# **Albany County solar array in the works**

### Partnership with BOCES will provide students with on-site experience

A new five-acre solar photovoltaic array was announced on Sept. 1 in Colonie. The solar project will be constructed in partnership with BOCES CTE students.

The project is located at 897 Watervliet Shaker Road. The project's 2.1 megawatt solar array will be developed by Siemens. Calibrant Energy will own and operate the project in a joint venture of Siemens and financial service company Macquarie Group.

Our feasibility study analyzed a number of county properties that would be suitable for this endeavor. However, we determined that this is the perfect location for a solar farm because there are virtually no neighbors, and the array is a compatible use with the radar tower," Albany County Executive Daniel McCoy said.

Albany County will purchase 2.6 million kilowatt hours of clean energy from the solar farm annually. The purchase will be reimbursed for the power generated on county property, which will benefit taxpayers long-term. The solar array has also received approval from the Federal Aviation Administration due to one of its radar towers on the site.

Construction is estimated to be completed by 2024. With the addition of the solar farm, Albany is on track to be the greenest county in the state. The array will produce green energy equivalent to the carbon emissions of 252 homes.

"The Town of Colonie is pleased to collaborate with Albany County in advancing the solar project at 897 Watervliet-Shaker Road," Colonie Town Supervisor Peter Crummey said. "This clean energy innovation will help the town achieve its ongoing goal promoting a diverse energy policy. We will continue to embrace a smart and balanced approach in keeping with our Climate Smart Community."

The state has set a goal to completely transition to zero-emission resources and achieve a carbon-emissionfree economy by 2050. This clean energy goal is one of the most ambitious in the nation and is part of the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (CLCPA) passed in 2019. The CLCPA calls for 70 percent of the state's electricity to be sourced from renewable energy by 2030.

The New York Power Authority has partnered with Albany County on this solar project. The Authority's Distributed Energy Resource Advisory Services Team, working as the County's advisor, will stay on to provide guidance We will continue to embrace a smart and balanced approach in keeping with our Climate Smart Community..



and oversight throughout the project. Invasive black locust trees must be removed before construction begins on the site. There will be a one-to-one tree replacement, and local pollinators will be introduced to the site to continue its green impact.

#### A Community Partnership

With its proximity to the site, BOCES Career and Technical Education students will be able to take part in the site's construction. Some of the students in these programs contributed to the construction of the Albany campus in 2021. Students in the electrical field program and the network cabling, wireless technologies and cybersecurity program learn about these industries through coursework, lectures and hands-on work.

The solar project will allow hands-on learning for these students through site work, installation and maintenance. BOCES primarily aims to prepare its students for post-high school careers and/or postsecondary studies. With a high demand for workers in these industries, BOCES knows its partners on the project would consider employing students who are qualified to work in the industry after the project's construction.


"We are fortunate to have great partners in Albany County and Siemens, and this underscores the important relationship between workforce training programs, industry and government," Capital Region BOCES Senior Executive Director Joseph Dragone, Ph.D., said. "The firsthand experience for our students at a worksite adjacent to our school is a tremendous opportunity to learn about the site development and installation of this technology."

Dragone hopes that as more BOCES students contribute to clean energy projects, those students will then go on to help further the state's clean energy goals. BOCES has already added programs that introduce work surrounding clean energy. Dragone also hopes to launch a new mechatronics and clean energy program in 2025.

As clean energy remains an essential target for the state, Albany County contributes two-fold to reach its ambitious goals. With its projects and increase in future industry employment, the target seems right on track.



"We needed more service area," said Steven LeBoyer, Savile Road's owner. "The other store was so overcrowded we almost couldn't sell."

After 11 years in business, the custom shop has grown its sales, repair service and customers exponentially, particularly since COVID.

LeBoyer said he's excited to have more riders come in from the Mohawk-Hudson rail trail now that his shop abuts it.

"This location has great parking, a bigger shop and great access to the bike trail, which means a lot more people will be riding by casually and much more likely to just hop off the rail trail and come over," he said.

A one-time Wall Street trader and bike enthusiast, LeBoyer opened Savile Road in Delmar because, although he wanted to be close to the New York City, he also wanted an area with a high concentration of active riders where his "vision" to become a destination could be realized.

