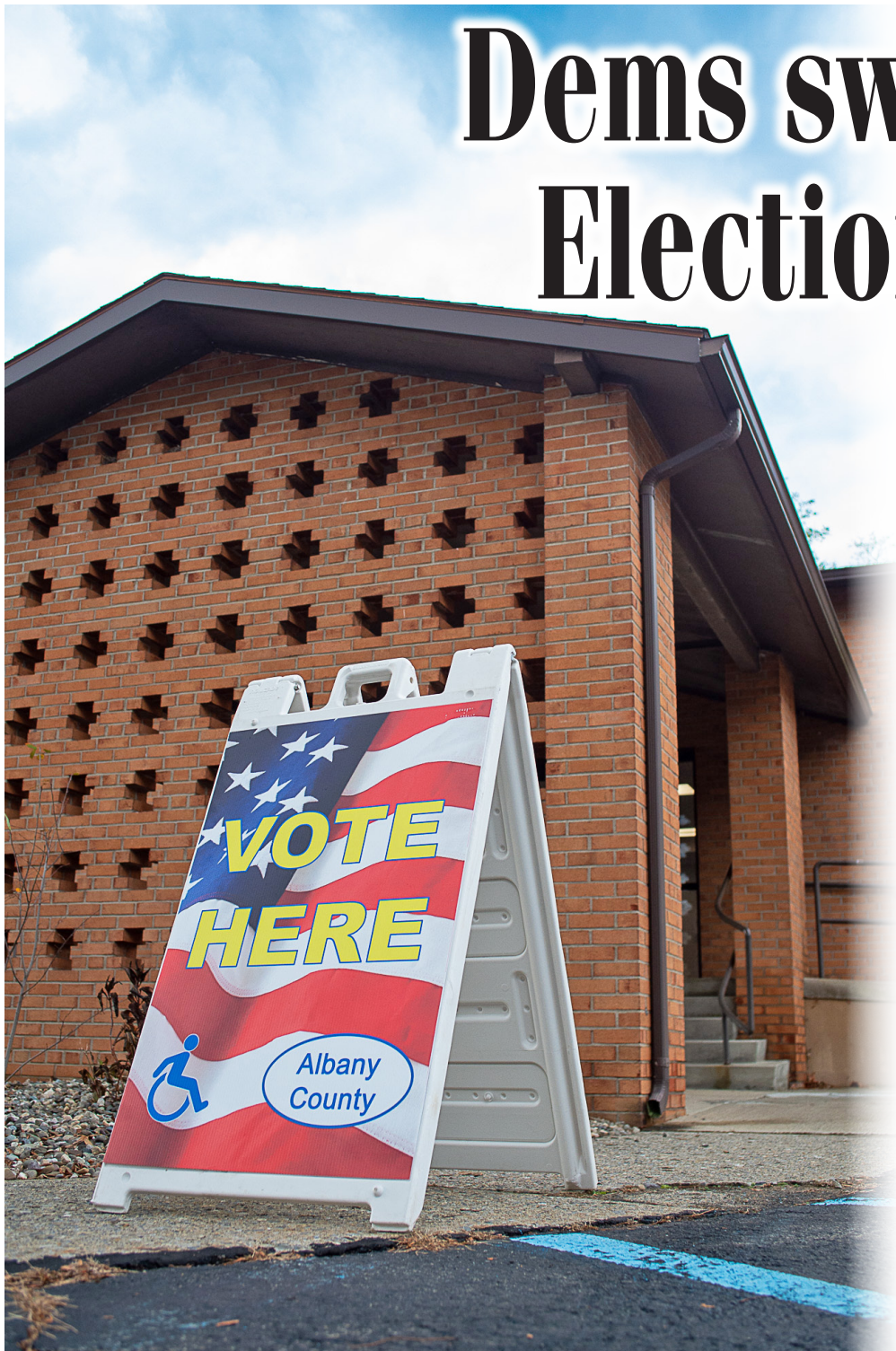

# Dems sweep on Election Night



Party wins all town seats and local County Legislature seats

DELMAR - Bethlehem Democratic candidates swept in all town races this year's general election held on Tuesday, Nov. 7.

Most of the races were uncontested, but the two to watch, Bethlehem Town Council and Bethlehem Highway Superintendent, were not close.

Town Supervisor David Vanluven won another two-year term and Receiver of Taxes Alicia Roney won another four-year term. For town clerk, Kimberley Whitsitt won a two-year term replacing Nanci Moquin who is retiring. All of those seats were uncontested.

