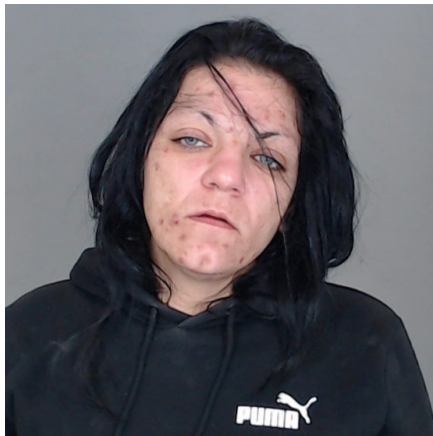

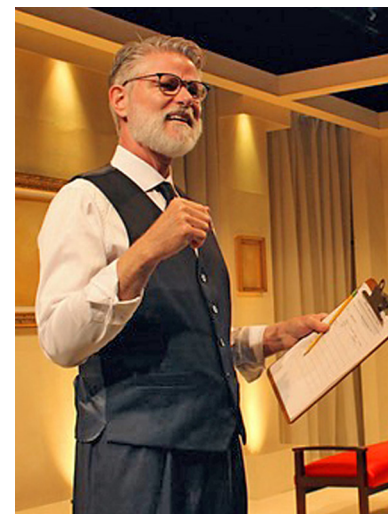
Bethlehem robbery suspect was supposed to be in court the day she allegedly stole a car and led police on a wrong-way Thruway pursuit

DELMAR - A Delanson woman who was supposed to be in a Colonie courtroom on Wednesday, Oct. 25, instead racked up 24 additional charges after she allegedly stole from a drug store, carjacked a vehicle, and led police on a car chase. She had six outstanding warrants when arrested.

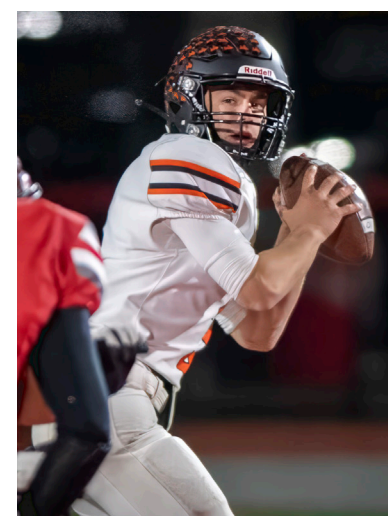

CVS Carjacker missed court date

According to reports, Bethlehem police responded to a larceny in progress at CVS at 260 Delaware Ave., that escalated into a robbery as Betsy Jablonski, 39, and an accomplice allegedly forcibly stole a vehicle from a person in the CVS parking lot.

Officers responding to the call located the stolen vehicle and attempted to stop it. Jablonski refused to stop for officers from the Bethlehem Police Department, New York State Police, and Albany County Sheriff's Department as the chase continued through town, into New Scotland and onto the Thruway at exit 21 in Selkirk, traveling northbound in the southbound lane.

The chase was not at high speed because the vehicle had a flat tire.

The Sheriff's units discontinued the chase at the Thruway. State police

and Bethlehem pursued in the northbound lane without lights or sirens.

Jablonski eventually stopped the vehicle on the onramp, because she was traveling the wrong way, of Exit 24 of the Thruway. She and a passenger in the vehicle fled on foot in the vicinity of Crossgate Commons, but Jablonski was located hiding in a wooded area and taken into custody after a search by City of Albany, Bethlehem and State Police officers.

The passenger and alleged accomplice was not found, but Bethlehem detectives said they have leads and an arrest is likely.

Jablonski was taken to Albany Medical Center Hospital with minor injuries and arrested by Bethlehem police on Friday, Oct. 27, as she was being released.

She was charged with robbery-motor vehicle, grand larceny, criminal

mischief and conspiracy, all felonies, and fleeing a police officer, conspiracy, reckless driving, petit larceny and aggravated unlicensed operation, all misdemeanors.