"This is a great area to ride, with a number of cycling clubs and organizations and a high number of people engaged in biking as a four season sport," he said.

LeBoyer cited the upcoming cyclocross to be held at Elm Avenue Park on Nov. 5 as an example of how the area has become a destination for bikers.

Community building is also central to his vision.

"We have customers who ride by, stop in to say hello, and fill up a water bottle," he said, while others just stop in and introduce themselves.

His new location supports that sense of community. His neighbors – a physical therapist, a gym and a jujitsu studio are in the health and athletic fields.

Savile Road sells more than bikes and repair service.

"The Bike Fit Experience," a term LeBoyer has trademarked, is a fitting consultation, where Savile Road learns all about the customer's goals and physical needs.

"We want to put you on the right bike that fits properly," said LeBoyer. "That's so important for the customer's enjoyment and for our business.... Our challenge is helping a customer because if someone is too ambitious and thinks that the bike will propel them up the hill, well the bike will do great, but we have to help them set their sights realistically."

LeBoyer said the fitting experience is unique to the area, adding that Savile Road attracts customers from downstate and Boston. Its core business, however, comes from local customers in the Capital Region and adjoining counties.

LeBoyer described his typical customer as an intermediate rider "who is an enthusiast and may only ride once or twice a week, but is passionate about it." He added that the shop serves many new riders or those for whom their bike is a "gateway bike" to new kinds of riding, like mountain biking or gravel riding. In addition, many Savile Road customers are women, and LeBoyer believes it is because "we look at everyone who walks in the door as an individual." He said that biking has long been a male-dominated sport, and "we are working hard to change that."

"We don't have a woman's bike section because we are looking at you as an individual," he said. "Your geometry creates a model, not a stereotype."

"The idea of fitting is a story that continues, and we get to grow together with the customer," said Geoff Hull, who specializes in fitting and sales for Savile Road. "It's great to be able to watch the direction of the riding people who didn't see themselves as athletes becoming racers, and racers learning just the joy of riding," he said.

"We have customers who buy a bike and then six months later want us to take them to the next level. Our team takes them on their journey," said LeBoyer. "We have customers from when we opened for whom we have a file on everything they have done in biking." That Savile Road fitting experience starts with an in-depth interview and bikes beginning with a \$3,000 price point.

"We can easily sell bikes in the mid-\$20,000 range, and some bikes regularly come in at \$14,000-\$20,000, but most of our business involves lower priced bikes," said LeBoyer.

The store has continued to prosper notwithstanding inflation.

"It is a question of who is buying the bike," Le Boyer said. "During COVID some people had some extra money, and in other times when people are tightening up, a person might not buy a new car, but they will buy a new bike. ... It's another world like any other sport, like a fly fisherman who sees a new rod, you want that new rod, bikes are the same."

LeBoyer's "vision" incorporates custom fitting for a broader market, which includes fittings for non-Savile Road built bikes and starting at \$300.

David Wren, a customer who came down from Saratoga with his own fourmonth-old Bianchi bike, said the trip was worth it because "Savile Road has the best fit system in the area. ... Their staff is very knowledgeable, and I don't know anyone else who fits at this level of complexity."

An initial consultation at Savile Road goes "top to toe" and starts with fitting a customer with well- fitting bike shoes, bike shorts with proper padding, a chamois jersey to wick away sweat, and most importantly, a bike helmet.

After being outfitted, Savile Road collects customer information, including basic stats such as height, weight, inseam, shoulder width and then moves on to medical questions, like surgeries, injuries, broken bones, and diseases like scoliosis. LeBoyer noted that customers sometimes forget an injury or ailment and are amazed when during the fitting Savile Road's fitting expert remarks on it.

"When we get to the next phase and put a customer on their own bike or on our Size Cycle, we can see it while we watch people riding," said LeBoyer.

Lastly, the initial interview entails questions

about a customer's goals – race and distance objectives, endurance aims, weight loss, speed or just lapping on the rail trail.

That next phase involves checking for range of motion and flexibility. Savile Road synthesizes this information to build a bicycle.

"We take all the information and create a custom frame set to meet the points exactly," said Hull.

Or, the information is used to adjust a bicycle and to educate the customer.

