week. We have many people who are so regular we know their names," said Campas. "People come here because they meet others here and they start chatting. They come in and talk to us about their struggles and challenges."

"Sometimes I just come in to look at stuff and socialize," said Lucia Stimson, 76, a Delmar resident.

Several of the customers interviewed at Something Olde, Something New have been shopping there since the store opened in 1997. Jody Whan, used to live in Bethlehem and now resides in Florida, but made a trip to the store while visiting.

"I love the people here and I feel a sense of community," she said.

That sense of community infuses the staff as well as the customers.

"Coming here gives me a lot of pleasure, "said Joanne Pierotti, a two-year volunteer at Treasure Cove. "The customers are friendly and so are the people we work with.

It's a fun place, and I meet a lot of nice people here."

For Eyer, community is as much a part of her shop as clothing.

"A lot more goes on in here than just clothing. This is not just a business for me. People feel safe and comfortable here. Customers come in and have conversations about things that made them feel scared or sad when family and work culture was turned upside down," she said, adding that she always has a box of tissues and chocolate ready. "People come in and say they are having a stressful day, but they feel peaceful here, and I have real moments of joy and love with customers and consignors."

There is nothing better, she said, than when someone walks out of a fitting room and she says "Ahh!" and they say, "I love this and I feel great in this!"

Compass recounted how a man once walked into Treasure Cove and needed to be outfitted for a funeral that same day.

"We found him a suit, shirt, shoes and a tie, and when he tried it on, it changed his personality," said Compass. "When he walked out, he looked really good."

That sense of community encompasses inclusivity based on size. Treasure Cove carries sizes 0-XXXXL and integrates larger sizes with the rest of its displays.

Eyer said The Closet Shop is "size inclusive" and carries sizes 000Ps to generous sizing "so everyone walks into the shop and feels represented."

"I want people to feel that everybody matters," said Eyer. Because of the communities they create, none of the shops are concerned about competition from big name retailers that have hopped into the resale market or online resale platforms. Indeed, unlike those entities, all three shops do little or no advertising and rely on word-of-mouth and their Facebook sites to attract both customers and consignors/donors.

"This is a lot bigger than only money, Eyer said. "You are taking a portion of someone's life with experiences and memories and passing it on to someone that will make new memories and experiences with it."



Millard was married to Marilyn Altrock from 1947-1950, and they were blessed with a son, John Millard Harmon III. Millard married Ruth Aaness in 1952, whom he described as "The love of my life". One of Millard's greatest accomplishments was when the United States Junior Chamber of Commerce named him one of the Ten Outstanding Young Men of America in 1956. Millard and Ruth chaperoned the American Delegation to the London International Youth Science Fortnight, under the patronage of His Royal Highness, Prince Philip, both in 1961 and 1962. The delegation was

received at the White House before departure. The family moved to New York State, where Millard was the Director of Continuing Education at SUNY College at Geneseo. Another move came when Millard was appointed Director of the summer session at SUNY College at Oswego. Millard accepted a job as Director of Manpower Staff Development and Training in the NY State Labor Department and the family moved to Albany.

Millard took early retirement to devote his passion for flying full time. His first plane was N8750M, "50 Mike", a Beechcraft Musketeer. He upgraded to N7710R, "10 Romeo", a Beechcraft Bonanza. Millard researched and negotiated the possibility of flying his private plane over the

at the Sheremetyevo International Airport. He was granted permission from the Soviet Union, and picked up his Soviet Navigator in Helsinki, a necessity to fly through Soviet airspace. Millard's Visa did not arrive in time, so he was detained at the Sheremetyevo Airport Hotel for four days. He was interviewed by Joan Lunden on ABC's Good Morning America after returning to the United States. The WMHT PBS cameraman who took this trip with Millard made the documentary "Friendship Flight: Ten Romeo to Moscow". Two years later, Millard's next flight in 10Romeo to Moscow was to fly the Red Airway One route with his Soviet Navigator, and land in Moscow at the Sheremetyevo International Airport. He got the approval

received his Visa, picked up his Soviet Navigator, flew Red Airway One, and landed in Moscow at the Sheremetyevo International Airport. This successful flight was well publicized internationally. Millard opened Soviet skies for western light aircraft and sport pilots. In 1991, Millard stood with 20,000 residents in Freedom Square in front of the Tallinn Parliament building, with Soviet tanks nearby, during the peaceful transition when Estonia declared immediate full independence from the Soviet Union. In 1995, he was the top pilot in flight speed records in all categories worldwide, with 154 speed records. Millard and Ruth cherished family gatherings at their beach house on Block Island. A memorial service to celebrate his life, will be held Saturday, August 19, at 2pm, at The First United Methodist Church, 100 N. Main St., Canandaigua. Summer tradition highlights the beauty of dance

venue, and the audiences that gather every year.