She was also ticketed for driving the wrong way on one way street, no lights, no tail light, failure to obey a traffic device, speeding, driving to the left of pavement markings, leaving the scene of an accident, failure to stop at stop sign, red light violation and failure to keep right.

Jablonski was arraigned in Bethlehem Town Court by Judge Andrew Kirby and sent to the Albany County jail in lieu of \$10,000 cash bail or \$20,000 bond.

Jablonski also had six active warrants at the time of arrest – two from Guilderland and at least one from State Police.

A preliminary hearing took place Tuesday, Oct.



taken back to the police station for processing, where, according to reports, she allegedly put the cocaine and pipe down her pants in order to conceal it.

She was charged with concealing, altering or destroying physical evidence, a felony, and criminal impersonation, criminal possession of a controlled substance and petit larceny, all misdemeanors.

31, and she was sent back to jail.

State Police arrested Jablonski on Tuesday, Oct. 31, and filed additional charges related to wrong way travel up the Thruway. Police charged her with grand larceny, a felony, and reckless endangerment, a misdemeanor and she was sent back to Albany County jail.

Supposed to be in court This was not Jablonski's first brush with the law. She was arrested a few

weeks ago in Colonie on drugs, fraud and destroying evidence charges.

On Monday, Oct. 9, at 4:31 p.m., Colonie police responded to Marshall's on Central Avenue for a report of a larceny.

A short distance from the store, officers located Jablonski allegedly with the stolen merchandise in her possession. During a search of her person, officers located a small amount of crack cocaine and a pipe. Jablonski also gave a false name to police. She was

She was given an appearance ticket for Colonie Town Court on Oct. 23 and released but did not show up on that day. The appearance was rescheduled for Oct. 25 – the same day she allegedly robbed the store and stole the car at the Delmar CVS. The charges from the Oct. 9 incident were not bail eligible and did not go before a judge.

As of press time, Colonie Town Court was in the process of issuing a bench warrant for Jablonski.

All aboard ready to go

Two historic electric locomotives ready to leave Beacon Island, head to rail museum

GLENMONT - Overlooking two cranes lifting the cab of a piece of history was an emotional moment to the men who saved two of the first electric locomotives ever made.

"I wasn't sure this day was going to come," Glenmont resident and train enthusiast Paul Marsh said to Stan Madyda. "I can remember so many days working in the weeds and muck down there and I won't miss the critters under there either."

For over 20 years the two Alco/GE all-electric locomotive sat until Marsh, a retired owner of a local bus company, Richard Vanderbilt, a retired Bethlehem police officer and rail historian, Dave Pickett and Madyda, the project's manager for the Danbury Railway Museum, were determined to get them where they belonged, a museum.

"Today is the day, there have been so many starts and stops, but they are finally moving," Madyda said.

The original S-1 prototype for the 1904 electric locomotive project and the only remaining T-motor electric locomotive were taken apart on Thursday, Nov. 2 and loaded onto special flatbed trailers designed for heavy loads. Combined the two locomotives weigh more than 513,000 pounds.

Once the Dagen trucking company obtains permits to transport, the pieces will make their way to Danbury Conn. to the museum to be restored.

The Mohawk and Hudson Chapter of the National Historic Railway Society, based in Albany

acquired the locomotives over the years and stored them in various locations across the Capital District.

Many of the local railroads, especially the Delaware and Hudson Railroad, provided facilities to store and restore the historic machines. The

NHRS chapter displayed and showed the S-1, to teach people about the area's rich rail history and the deep impact it had worldwide.
"In the 1980s the S-1

was stored at the Altamont Fairgrounds inside a building and was on display for the public to see," said Richard Vanderbilt, president of Mohawk and Hudson Chapter of

NRHS. "I used to sit in the conductor's seat and explain the history and function of the locomotive. It was a real showpiece and snapshot of history."