"We can suggest a better position on your bike, where to sit in the saddle, or moving your pelvis back or forward," LeBoyer said. "When you leave a fit session, you are leaving in a better position and understand why it is a better position so there is an educational aspect to it."

LeBoyer said a majority of Savile Road customers come because they want advice.

"We love when our customers can tell their friends, this is what Savile Road did for me," he said.



# Didn't get delivery, trashes pizza shop

### Former employee charged with multiple felonies

DELMAR - Bethlehem police received a call from Domino's pizza on Delaware Avenue on Monday, Sept. 25 at approximately 10:53 p.m. that a woman was inside the store, refusing to leave, destroying property and throwing various food items.

Upon arrival, the woman had left the restaurant in a car, but had left a trail of destruction.

According to reports, Kashvra Lewis, 26, of Albany, allegedly entered the store and complained to the manager that her order was not delivered. Lewis was arraigned by Bethlehem Judge Andrew Kirby and released on her own recognizance. She is scheduled to return to court on October 17.

## Making dinosaurs come alive in A

Jurassic World tour comes to MVP Arena on October 6

ALBANY- South Pearl Street will take a trip back in time, when the earth was young and dinosaurs walked the land when the Jurassic World Live Tour comes to MVP Arena October 6-8.

Fans might be wondering how the prehistoric creatures of Jurassic World came to life in the live show and Spotlight News had the opportunity to sit down with Niko Velasquez, a "dinoteer" with the show and he goes into detail on how they bring it all to life.

Spot 518: How did you get involved with the Jurassic World tour?

Velasquez: In 2017 I auditioned for Jurassic World The Exhibition 1.0 and Feld had came to the show to see how the dinosaurs worked, and were trying to get their own show off the ground. A coworker auditioned for Feld on a different production, and the casting team reached out to him to see if we had anyone in mind for the Jurassic World Live Tour to film advertisements, and I was called, and missed auditions right after, and emailed casting about an opportunity and heard nothing. Then got a call to audition on live television

for Fox and Friends in NYC. Since then, I was cast as the primary Blue performer, and eventually the Dino Swing for the show.

Spot 518: Where you a big fan of the Jurassic Park/World Series prior to working with the show?

Velasquez: I have, when I was younger, in second grade I had to showcase all my dinosaur toys as like an interest project. The RV trailer in The Lost World: Jurassic Park, that falls over the cliff was a huge toy back then, and I was fortunate enough to have that, it was so cool. I still have quite a lot of my older dinosaur Jurassic figures. I've collected the majority of Funko Pops of Jurassic Park/ World, and have the Velociraptors from the Amber Collection toy line as an adult.

#### Spot 518: What sort of prep work goes into putting this whole thing together? (rehearsal, building the dinosaurs, stage setup)

Velasquez: Stretching, active movements, weightlifting, and more stretching. Staying as loose and strong as possible. Little rituals I do, come down to isolating myself for a small time to listen to music, calm down, and focus on blocking in the show, and the scene work, trying to have a clear mind before shows. Then I leave it all out on the floor, and perform with a nice mindset. I've watched a lot of bird videos, of audiences. It's a show

and movements they do. Including ostrich/ emu movements, as well as big cat prowling. Prowling can definitely be translated in movements in our dinosaurs and illustrates that these dinosaurs can be viewed as very much alive.

Spot 518: What challenges did you and your team face during the production of the show?

Velasquez: A lot of it really comes down to spacial awareness while inside a suit or operating one of the larger dinosaurs ( such as the Stegosaurus, Triceratops and Tyrannosaurus) Challenges I've also found are more seeing what the threshold you can have in a show, blocking, or even the integrity of the dinosaurs themselves. Making sure to be warmed up, stretched, remembering the plan for shows. Our team is full of very skilled people so we are rarely in a position where we have run into any major issues during the show"

#### Spot 518: What can people expect to see when they attend the live show?

Velasquez: Audiences can expect life size and accurate scaled dinosaurs from the films, and a lot of action and fighting, even fighting with the dinosaurs. A lot of references are in the show, one being the music from the movies can be heard, and gives you that Jurassic feeling and go back to childhood, or teenage years depending on age

for everyone, and I think everyone will enjoy it. Spot 518: Whats

your favorite part about preforming as a "dinoteer"

