

Bethlehem and Colonie invest in town recreation properties to make the towns a great place for outdoor fun

LATHAM, DELMAR – This fall, both the Colonie Mohawk River Park and the new Bethlehem Normans Kill Ravines Park will undergo transformations that will allow residents to better reconnect with nature and neighbors.

For almost 20 years, the Mohawk River State Park has offered locals a place to enjoy nature close to home.

From page 1 ... Parks for the people

From the winding trails and riverfront views to the picturesque pond alongside a covered bridge, the park is a beautiful place to spend some time no matter the season.

It wasn't always this way. The park hadn't seen significant changes until 2018, with the addition of a new splash pad and kiddie pool next to the pool house. In 2022 and 2023, initiatives by Colonie Town Supervisor Peter Crummey focused on ridding the waterfront of 65 tons of invasive and overgrown water chestnuts, redoing the parking lots, improving the pools, and completely tearing up and installing new pickleball and tennis courts, which are currently in the process of being built. Now, he aims to move his focus back to the riverside.

"We want people to be able to come out here and fish, canoe, kayak, and do as they wish," said Crummey. "We own the land, and we should maintain it [for future

generations]." To reestablish residents' access to the river, the town plans to clear out the dead and overgrown plant life surrounding the Mohawk River Park waterfront - minus living trees - to make way for benches, a permanent dock near the boat launch, and perhaps even a miniature amphitheater for future events.

With these additions, park-goers will be able to stroll down the refreshed and meticulously groomed trails that lead out to the riverfront, where Crummey hopes visitors will be able to host cookouts, shows, gatherings, and enjoy time on the water with friends and families. He adds that once electricity is run down to the waterfront,

the potential for future amenities will grow.

The Town of Colonie is making the renovations for the riverfront out of funds from the existing town budget, and Crummey said he does not expect the need for additional funding through a bond vote.

Not far from the river stands the former Newtonville Park Office, built in the 1850s. At one point, it housed the dynamite used to clear the way for the Albany-

too late. Through private and public cooperation, he believes the building can potentially be turned into an educational landmark along the path towards the covered bridge. In order to accomplish that, structural

integrity testing must be done, and safety measures must be put in place within and along the side of the building, as it is flanked by a large pool of standing water.

Just 20 minutes away at 70 Wright Lane is the new Normans Kill Ravines Park, where visitors are welcomed into a landscape of forests, wetlands and ravines. Boasting more than 300 acres of oak and birch trees and more than half a mile of the Normans Kill shoreline, it's a peaceful place to go for

a bike ride and soak up the atmosphere.

"It's such a beautiful area," said Bethlehem Town Supervisor David VanLuven. "Now that I've successfully created the park, I'm strongly committed to making improvements because [it] will open the property so community members can enjoy its gorgeous forests, wetlands, ravines and riversides."

The park was formed by converting a property the town had purchased into parkland, and by purchasing a 68.8-acre forested parcel from the Normanside Country Club. Using the town's Parkland Set Aside Fund - which has funds in place that can only be used for park-related purposes the Normans Kill Ravines Park was officially open to the public and had its ribbon cutting ceremony on May 26, 2021.

"I am thrilled to be part of a unique new park in Bethlehem that will allow for more outdoor activity to our town residents and mountain bikers," said Mark Bryant, a local mountain biking enthusiast at the ceremony. "I am especially looking forward to how the business community will benefit from the new park being so close to the center of town where people can socialize at restaurants."

And he isn't the only one – roughly \$200,000 in state grants and private donations have been designated for work on the park, with the goal to forge new mountain bike paths and post clear signage for the trails and surrounding points of interest.

VanLuven said he is excited to move forward with the renovations and additions to the walking and mountain biking trails that will highlight the park's beautiful landscape.

"It's hard to be patient," said VanLuven, noting that it takes time to design, get permits, raise funds, and build trails and bridges for the community. "But just as it takes time for children to grow to adulthood, it takes time for a park to mature into its full potential. Fortunately, we have a great community working with us to help the park reach its full potential quickly."