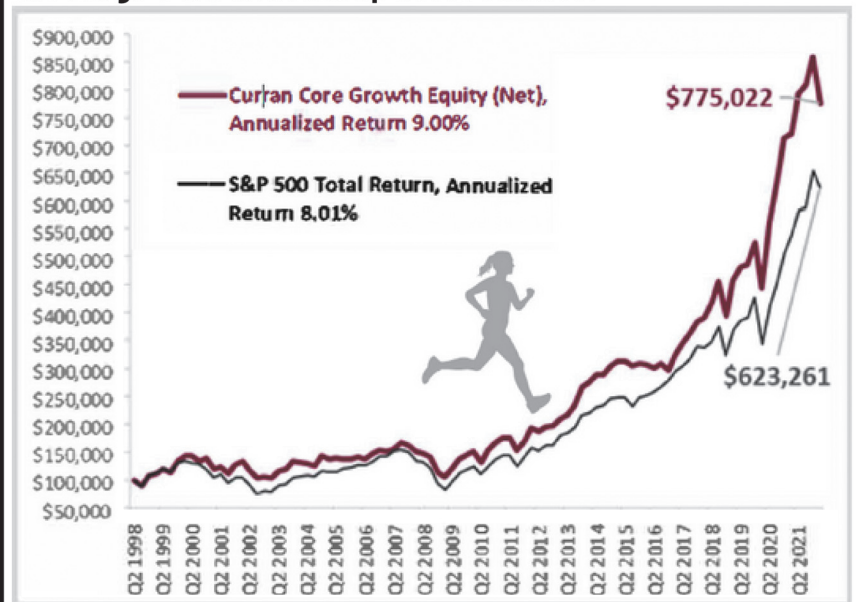

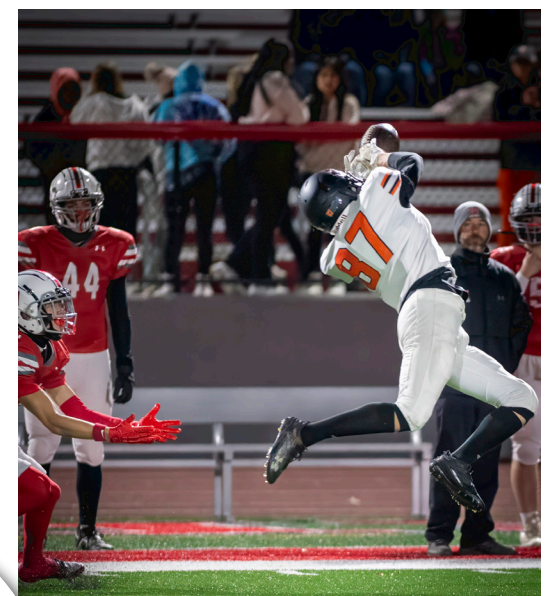

All aboard ready to go

“The first time I saw the S-motor it did not look like this and there was a cranky guy telling us all about it,” Joked Marsh, referring to Vanderbilt. “He was probably one of the only guys who actually traveled on both of these locomotives.”

Marsh and Madyda also reflected on how transformational these locomotives were to transportation, not just in the United States, but worldwide.

“When you consider that in 1903, Henry Ford, just started his assembly lines, so there were no cars and there were no airplanes and these machines could travel over 75 MPH pulling cars,” Marsh said. “These were about the



fastest things going at that time.”

Stuck on the Island.

The two locomotives were stored at the PSEG power station for about five years until, in 1998, for reasons unknown the plant moved them out to Beacon Island on an old rail spur that connected to the Port of Albany via a bridge over the Normanskill.

During upgrades to the

power plant in the early 2000’s they covered the tracks that lead back to the plant and in 2015 the bridge collapsed that connected the spur to the port. Up until last year, there were a total of four locomotives and four passenger cars sat rusting on the old tracks. Two diesel locomotives and all the cars were scrapped to make way for cleanup and redevelopment of the property to make way for a future wind tower manufacturing facility.

“I have to call Henry and let him know our progress, he has been the guy who helped push this along,” Madyda said, referring to Henry Posner III. Posner saw the historical value of the two electrics right away and offered financial and logistical help in getting the locomotives to Danbury. The museum



raised money through its supporters to fund the move, but it was Posner’s consistent commitment to cover any bumps along the way that gave the team confidence to move forward.