Velasquez: It would have to be just the thrill of bringing this animal to life with my own body, literally stepping into the "character" and giving the audience a memorable experience. Currently I'm a few of our other dinosaurs and not just Blue. I enjoy the variety of puppets or suits I'm able to work with to really utilize my talents Spot 518: Do you have a

favorite dinosaur? Velasquez: Velociraptors

for sure. It would be

Velociraptors first, triceratops second, and Tyrannosaurus rex third. Raptors have always been my fascination, and in any film. The designs of the velociraptors in the Jurassic films have always been a favorite of mine, including the color schemes.

## **Proctors welcomes new organ with concert**

Renowned musician kicks off series while celebrating instrument's dynamic presence

ALBANY — On Sunday, Oct. 8, at 3 p.m., internationally renowned organist Nathan Avakian will perform a free concert to dedicate the newly acquired Allen GW4 organ in Proctors' GE Theatre, kicking off the monthly Proctors Organ Concert Series.

"It will be a combination of traditional theater organ music and brand new music. including rock 'n' roll and original scores that Nathan has composed," said Carl Hackert, chairman for the organ program at Proctors. "The way he performs them on the organ is amazing to watch and see. He's a musician of fabulous technique with a great mind and ear.'

The concert will use the full breadth of the theater's capabilities. The state-ofthe-art GE Theatre offers adjustable seating, acoustics, and a screen as large as the stage with an IMAX audio

"The organ sounds fantastic in the GE Theatre," said Hackert. "It's going to be a fullfledged organ show."

system.

Avakian's riveting new arrangements will also feature new silent films that are connected with his work as a resident organist and composer for the International Youth Silent Film Festival. His October program at Proctors will provide a seasonal flair and atmosphere. Hackert specifically noted Avakian's "creativity and energy" in his live performances.

"He plays it so that people of any age will



find something to marvel at," said Hackert. "Besides his phenomenal capability technically, he's a phenomenal musician with a great musical sense."

The organ being dedicated is a new addition to Proctors and joins another long-running, legendary instrument in the theater. "George,' as the organ is affectionately called, is the new mate to the famous Wurlitzer theater organ in

the main theater at Proctors, called 'Goldie,'" said Brad Day, president of Allen Organ Studios in Delmar.

George was custom built in Pennsylvania by the Allen Organ Company for Kerry Bahl and his wife, Dorothy, who were organists active in the National Theatre Organ Society in California.

The organ contains state-of-the-art digital technology and is modeled after a specification by the

George Wright.

"The console is fashioned after the famous French Ornate design created by the Wurlitzer Organ Company in the early 20th century," said Day.

The organ was purchased from the Bahl estate and is dedicated to members of Hackert's family and deceased members of the organ society.

"Being the representatives for Allen Organ Company in upstate New York,

we are honored to have had the opportunity to help support this project," said Day.

"George is attracting a lot of attention from organists and our audience because it's such a beautiful instrument to look at and to listen to," said Hackert.

Avakian's dynamic show will herald George's use for future programs. "I've been playing the

famous theater organist organ for my whole life, and I've never heard someone play like Nathan," said Hackert, who is a returning musician for the Proctors Organ Concert Series and has worked with Proctors program since the 1980s. "He is unique in the world of theater organs."

All of the organ programs in the monthly Proctors Organ Concert Series are free and held monthly on weekdays, with special programs on weekends. Proctors is located in downtown Schenectady. For more information about upcoming concerts in the series, visit proctors.org.

During the approximately 14 tours a day, visitors to Fort Ticonderoga in the autumn will discover entirely new experiences. The battlefield trail is often more accessible in the fall months, and the fortifications and earthworks are more visible on the ground. This can provide visitors with an even more immersive look into the history of the Fort.

Mount Defiance allows visitors to see the scope of the geography that made Fort Ticonderoga the historic location that it is today. The heights of Mount Defiance offer a bird's-eye view of the incredible landscape, which Hill refers to as "America's most historic landscape."