Fund helps residents in need

Since 1942, organization has been making a big difference in small ways

-"'Affluent' is almost always the adjective used by the local media to describe the town of Bethlehem, but there are plenty of people living in Bethlehem to whom that word does not apply." So began a 1980s Spotlight article on why the Bethlehem Community White Christmas Fund, now known as the Bethlehem Community Fund, exists. Forty years later, the fund still meets the needs - in small ways with big impacts - of many Bethlehem residents.

Although much has changed since the 1980s, Bethlehem's need for the fund has not. According to the town's community profile, 5% of its residents live in poverty. That does not include residents living at the next lowest income ranges.

"We are here because we are needed," said officer and longtime board member Greg Jackson. "If we didn't get any requests, we would disband, but there is a definite need for this organization."

The fund "helps children, families, individuals, and elderly Bethlehem residents whose needs fall through the cracks of traditional programs" and "to fill the gap left by traditional social services," according to its website. Jackson reported that the Fund gave away \$35,000 of assistance in 2022 and has already given away another \$34,000 worth of assistance in 2023.

He said that more home-related requests, like help with a fuel bill or a month's rent, are received. He said requests spiked when schools re-opened after COVID because there was a lot of "pent-up" demand. Now, the level of requests has stabilized.

Twenty-one volunteers, all of whom are fund board members, work to quietly provide financial assistance.

"We can't build someone

a new home, but we can help if they haven't paid their fuel bill in months," said Jackson.

The fund has paid for moving costs, pet care, or a month's rent for seniors. For students, the fund provides scholarships and supports a back-to-school backpack drive. It has paid for field trips and SAT fees, eyeglasses, general school supplies and art class supplies. It has also helped residents with medical and summer school expenses, car maintenance, transportation and pool passes.

The fund meets requests by providing the item sought, a gift card or pays a bill directly.

Jackson is proud of the fund's ability to meet each request that it feels is appropriate.

"We know we can't solve every problem in the world," he said.

The difference between the fund and other programs is that "we make it simple," said Jackson.

"We get a request, the requester fills out a simple form, the Community Needs Committee reviews it to ensure it's legitimate and, if approved, we fund it," he said.

The fund's volunteers live or work in Bethlehem and some work at Bethlehem's schools as guidance counselors, teachers, social workers or nurses or with Bethlehem's seniors. They provide the contact point for families.

"They help us identify who needs help," said Jackson.

Jackson said he was particularly struck by a request made by a high school student who wanted to get a job as a busboy, but needed to buy a white shirt and black pants that he could not afford.

"Here, we were helping someone help themselves," said Jackson. "We don't fund class rings, but we will pay the fee so you can take the SAT."

He choked up recounting getting a card from one such student, who wrote, "Thank you. I got into college."

"We made a difference in someone's life," he said. Jackson estimated the fund has helped more than 40,000 residents in its 81year existence.

Except for covering its monthly post office box fee and liability insurance, all donations are used to give help to the community. Fundraising events, such as a Bethlehem Democratic Committee breakfast, the Bethlehem Turkey Trot, and an annual party, build its resources. In September, \$3,000 was raised at an event attended by about 150 people at the Real McCoy Beer Co. in Delmar.

Jackson said fundraising can be hampered because "we keep a low profile to be vigilant about people's privacy."

"No one has to know that you needed help or who paid the fee for your class field trip," said Jackson. "We have been here since the 1940s but are not well known because we have a hard time bragging about what we do because we do it all confidentially."

The fund began as a Christmas pageant in 1942 when town church musical groups joined with the Bethlehem Central High School in presenting a Christmas-themed musical program, together with re-enactments of old Bethlehem biblical events. According to a 1960 event summary, "The festival has become the medium through which the whole community unites in common observance of Christmastide, the highlight of the year in community endeavor."

Those pageants were also used to raise money for the community's needy. In the first year, \$98 was raised.

In 1967, keeping up with times, the fund dispensed with the annual Christmas pageant and became a 501(c)(3) notfor-profit corporation, known as the Bethlehem Festival organization. Although it ceased putting on Christmas pageants, it continued to collect funds to aid Bethlehem residents.

About 10 years ago, the fund's name evolved into the Bethlehem Community Fund to better reflect its purpose and how it helped people.