NYCB will present its signature program, "NYCB On and Off Stage," on opening night, July 18. On July 19–20, SPAC will premiere the dynamic performances "Scherzo Fantastique," "Play Time," "Liturgy," and "Love Letter (on shuffle)."

"I am so excited because I get to do 'Swan Lake,' 'Firebird,' and 'Love Letter (on shuffle)," said corps de ballet dancer Olivia Bell. "This is the best program that I could have asked for for my first Saratoga performance."

Bell is making her debut at SPAC. She will perform numerous corps roles throughout the week, including a featured role in Kyle Abraham's "Love Letter (on shuffle)." Bell's connection with SPAC began when she saw "Romeo and Juliet" with principal dancer Lauren Lovette as a young girl.

"I was in awe," she remembered. "I felt so emotionally connected to what they were performing. It will be such a fun experience to be on the other side of that and hopefully give that back to the people watching and other School of American Ballet students. I hope that it really fuels their love and passion for ballet like it did for me."

For the 2023 residency, NYCB's robust traveling company of 90 dancers is directed by Artistic Director Jonathan Stafford and Associate Artistic Director Wendy Whelan. The New York City Ballet Orchestra is led by Music Director Andrew Litton.

"The New York City Ballet has had a residency here for decades, ever since Balanchine started bringing the company here," said soloist Miriam Miller. "Continuing to bring the New York City Ballet here helps the community that can't get to New York see the changes. The New York City Ballet is shifting in its repertoire, and it's important to showcase that shift and the changes in the rep that we do with the new choreographic work."

Flying through the ranks

of the NYCB, Miller joined the company as an apprentice in 2015, the corps de ballet in 2016, and was promoted to soloist in 2022.

Miller has been coming to Saratoga since 2015, and this summer she is performing featured roles in Justin Peck's "Copland Dance Episodes"

and Scherzo
"Fantastique," as well as
George Balanchine and
Jerome Robbins' "Firebird."

The whimsical "Scherzo Fantastique" is a lighthearted piece with ties to the NYCB's Saratoga residency. The dancers invite the audience into a vibrant world as they perform in multi-colored unitards covered in fringes and flowers.

"This Justin Peck ballet was choreographed and premiered for Saratoga. It was one of the first featured roles for a Justin Peck ballet that I'd done," explained Miller.

She also has a featured role in Peck's "Copland Dance Episodes" on July 20 and 22, which is his newest full-length ballet from this past winter season.

"This ballet is special to me

because it's the first experience where I felt onstage like I experienced an entire journey through the ballet," she said.

"I'm excited for Saratoga to get to witness that,"

added Miller.

By performing both classical ballets and works by 21st-century artists, audience members are presented with a

wide example of the NYCB's

ever-evolving repertoire.

"Everything that we do
is an amazing selection," said
Bell. "All of the dancers are
so versatile. It's exciting to see
them go from classic 'Swan
Lake' to 'Firebird."

"What I love about the selection of repertoire that is coming to Saratoga this year is that you're seeing a wide range of what we do throughout the year. Our yearly repertoire is packed into one week of six shows," said Miller.

"You can see the vast talent that the dancers have," she continued. "As a dancer, you get to explore different sides

of your artistry, different sides of your dancing, and you learn what else you can also do. It expands the perspective of the audience and dancers and shows off the capability that the dancers have in the company."

Miller is performing as the Firebird Princess, which is part of the Short Story program of performances of "Swan Lake," "Fancy Free," and "Firebird" on July 21 and 22.

"What I love about 'Firebird' is the music, the Chagall sets, and the beautiful costumes," she said. "It's fun to be a character, to tell a story onstage with my partner, and to tap into that side of my artistry."

An exciting aspect for Bell as the performer is the duality of the roles throughout the programs.

"You feel the choreography so deeply when you dance," she said regarding Swan Lake.

She shifts to another side of her dancing with "Firebird."

"I'm a butterfly in 'Firebird,' so we have these crazy jumps that we do at the beginning," said Bell. "The rest of the ballet is us being monsters."

What Bell anticipates the most is the unique audience connection that the SPAC venue provides for performers, describing it as "fuel" for her

performance.

"I look forward to seeing all the people in the audience, which is usually something that we can't do in the theater," she said. "It makes it more personal when you dance and can see the audience; it's nice to look out and see who you're performing for and be able to see everyone."

"When you see us onstage, it really translates to the audience, and they feel our love and our passion for it," she continued. "It's a connected experience with the audience and performers. We do it for ourselves, but we also do it for the people, because we want to share what we love."

Miller called the collaboration between SPAC and NYCB "special," adding, "When you speak of the legacy of New York City ballet, it includes Saratoga."

"I think it's a part of our history as a company, part of our foundation as a company. To maintain that tie is vital," she said. "In doing so, there needs to be a showcasing of these new works that we're doing and the dancers. It's part of who we are as a company to go to Saratoga. That's why it is important to maintain that relationship and that connection."