Madyda gave the phone update while standing on the hill.

“Its going to be great to have these available to the next generation. There have been many times over the years that we thought

it was the end of the road for these. Not any more,” he said.

Local Federal gun conviction

Stolen guns from Glenmont Walmart leads to guilty plea

ALBANY- A Troy man pleaded guilty to Federal gun charges on Friday, Oct. 27 for a May 2022 theft of firearms from the Walmart on Route 9W in Glenmont.

Michael C. McDermott, 30, of Troy, pled guilty today to stealing six firearms from a federally licensed dealer. United States Attorney Carla B. Freedman; John B. DeVito, Special Agent in Charge of the New York Field Division of the U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF); and Bethlehem Police Chief Gina F. Cocchiara made the announcement.

McDermott admitted to forcing his way into the Glenmont Walmart on May 10, 2022, while it was closed overnight, smashing the glass gun case, and stealing six firearms. McDermott also admitted that when employees chased him into the woods, he pointed a firearm at them.

United States District Judge Anne M. Nardacci will sentence McDermott on February 26. The conviction carries a maximum term of 10 years in prison, a fine of up to \$250,000, and a term of supervised release of up to 3 years.

A defendant's sentence is imposed by a judge based on the particular statute the defendant is charged with violating, the U.S. Sentencing Guidelines and other factors.

The ATF and Bethlehem Police Department investigated the case. Assistant U.S. Attorney Jonathan S. Reiner is prosecuting the case.