"For many years we gave out turkeys," said Jackson. "But not everyone today wants or knows what to do with a turkey, so instead we switched to giving grocery carts of food."

Jackson said he would be happy to add anyone to their mailing list so "they can respond to our November appeal." "As long as we can keep bringing younger people onto the board, I can see the fund going on forever," said Jackson. "Does the world need more of this? Yes!"

Shoprite to close in Slingerlands, Colonie will shutter five maintain the level of sales represents jobs like meat and pay between \$18 and pay bet

Chain will shutter five food stores and its gas stations in coming weeks

SLINGERLANDS and COLONIE - In an email to customers, Shoprite announced Friday afternoon that it is closing its five stores in the Capital Region including three locations in Albany County and one each in Schenectady and Rensselaer Counties. The announcement came after the Company sent letters to suppliers and notified employees earlier in the day.

The email to customers said, "As you may have heard, the stores listed below will be closing in the coming weeks.

"When we entered this marketplace, we did so with an intent to bring an exceptional shopping experience to the residents of the Capital Region."

"Today, due to changing market conditions and the influx of food retailers in the area, we are unable to maintain the level of sales needed to keep operating these locations. The gas locations will also close."

Employees were notified earlier in the day that the stores would be closed, according to a cashier, who did not want to use her name, interviewed by Spotlight News on Friday. She said that they were told in the morning and said that company officials told them there would be some kind of severance package but the officials did not yet have details.

Another backend worker interviewed said that the Slingerland store would remain open for a while, but they would no longer receive new shipments for many perishable food areas, like the Deli. He said that would close earlier than the store.

Approximately 500 people are employed at the five locations. The workers are unionized with United Food and Commercial Workers Local 1262, which represents store clerks and workers at the front of the store, and Local 1, which represents jobs like meat cutters and other workers who are in the back.

Union leaders were surprised by the announcement and found out at approximately the same time as the workers, according to comments in the Times Union on Friday night.

"We were really taken by surprise," Harvey Whille, president of Local 1262, said to the TU., explaining that the union learned of the looming closures Friday morning. "We're going to take every action that is available to us," he said, adding that union officials will be meeting with lawyers and then the company to discuss severance and other arrangements as the stores shut down.

Frank DeRiso, president of Local 1, said his union also learned of the closure plans Friday morning. "It was definitely a shock to us," he said in the Times Union article.

The stores provide health insurance and pension contributions for employees and pay between \$18 and \$30 per hour in wages.

"Shoprite closing is a shock to our community and to the 500 unionized employees at the Capital Region stores targeted for closure," Colonie Town Supervisor Peter Crummey said. "We stand ready to help reestablish business activity at the site in order to get good-paying jobs for those who just received notification of the expedited closing."

Both Slingerlands and Colonie stores opened in 2012 and 2013 after opening its first store in the area in 2011 in Niskayuna's St John's Plaza. During the three-year period 2011-2013 Shoprite quickly established four stores. The fifth store was built and opened in North Greenbush in 2017.

"This is a multi-state corporation making a decision to pull out of the Capital District, I am glad we have a grocery store across the street," Bethlehem Town Supervisor David Vanluven said. "There are lots of opportunities in town for employment. It is a great

but the company went bankrupt.

The key tenant of the park, Plug Power, however, opened its fuelcell manufacturing facility there last year with national fanfare, because of the investment of State and Federal money into the new hydrogen technology.

The roads were constructed before any tenants were signed and funded with a \$1 million commitment in 2003 from the Albany County Legislature and backing of the Bethlehem IDA. The money was finally released from the County in 2015 to the contractors.

The Route 85 bypass and road reconfiguration was also put in play to add accessibility to the park. That is a State highway.

In 2015, the Colonie IDA had trouble with state Authority Budget Office (ABO) officials for not properly reporting incentives and job creation numbers to the state.

Shoprite at 1769 Central Ave. requested a sales and mortgage tax exemption of \$989,000 and \$210,000 respectively in 2012. The IDA was also given a job creation estimate of 300 to 400 jobs for Shoprite.

The reporting was corrected, but the annual filings from 2012 did not have exceptions or job creation numbers listed.