"In the fall, you have this majestic perspective with the beauty of the site, and combine that with all of our programs," said Hill. "It really is just a wonderful time to make that road trip and come up here to experience what we

have to offer." Fort Ticonderoga's programs are

specifically designed to bring history and

stories to life. Their tours include narrated cruise tours that feature beverages, sights along the waterfront, and a glimpse into the underwater archeology of the Fort. Sonar technology allows visitors to get a sense of the remnants of history that remain hidden under the depths of the Fort to this day.

"I definitely think that is one of the best ways for visitors to understand the epic history that happened right here in our region that was defining for the world, yet we're fortunate it's right here in our area," said Hill. "That's a wonderful experience."

Their extensive museum collection currently has on display an exhibit on the origins and evolution of the militia, with the oldest known American military uniform coat in existence.

"Really important parts of our history are on exhibition," said Hill. "Our museum collections are some of the most significant in the world."

Along with their signature programs

of weapons demonstrations, battle reenactments, historic shoe-making and tailoring, the King's Garden, a 6-acre corn maze that contains history clues is also part of the family-friendly experience. Each year, the shape of the maze and the historical clues change to tell a new story and immerse guests even more in the history of the land.

The history of Fort Ticonderoga is "complicated and defining," said to Hill, but the museum is dedicated to peeling back a layer every year. Annually, the museum staff delves into a particular moment, year, and garrison to curate their exhibitions

"This offers a different window into the past and different experiences," said Hill. This year, Fort Ticonderoga is featuring the year 1716 and the New York Independent Company.

"There's so much that is new each year, but there are still the anchoring experiences that are beloved and retain the Fort Ticonderoga experience," she added. "All of those experiences make us a unique destination. We have something for everyone of all ages."

The calendar offers a robust schedule of activities from November to April. Online experiences are offered as well, along with a membership program that allows visitors to visit for free all year.

"We have so much to share and offer our visitors," said Hill. "With the beauty of the place, you feel the presence of our past and can explore and experience the sight that builds lifetime memories for people."







to me that there are very few festivals devoted to music for film. ... In terms of really exploring the vast world of incredible music for film, but performing it as pure music, that's something that only happens in a few places around the world."

Starting the film music festival is acclaimed pianist Kevin Cole's Hollywood Cabaret show on Thursday, Oct. 5, at 7:30 p.m. at the Troy Savings Bank Music Hall. Cole will play a wide assortment of music from classic films like "The Band Wagon," "Top Hat," "Swing Time," "Shall We Dance," "The Way We Were," and "Royal Wedding."

Cole will also be performing a live accompaniment to a short silent film, a 15-minute comedy short called "45 Minutes from Hollywood." Made in 1926, it is an early appearance of Stan Laurel and Oliver Hardy before their famous partnership.

"I love accompanying silent films," said Cole. "I thought it would be a fun addition for the audience. The addition of playing for a silent comedy as part of it is a treat for me, but it's also a treat for the audience because you don't get that experience very often these days."

The concert's environment will be uniquely intimate, with chairs set up on the stage around Cole, creating a cabaret setting.

"The whole idea is connection and communication in your music," he said.

Seating is limited, so it is recommended to purchase tickets ahead of time. The audience will get the experience of being onstage and having the perspective of being a performer while still "enjoying the beautiful acoustics of that hall," said Cole.

"It'll give them a totally different perspective for the future when seeing performances there," he said. "I want as many people as possible to experience this and just have a really great time celebrating movie musicals, silent movies, and the glory in their own backyard of the Troy Music Hall."

On Saturday, Oct. 7 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the University at Albany Performing Arts Center, a free festival symposium, Scoring Work in Show Business, welcomes the public to meet industry experts and learn about their work. This special seminar is presented in collaboration with the NYS Writers Institute.

The Albany Symphony's opening night, "Soundtrack New York: Musical Scenes from a Cinematic State," takes place Oct. 7, at 7:30 p.m. at the Palace Theatre. Miller will conduct music from movies set in or created by composers from the Empire State, with a special guest appearance by Cole for movie music by George Gershwin.

"I was very interested in the idea that so many of the great film composers came from, worked in, or made films about New York," said Miller. "The idea of really focusing on New York in film music was the idea."

The night will feature selections from the works of Leonard Bernstein, Tamar-kali, The Howard Shore, Bernard Herrmann, Max Steiner, and Henry Mancini.