Two arrested for grand larceny at Walmart

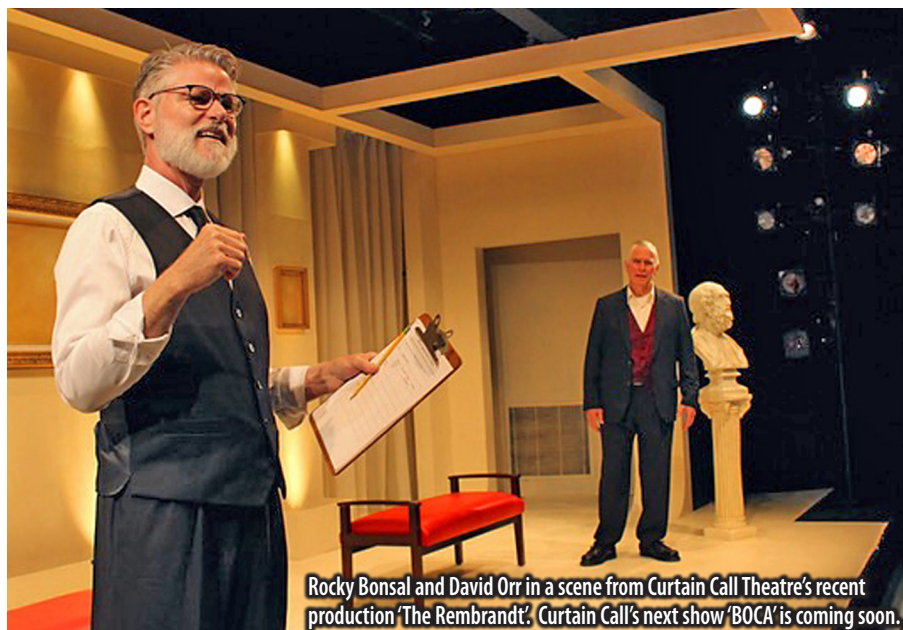

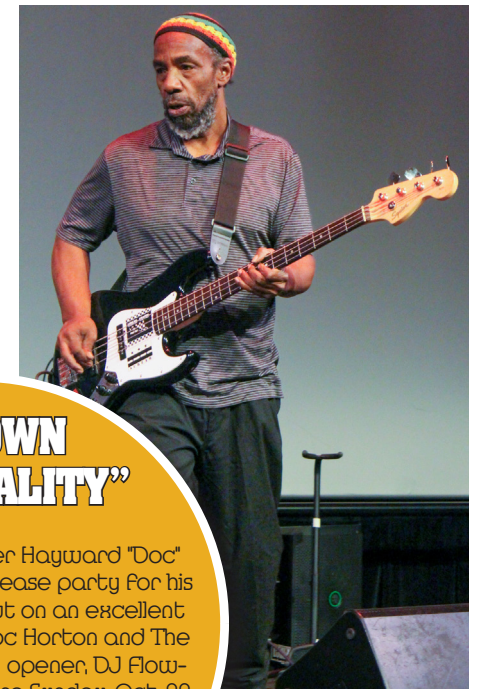

To the moon and back

Albany Symphony Orchestra takes audience on a journey to the past in their November concert

ALBANY — At The Troy Savings Bank Music Hall on Saturday, Nov. 11-12, the Albany Symphony Orchestra's (ASO) November concert series will feature beloved works in the repertory and riveting new pieces. Grammy Award-winning composer Michael Daugherty will be featured in pre-concert talks, supervising the Albany Symphony's commercial recording of his featured works, which include "Last Dance at the Surf" and "To the New World."

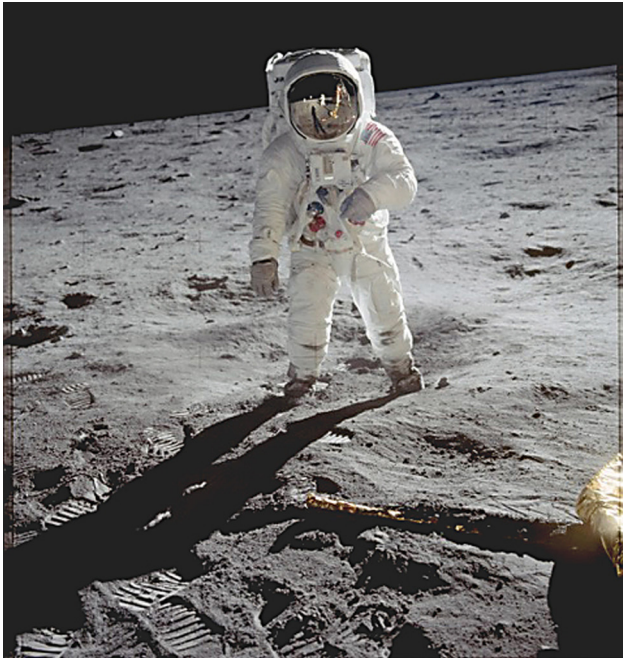
"I'm very excited to have this recording of these

major works that all have to do with flight, all recorded by the wonderful Albany Symphony Orchestra," said Daugherty. "David Allen Miller and the Albany Symphony is the orchestra that records the most New America music of any orchestra in America. They've been doing it consistently for decades."

The performances of these works are an exciting opportunity for audiences to experience ASO's November season in full effect. From tragedy to discovery, the compositions are designed to have the audience walk away thinking about the legacy of flight.

"To the New World," a riveting tribute to Neil Armstrong and the Apollo 11 mission, is a glorious tone poem about space travel," said Music Director and Conductor David Alan Miller.

On Sept. 12, 1962, President John F. Kennedy's



famous speech, "We choose to go to the Moon," was an invitation to seek out a world beyond our own, pushing forward America's race to become the first country to land a human on the Moon. Daugherty composed "To the New World" in celebration of

the 50th anniversary of the Apollo 11 mission and the first walk on the Moon by astronaut Neil Armstrong on July 20, 1969.

The piece features three movements that track the journey of the mission. "Like the rocket, which separated in three

stages after lift-off, and the spacecraft, which was divided into three modules, my 22-minute composition is in three movements," he said.

In the first movement, Moonrise, he seeks to evoke the same awe and mystery that the astronauts may have experienced when first seeing the new horizon outstretched before them. This attention to historical detail in the three movements of Moonrise, One Small Step, and Splashdown is essential to Daugherty.