Colonie Director of Planning and Economic Development Sean Maguire said that the property is within the Village of Colonie and they would be working with future use or redevelopment of the site, but the Colonie IDA does represent any proposed projects requesting IDA assistance within the Town, including its villages.

Shoprite only received the two exceptions in 2012 from Colonie IDA.

Potential sale

The Unions representing the Shoprite workers said they believe a potential sale of the five properties could be in the works, but there is no confirmation at this time.

If no sale happens, the stores will completely close by December, according to workers and the union.



SLINGERLANDS -A Bethlehem police unit facing east on Route 85 on Saturday, Oct. 14 at approximately 2:23 a.m. observed a white 2013 Ford allegedly traveling at 67 mph and the officers performed a traffic stop.

When interviewing the driver, a 31-year-old Delmar woman, officers observed a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her breath and that she had bloodshot and glassy eyes. When asked if she consumed any alcohol that night, the woman said none. According to reports, she avoided eye contact with the officers and was continuously looking down at her purse on the front seat.

The woman was given and failed field sobriety tests and tested positive for breath alcohol on a pre-screening device. She was taken into custody for DWI.

When she was retrieving a key fob to leave with her car, which was going to be towed, officers observed a partially consumed bottle of merlot wine inside. At the police station, the woman provided a breath sample that returned a .13 percent BAC.

She was charged with DWI, a misdemeanor, and ticketed for consuming alcohol in a motor vehicle and speeding.

The woman was given a bill of particulars, issued traffic tickets and release on an appearance ticket for Bethlehem Town Court on November 8.

to have a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath, bloodshot and watery eyes and had slightly slurred speech. He claimed initially that he had not consumed any alcoholic beverages, but later said he had three Voodoo beers.

The man was given and failed field sobriety tests and tested positive for breath alcohol on a pre-screening device. At the police station the breathalyzer machine was not working correctly so the man was transported to the Albany County Sheriff's department in Clarksville to test for breath alcohol.

When there, he provided a breath sample that returned a .25 percent BAC. The man was charged with aggravated DWI and operating a vehicle with a suspended registration, both misdemeanors.

He was given a bill of particulars and released with an appearance ticket for Bethlehem Town Court on November 8.

Rock on

Local business owners co-found Albany Rock Pit to help young people find their inner rock star

COLONIE - When the School of Rock closed last spring, two local business owners stepped up to help the young musicians find out there isn't just one way to rock.

"We wanted to give the kids a home," Kim Lindh said. "These kids needed someplace, because this is an outlet for a lot of them. Music is all they think."

Lindh partnered with McGeary's owner Tess Collins to found the Albany Rock Pit at the rear of her other business, Action Trailer on Norman Drive in Colonie.

"Kim had the space. We had already scoped it all out because we were trying to help him (Sean Cranston, the owner of School of Rock) stay at his own school," Collins said. " And then when [he] said that he didn't have any place to put his students, Kim had the space."

The pair, along with their faculty and guests, celebrated the official opening of the school with a ribbon cutting ceremony Tuesday, Oct. 24.

They knew there was a need for a music school since the closing of the Latham lesson facility, School of Rock, and they wanted to help the community,

Event puts short films in the spotlight

Asbury Short Film Concert returns to The Linda for the 12th year

ALBANY - Returning to The Linda, WAMC's Performing Arts Studio, on Thursday, Oct. 26, is the 42nd Asbury Short Film Concert. The short film presentations, put together by its founder and director, Doug LeClaire, and hosted by Richard Lovrich, will give moviegoers a look into the "unknown" short films that have received recognition at film festivals and at the Academy Awards

LeClaire's first Asbury film concert was organized by a group of his fellow film student graduates from the



The Asbury Short Film Concert is presented generally as a two hour (plus intermission) fast-paced and really fun exhibition of the world's best short films from the past & present. The best in short film comedy, drama, documentary and animation in one sitting without awards, panel discussions or Q & A. More of a theatrical entertainment event with 10-12 award winning shorts and a guest host who appears briefly once in each Act to introduce the films to the attendees.