"This is music that has stood the test of time," said musician Tommy Tallarico. "This is why a festival like this is so important, because it brings in a new generation of people to appreciate symphonic and orchestral music."

"I think it really is an exciting aspect of it to hear the evolution. People will find that this music is unremittingly gorgeous," said Miller. "Particularly Gershwin, Bernstein, and John Williams. Everything on all the programs is extremely beautiful, expressive music. Anyone who comes to any of the concerts will be really thrilled by how beautiful it is."

While the night will feature classic songs from films such as "West Side Story," "The Lord of the Rings" and "Breakfast at Tiffany's," the programs will also introduce the audience to the artists' other works in their diverse catalogs.

"It's really like a whole world of film music from the early days to the present. Each program is designed to have familiar music on it and unfamiliar pieces as well," said Miller. "There is enough familiar music that the few pieces that may not be familiar to a listener will charm them just because of the freshness of that."

On Sunday, Oct. 8 at 7:30 p.m. at the Palace Theatre, video games will take center stage with a one-of-a-kind concert experience for gamers and non-gamers to enjoy. "Video Games Live" creator Tallarico and his band will join the Albany Symphony with Emmanuel Fratianni conducting for a night of music from Final Fantasy, Halo, The Last of Us, Undertale, Okami Warcraft, Castlevania, Shadow of the Colossus, and more.

"The whole idea and concept for me was that I wanted to prove to the world how culturally significant and artistic video games and their music have become and usher in a whole new generation of young people to appreciate the arts and symphony," said Tallarico. "When you go into that festival environment, it's a celebration."

The concert, which uses lighting and displays to portray video game visuals, is intended to blend the energy and excitement of a rock concert with video games, as well as the power and emotion of a symphony and choir.

"The show is not just for video gamers," he said. "I created it for families. The industry is beautiful and exciting. It's a show for everyone. The name says it all: Watch your favorite video games and their music come to life on stage with the most amazing, talented musicians in the area."

The community is invited to join the Symphony on Monday, Oct. 9 at 3 p.m. at the MVP Arena for a free Movie Music Play-in Concert. The Albany Symphony and the Empire State Youth Orchestra will be performing together popular movie and video music, including selections from "Star Wars," "Moana," "Howl's Moving Castle," and more.

Attendees are encouraged to bring their instrument and join in with the Symphony and Youth Orchestra during a selected portion of John Williams' iconic Imperial March theme from "Star Wars."

"It's going to be a great family event," said Miller. "All of the events are going to be just spectacular, and each one is going to be unique, different, and occupy a different space from the others," said Miller. "If you want to come to all of them, that's just an amazing combination of much of the greatest film music of the 20th and 21st centuries."

## Pack breakfast or lunch with a nut-free alternative

chool is in session and that means busy families may be in need of a few meal solutions that fit into their schedules — particularly items to grab on the way to school or work. Granola bars often fit the bill as nutritious options in portable packages. While storebought granola bars are convenient, they tend to be made with nuts or oats, which are not ideal for those with food allergies or intolerances.

People can easily whip up homemade granola bars that are chock-full of vitamins and minerals and can be customized to food preferences and tastes. This recipe for "Nut-Free Granola Bars" from "Eat What You Want" (Ten Speed Press) by Danielle Walker can be enhanced with raisins, chocolate chips or dried fruits.

### **Nut-Free Granola Bars**

Makes 12

- tablespoons warm water tablespoon chia seeds
- cup light-colored raw honey
- tablespoon virgin coconut oil
- tablespoons unsweetened sunflower seed butter
- cup raw pepitas
- 3/4 3/4 cup raw sunflower seeds
  - cup unsweetened coconut flakes
  - tablespoons sesame seeds
  - teaspoons pure vanilla extract
  - teaspoons ground cinnamon
- teaspoon fine sea salt 1/2
- 1/4 cup chocolate chips, raisins, or dried fruit pieces

Preheat the oven to 350 F. Lightly grease the short sides of a 9- by 13-inch baking dish or rimmed baking sheet with ghee or coconut oil. Line the bottom and long sides of the

pan with parchment paper so the ends hang over the sides.

Whisk the warm water and chia seeds in a small bowl and set aside.