As a collector of autographs and historical memorabilia, Daugherty is drawn to the past as an inspiration.

"Those are particular time periods that I find interesting," he said. "I always do a lot of historical research."

In addition to research, he also utilizes his own memories of the past

with the Surf Ballroom in Iowa as the inspiration for "Last Dance at the Surf." Childhood road trips in his home state of Iowa introduced him to the legendary Surf Ballroom.

"It's using experiences that I've had as a kid and grew up with that give me an emotional framework as I'm writing the piece," he said. "It's not just about the notes on the page; it's also about emotions and feelings about things in the past and memories that mean something to me."

In memory of Buddy Holly, Richie Valens and The Big Bopper, who gave their last performances at the Winter Dance Party tour in 1959 before the fatal plane crash, and in celebration of the Surf Ballroom being declared a National Historic Landmark in January 2021, Daugherty's composition is a tribute to the music legends.

Changing New York

In 1929, after eight years in Europe, photographer Berenice Abbott (1898–1991) returned to New York City. She was inspired by its dramatic transformation. New construction was everywhere; hundreds of 19th-century buildings had been torn down to make way for dozens of skyscrapers. She was determined to capture this momentous change in photographs.

Thomas Hart Benton

In 1956 Thomas Hart Benton was commissioned by Robert Moses, chairman of the New York Power Authority, to create two murals for the powerhouse building of the state's first hydropower facility in Massena. They feature Jacques Cartier's explorations of the St. Lawrence River and the Gulf of St. Lawrence. Alternately titled The Seneca Discover the French and Jacques Cartier Discovers the Indians, the murals depict the 16th-century encounters from two points of view.

Stonemason to Sculptor

When Henry DiSpirito (1898–1995) emigrated from Italy in 1921 he was already a trained stonemason and bricklayer. In Utica, New York, he found work in those trades but longed to devote his life to art. He found his calling in the direct-carving style of sculpture. Most of his subjects were animals or human figures, rendered in fieldstone or wood. He exhibited at the Whitney, MoMA, and SculptureCenter in New York City, and at museums and galleries across the state. Renowned for his sculpture, DiSpirito was an accomplished painter as well. In 1963, he was appointed the first artist-in-residence at Utica College, a position he held until his death. Through his art, DiSpirito developed a deep connection with students and faculty, as well as the larger community in Utica. December 23, 2019 to December 31, 2023.

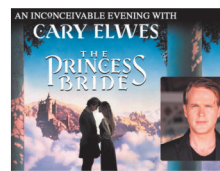

Essential gear for first-time Thanksgiving hosts

Hosting Thanksgiving is a large undertaking that can put some hosts under pressure. Unlike some other holidays that are less food-focused, Thanksgiving is largely about the meal. Turkey is the centerpiece of the celebration, and any guests who come over are going to expect turkey and a number of side dishes. Leaving hungry is never an option on Thanksgiving.

Individuals who are new to Thanksgiving hosting may be at a loss as to where to start with their preparation. There are certain must-haves hosts should familiarize themselves with. Many of these essentials revolve around tools for cooking in the kitchen and serving guests.

- **Large roasting pan:** You'll need somewhere to oven-roast the turkey. While it's perfectly acceptable to purchase a disposable aluminum pan for this purpose, if you plan to host Thanksgiving year after year, investing in a quality roasting pan will help deliver even cooking temperatures to the food and also can be used for roasting other meats.

- **Wire rack:** The turkey is placed upon a rack inside of the roasting pan so that it will not swim in the juices and cause a soggy bottom during cooking. Many roasting pans and racks are sold as sets, but others can be purchased separately. The rack can be used for other purposes as well, including cooling baked cookies or even drying out fresh herbs.

- **Food thermometer:** Ensuring the turkey and other foods are cooked to the correct internal temperature is essential. You do not want to send guests home with foodborne illnesses. Food

thermometers run the gamut from very basic to those that can be programmed to alert cooks through an app on a smartphone. Turkey is done when the temperature reads 170 F in the breast and 180 F in the thigh. If stuffed, the stuffing should register 165 F, according to Butterball.