Institute of Technology on Long Island in 1981 as a public screening of local area student college films. The event was presented once a year after, and in 1999, it became a touring event. This is the 12th year that LeClaire has presented his project at The Linda. Although the main film lineup remains a secret until the actual show, the short film project yearly brings 10-12 independently

produced international award-winning shorts to the Capital District, including a short film made locally.

This year's local spotlight film is "Candy Store," produced and directed by Lisa Thomas, starring musician and artist Ryder Cooley and her band, the Dustbowl Faeries. Their film is a period piece about a couple struggling to run a local candy store, LeClaire said.

"The mission at Asbury Shorts USA is to bring award-winning short films to venues where the audiences are made of folks who do NOT regularly attend film festivals or seek out short films on their own." LeClaire said. "An Asbury Short Film Concert is a fast-paced noncompetitive entertainment

event." The films will be screened in a two-hour showcase presented in two acts, with an intermission.

LeClaire and his team chose the presented films based on their track record at film festivals across the country or if the film is recommended by a trusted source who is familiar with the Asbury Short Film Concert.

"The thing about short films for the general public is quite simple ... no one has ever heard of the selections ahead of time for this show unless they are a complete short film aficionado, which is very rare," LeClaire said. "It's not like short films are publicized in the media on a daily or weekly basis."

The independent produced films may contain subject matter that is adult orientated or the language may not be appropriate for younger folks. Individuals aged 16 and older are welcome to attend.

especially its youngest musicians.

"She's like, 'You still got that space?' I'm like, yep,' Lindh said.

Lindh also had other motivation to open Albany Rock Pit – her daughter, musician, singer and artist, Harley Lindh.

When School of Rock originally closed its doors, Harley became depressed and began going downhill emotionally, Lindh recalled. Harley and the other children that she was friends with at the school wanted to continue to play music.

From a young age, Harley was interested in music performance and wanted to get into music. Kim first brought Harley to Guitar Center for music lessons and eventually to School of Rock through a recommendation from friend and musician Jesse Calhoun.

At School of Rock, Harley learned the guitar and trained to become a musician. Now at Albany Rock Pit with the help of an instructor, Harley also plays drums, bass and harmonica.

Demo and revitalization

It took Collins and Lindh 30 days during the month of July to give the 9 Norman Drive location a makeover with new flooring, ceiling, paint, decorations placed on the walls, a kitchen, as well as chalk drawn walls in several rooms. Collins went on Facebook Marketplace shopping for chairs to bring into the facility. In addition to the chairs, Collins also brought over several special pieces from Lark Tavern and McGeary's including hand-painted chess tables, a mosaic circular table featuring the names of Collins' friends, the late Caroline MotherJudge and Greg Haymes, and a mosaic rock-'n'-roll '60s themed mirror hanging inside the main office.

Albany Rock Pit officially opened to students Aug. 1. Collins and Lindh wanted to make certain that their No. 1 priority was to give the children their music lessons first. Collins didn't want the school to grow too quickly as she, Lindh, and the faculty are still working out the kinks, she said.

What does the Music **School Include?**

Parents with children 5-18 years old can register for music lessons at Albany Rock Pit. The music school includes a package where children can either do individualized lessons or both lessons and performance involvement. Students can register to take beginner lessons and take part in a musical jam session during the First Friday of the month at the school.

Open enrollment has now opened for adults to register to take part in an adult band every Tuesday evening, 8-10 p.m. with all skill levels welcome. Several adults are also taking part in an adult music program in a mini jam session with Cranston.

Currently, the children are rehearsing songs for their upcoming recital in December. One group of students is learning songs from the British Invasion and the rock era.

Cranston said that for him, music was always his artistic expression growing up

"This is cool," Cranston said. "We're new and we're here to make noise!"

Cranston, along with several other instructors including Cody Bogausch, Jay Goldman, Sara Alonge, Scott Owens, Wes Miller, and Maddy Caiazzo, engage with the students in their lessons and are there to provide them with the support and confidence they need to become rock stars.

"First and foremost rule is just to start them in a place where music is fun. We don't have to be technical, and they don't have to be shredders right off the bat," Cranston said. "It's about making it fun, identifying with where they're starting from, and going on."

Some of the children who arrive at the music school have no knowledge about music, band names, or their instructor, Cranston said.