Melt the honey in a small saucepan over mediumhigh heat. Turn the heat to medium and simmer for 5 to 7 minutes, until a candy thermometer reads 225 F.

Stir in the oil and sunflower seed butter and remove the pan from the heat. Let cool for 10 minutes.

Place the pepitas and sunflower seeds in a food processor and pulse once or twice until coarsely chopped. Add the coconut flakes, sesame seeds, vanilla, cinnamon, and salt and pulse a few more times, until coarsely chopped and incorporated. Add the chia mixture and the honey mixture and stir by

hand until just combined. Immediately spread the mixture into the prepared baking dish.

Place a piece of parchment paper on top and use a flatbottomed measuring cup to press the mixture firmly and evenly into the pan. Remove the top piece of parchment and bake for 15 minutes, until golden. Sprinkle the

chocolate chips over the top. Let cool in the pan for 30 minutes, then transfer the pan to the freezer for 1 hour, until set.

Remove the pan from the freezer and lift the parchment flaps to remove the slab from the pan. Using a sharp knife, cut into 12 rectangular bars. Serve the bars chilled. Store in an airtight container in the refrigerator for 2 weeks, or in the freezer for 6 months. Defrost in the fridge overnight.



## COMMUNITY **Banned Books Week promotes free speech**

Local artists read excerpts from works that have faced censorship

ALBANY - Albany Public Library is hosting Banned Books Week through Oct. 7 to celebrate the freedom to read and place a spotlight on books that are considered unorthodox and unpopular, and threatened to be censored in libraries and schools.

"One of the best things you can do is read banned books, check them out from your local library and support local booksellers. The more we read, the more we show our support to the authors and the more we can share the stories," said local free speech advocate Joanna Peterson-Palladino-Resnick.

Banned Books Week started Oct.1 and will continue through Oct. 7. The Washington Avenue branch, along with The New York Civil Liberties Union Capital Region Office,

League of Women Voters of Albany County, and Mothers Out Front marked the occasion with a reading of selected banned books Tuesday, Oct. 3.

Area participants who took part in this year's event include Annine Everson, Kathleen Carey, Gary Hoffman, Melissa Putterman Hoffmann, Jennifer Lyfseck, Michael McDermott, Josephine O'Connor, Tony Pallone, Bob Resnick, Brian Sheldon, Dan Wilcox and James Yeara.

They read excerpts from "Catch-22," "1984," "The Diary of Anne Frank," "A Court of Mist and Fury," "Fun Home," "Captain Underpants," among many others. Those books have previously been targeted for removal and restriction in libraries and schools, according to Peterson-Palladino-Resnick.

"We are lucky to have a group of passionate advocates for free speech and intellectual freedom in our community," she said.

Albany Public Library and NYCLU have held a Banned Books Week event for many

years. This is the first year that The League of Women Voters of Albany County and Mother's Out Front are participating and co-sponsoring. Through their work to educate others about voting rights and protecting individual rights, the Albany County chapter of the LWV aims to prevent book banning.

Banned Books Week, which launched in 1982 in response to a sudden surge in the number of challenges to books in libraries, bookstores and schools, continues to draw national attention to the harmful effects of censorship.

'Our community's libraries are vibrant, inclusive spaces for all students, where they should feel free to learn history, build their knowledge, and access narratives about diverse experiences," Melanie Trimble, Regional Director of the Capital Region for the New York Civil Liberties Union said. "Albany Public Library's Banned Books Week shines a light on the harms of unchecked censorship and reminds us why we must protect students' rights to safely read, learn and grow.'

Across the country, books and other

written materials are being banned and challenged in an attempt to remove or restrict the materials based on an individual or group's objections. If the book or written piece is banned, it will be removed permanently from a library's collection and no one can access it, Peterson-Palladino-Resnick added.

APL and NYCLU both acknowledge the possibility of preventing books from being banned with the support of local organizations and additional community members who stand up and advocate for the freedom to read.

Readers can also challenge the attempts to ban the proposed censored books and go on to the American Library Association's website to view its resources.

The best solution to prevent the censorship of books and other media?

'Speak out. Use social media to be an advocate, start a banned books club or step up and become a library trustee," Peterson-Palladino-Resnick said. "And of course, attend Banned Books Readout events!"