- **Coordinated casserole dishes:** Casserole dishes can hold all of the sides served with the turkey, including stuffing, sweet potatoes, mashed potatoes, green beans, and more. A set of matching dishes will help the tablescape look more coordinated.

- **Service for eight or more:** Thanksgiving draws a crowd, so take inventory of silverware, dishes, wine glasses, and any other table needs to ensure that you can accommodate all of the guests. Purchase new items if you cannot set the table completely with what you have, as mixed and matched may be okay for informal events but may not set the tone hosts are aiming for on Thanksgiving.

- **Table and chairs:** Determine if you have enough table space to seat all of your guests. Some dining tables come with an extension leaf, but you still may need to supplement with a folding table. You may need more seating. Chairs can be rented or you can utilize some folding chairs.

- **Turkey serving platter:** When the turkey is ready, it can be placed on an attractive serving platter for your photos, after which you slice and then return the sliced poultry to the serving platter for dining.

Thanksgiving requires a number of essentials that hosts will need to have on hand to make the holiday complete.

How to master shopping early for the holidays

The early bird gets the worm is a well-known English proverb that historians trace all the way back to the 1600s. FOOD & VINO

A turkey alternative for intimate Thanksgiving meals

Thanksgiving is steeped in traditions involving familiar foods. Thanksgiving may look a little different this year, and certain customs may need to be modified. If family celebrations are scaled back, perhaps a large turkey that can feed 10 or more will not be needed.

Even if the size of the celebration may be reduced, flavor doesn't have to shrink as well. Families can use this opportunity to try some new foods that can enhance this year's Thanksgiving experience. This recipe for "Poulet au Vinaigre" from "Simple Soirées: Seasonal Menus for Sensational Dinner Parties" (Stewart, Tabori & Chang) by Peggy Knickerbocker takes about an hour to get on the table and it's a flavorful dish that can be a succulent and special option for holiday meals.

Poulet au Vinaigre

Serves 6 to 8

- 12 chicken thighs (about 3 to 4 pounds), bone in
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 6 shallots, minced
- 6 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/2 cup apple cider vinegar
- 1-1/2 cups dry white wine
- 1 tablespoon tomato paste
- 1-1/2 cups chicken stock, preferably homemade
- 1/2 cup chopped Italian parsley

Season the chicken generously with salt and pepper to taste. In a large, deep skillet (big enough to hold all chicken fairly close together; or use two skillets), melt 3 tablespoons of the butter in 1 tablespoon

of the olive oil over medium-high heat. Brown the chicken for about 8 minutes, turning so both sides get nicely browned. Transfer the chicken to a deep, broad, ovenproof casserole that can go from the oven to the table. Remove the skillet from the heat and pour off most of the fat. Preheat the oven to 375 F. Place the skillet back over medium heat and add the remaining 1 tablespoon butter and 1 tablespoon olive oil. Add the shallots and garlic and cook for about 1 minute, or until they become translucent. Add the vinegar and wine, and stir up the crispy bits that have stuck to the bottom of the pan. Allow the liquids



to cook down a bit, stirring occasionally, for about 8 minutes. Whisk in the tomato paste and let the sauce simmer and condense, about 5 minutes more. Then add the chicken stock, a little at a time. Keep stirring to mix well. Pour the sauce over the chicken. Bake for 35 to 45 minutes until the chicken is very tender, turning the chicken pieces halfway through, so that both sides are infused with the sauce.

Remove one thigh and cut into it to make sure it is done and no red juices flow from the cut.

Remove the casserole from the oven, sprinkle the parsley on top, and serve.

“The content of the music is something right out of a civics class. It’s a wholesome and positive opportunity to expose kids to a civics lesson with the magic of live theater,” said Owen M. Smith, producing artistic director

“I don’t think people realize how much effort, energy and time goes into a show,” said Smith. “We want to see more and more people having their artistic work valued and getting paid for it, because that’s what’s going to make it the best work possible. Art is worth compensating for.”