"Sometimes they come in, they don't know anything about you, different bands, or anything really, and then we'll start to introduce them. They'll hang out with us and kids their age, and then in a few weeks or a month or so, you see them wearing their favorite band T-shirts or hats and they're suddenly trying to break things.... They're shining," Cranston said.



In 1929, after eight years in Europe, photographer Berenice Abbott (1898-1991) returned to New York City. She was inspired by its dramatic transformation. New construction was everywhere; hundreds of 19th-century buildings had been torn down to make way for dozens of skyscrapers. In 1956 Thomas Hart Benton was commissioned by Robert Moses, chairman of the New York Power Authority, to create two murals for the powerhouse building of the state's first hydropower facility in Massena. They feature Jacques Cartier's explorations of the St. Lawrence River and the Gulf of St. Lawrence. Alternately titled The Seneca Discover the French and Jacques Cartier Discovers the Indians, the murals depict the 16th-century encounters from

two points of view. Stonemason to Sculptor

When Henry DiSpirito (1898-1995) emigrated from Italy in 1921 he was already a trained stonemason and bricklayer. In Utica, New York, he found work in those trades but longed to devote his life to art. He found his calling in the direct-carving style of sculpture. Most of his subjects were animals or human figures, rendered in fieldstone or wood. 

"These instructors are amazing at making the kids feel good about themselves," Collins said. "Some of the kids (who) have special needs, they come in here and they see them (the instructors) and they're instantly in a good mood and their parents talk to me about it and they say this is the best part of the week for their kids. These kids come in and feel confident."

Watching the children discover who they are as musicians has been the favorite thing for both Collins and Lindh, and the teachers at Albany Rock Pit.

The Local Music Heroes of Today

Growing up in Troy and residing in Albany, music has always been in Collins' veins. From her days playing horn in a drum core to hosting comedy, art exhibits, music, and burlesque seven days a week at Lark Tavern and at Justin's, Collins always had her roots deep in local culture, and established lasting friendships with the movers and shakers who made the Capital Region a place to be in the music scene; in particular, Caroline MotherJudge and Greg Haymes.

Along a hallway wall lies a giant photograph canvas curtain of MotherJudge playing her instrument. Another wall will include an art piece created by Haymes himself to be hung to honor his memory, as well as canvas murals of Clifton Park bassist Joe Pallone and Jimmy Webb.

Pallone's wife donated several of his bass guitars and music gear to be used in the bass guitar teaching studio at the school.

"Now you see a music school that is based around all the people that mentored you and me, and half of Albany," Collins said. "When people come in, they see local people, they don't see a lot of famous people."

To the Future


Both Collins and Lindh don't want Albany Rock Pit to compete with other music schools.

"I don't want to compete with other music schools either. I'm sending them business," Collins concluded. "We want kids that want to play together."

From their days of meeting Lindh on Lark Street to teaming up to form the school, one thing is for certain: Collins and Lindh know what it takes to enrich the younger generations' lives and adults through the power and love of music, even through studying their local music history. If the students can become famous one day like Haymes' band Blotto or become a NYC punk icon like Jimmy Webb, so could they.

"These kids need to know that they can become famous," said Collins.





Warm and wow guests with hot mulled apple cider

hen hosting friends and family at home, it's understandable that hosts direct so much of their focus to the foods they plan to serve. The main course is often the focal point and most memorable aspect of a dinner party, and that's true whether the get-together is a backyard barbecue, a holiday meal with the family or a formal affair with colleagues.

Hot Mulled (Sherried) Apple Cider

Serves 16

- gallon apple cider
- *1 orange, unpeeled, cut into slices*
- 1/4 cup whole cloves

1

- *4 sticks cinnamon*
- 1/4 cup honey, preferably cranberry honey1 cup sherry (optional)

1. Combine the cider, orange slices, cloves, cinnamon, and honey in a large pot over medium heat. If you are picky about things floating in your cider, make a little bundle out of cheesecloth and place the cinnamon and cloves inside before adding to the cider. I like to chew on cloves, so I just toss everything



in. Bring to a boil, and then reduce to a simmer over low heat for an hour or so to spread these lovely winter aromas around your home.

2. If you're serving it to adults, add the optional sherry. It might make everyone warmer as the weather gets colder!





Without enough iron in the body, a person may feel tired and lethargic from a reduced production of hemoglobin, which carries oxygen in the blood from the lungs to the rest of the body. A lack of oxygen in body tissues from anemia can be serious, says the National Council for Aging Care. Tofu, spinach, lentils, pumpkin seeds, and fortified breads and cereals are high in iron.

Smart food choices can help seniors live long and healthy lives.

Recommended vaccines for adults



ewborn babies endure quite a bit in the first few days and months of their lives. Routine immunizations help newborns overcome these obstacles, and as newborns get old they receive vaccines to prevent measles, mumps, rubella, hepatitis, and chicken pox.

A common misconception suggests that vaccines are only for the young. However, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention notes that the protection provided by some childhood vaccines can wear off. In addition, some people may be at

risk for certain vaccine-preventable diseases due to lifestyle, existing health conditions and age. As a result, it's important for adults to make sure their vaccines are up-to-date.

Those who are unsure of their vaccine status should discuss their health history with their doctors. In the meantime, adults should know that the following vaccines are recommended for people of various ages. • **Influenza:** An annual flu shot is highly recommended. Doctors and health officials indicate that getting the flu vaccine is the single most effective way to prevent seasonal flu or reduce the duration and severity of the illness should it be contracted.



• Tdap: This vaccine contains strains of tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (whooping cough). All three are implicated in serious illnesses or death, according to WebMD. Just about every person, young and old, should receive the Tdap vaccine. The CDC says that every adult should get the Tdap vaccine once if they did not receive it as an adolescent. Then a Td booster shot every 10 years is sufficient. • Shingles: People who have been exposed to varicella (chicken pox) in their youth are at risk for shingles as they grow older. The CDC says nearly one out of three people in the United States will develop shingles in their lifetime. A shingles vaccine can

protect against shingles and complications from the disease. Adults who are 50 and older should get the vaccine, which is administered in two doses.

• Pneumococcal polysaccharide vaccine (PPSV23): This vaccine protects against serious pneumococcal diseases, including meningitis and bloodstream infections. It is recommended for all adults age 65 and older.

• Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV 13): This protects against serious pneumococcal disease and pneumonia. Adults 65 years or older who have never received a dose of PCV13 should discuss PCV13 with their physicians.

Vaccines protect the very young from various diseases, but there are many vaccines that are still vital to health in adulthood.



Modifications can make driving safer for seniors

The AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety, a nonprofit research and education association, says roughly 90 percent of seniors don't take advantage of simple, often inexpensive features that can greatly improve safety and extend their time behind the wheel. Here are some considerations.

• Cushions and seat pads: Cushions do more than just alleviate hip and back pain while sitting. Cushions and pads can raise drivers up and improve their line of sight over the dashboard. Swivel pads can make it easier to enter and exit the car as well. • Adaptive cruise control: This feature can adjust speed automatically to maintain a consistent space between vehicles.

• Adaptive headlights: These headlights, also known as steerable headlights, can improve visibility by changing the direction of the light beam with the movement of the steering wheel. • Pedal extenders: Extenders help short

drivers reach the pedals while maintaining a safe distance from the steering wheel and potential airbag

deployment.

• Hand controls: Whether one has sensory changes in the feet from surgery or a medical condition, adaptive hand controls can move the "pedals" up to the steering column.

• Blind spot warning and other sensors: Today's cars can be equipped with any

number of sensors that can detect oncoming traffic, cars to the left or right of the vehicle, items or cars behind the vehicle when reversing, and even if the vehicle has drifted out of the lane. These are all great safety features for any driver, but may be especially helpful to seniors.

• **Parking assist:** Parking assist technology can steer the vehicle into a space with little input from the driver.

 Voice control: Avoiding distractions and keeping hands on the wheel is enhanced by voice controls, which can be set up to do things like turn on the radio or adjust climate control.
 Convex mirrors: Special mirrors increase

the field of vision. Seniors have many tools available to make driving safer and more comfortable, which can

prolong their years behind the wheel.