In the town board contest for a four-year term, Joyce Becker won reelection for her third term and first-time candidate Thomas Schnurr won

# Opening a New Chapter

Bethlehem Library proposes renovations to support the community's growing needs

DELMAR - Voters may be deciding next spring whether the Bethlehem Public Library receives a major facelift. The library is proposing an approximately \$28 million overhaul looking to address outdated aspects of the library building, such as its second floor, expand in-demand spaces, improve accessibility, and complete remediation of asbestos.

The current Bethlehem Public Library building was first constructed in 1971. In 2000, a major renovation was proposed, costing about \$12 million at the time. The renovation was voted down by the public, and instead a \$1.5 million facelift was done, including the current carpets, new shelves, and new paint. However, this renovation didn't alter any mechanical or structural aspects of the building.

While the proposed project is still being designed and planned, the total project construction cost is currently estimated at \$28.3 million. According to director

Geoffrey Kirkpatrick, if the process goes as planned, the project will be put to a public vote in May. If the public approves, the design will be finalized and construction would take about a year, he said. The library would remain open during the process. If the public votes the proposal down, the project will return to the drawing board and reworked according to public input.

One of the major structural changes proposed would be expanding the library's main entrance and shifting it to where the garage currently is. The location change would be done to make the entrance of the library more obvious and accessible, especially for people who are new to the area, such as those participating in the Upper Hudson library system's expedition program over the summer.

"People get genuinely confused when they come here; it happens daily," Kirkpatrick said, explaining that patrons tend to gravitate towards the garage due



library was first constructed, what is currently the nonfiction area had built-in shelves installed, with the poles on either side of the shelves built into the floor. These same poles serve as columns holding up the roof of the mezzanine floor, and so these shelves can't be moved. The space, which is currently used for staff, has been deemed unsuitable for public or staff needs due to these poles obstructing the space.

When entering the building but before arriving in the library area itself, visitors walk through a gallery space where local artists' work is displayed. The "popcorn ceiling" in this area contains

asbestos. The ceiling was encapsulated to prevent it from crumbling in 2003, but that has not allowed updates to the mechanical pipes and wires. The asbestos would be removed with the renovation.

**On the outside.**

The new design would include a dedicated curbside pick-up and drop-off

to its orientation in the parking lot rather than the actual entrance. The new entrance would have parking on all three sides, and accessible parking close by. The meeting rooms, such as the community room and board room, would be moved to this new entrance space, making the areas where programs and meetings are held more front and center.

In addition, the mezzanine level of the library would be demolished. When the

# Selkirk celebrates a young life cut short

- Colin Reedy, 25, of Exton, Penn., grew up here and made an impression on his community. On Friday, Oct. 20 that life was cut short after he was killed in a traffic accident responding to a fire call on a slick road in Pennsylvania. He and his life partner Emily Gindele had joined the West Whiteland Fire Company earlier this year.

He was a plumber by trade, and always cared for and helped others.

On October 27, the local community came out to honor Colin at the Kings Chapel on Route 9W. Many local firefighters and first responders turned out for his memorial.

He is survived by his parents, Brian and Tracy

(Haberstroh) Reedy of Coatesville, Pa. and sisters, Jordan and Addie; grandparents, Richard Haberstroh and companion Daphne Brooks, of Lewes, Del., William and Marjorie (Jarvis) Reedy of Albany, and many aunts, uncles and cousins.

He was known to be a man of integrity with a servant's heart. The outpouring from people sharing stories of how Colin touched their lives and how he brought a level of energy and light everywhere he went, solidifies a legacy that transcends the grave.

area near the main entrance, where staff would handle the exchange through a window. The current curbside pick-up system, where staff come out of the garage to meet the patron, was an experiment that began during the COVID-19 pandemic. Kirkpatrick estimated it makes up about 5% of the library's current business. The renovated area would be similar to the pick-up area of the East Greenbush Community Library, and aims to make the exchange easier for both patrons and staff.

One goal of the project, Kirkpatrick said, is to balance the size of the building, the amount of parking needed, and the amount of green space that is left.

"We know [the green] is a very important part of the summertime experience here, doing programs out here, being able to do Evening on the Green ... all that stuff happens out here," Kirkpatrick said, maintaining that

such green space is a crucial part of the proposed renovation. In addition, the plan includes an improved outdoors performance area with a proper stage and permanent sound equipment to better accommodate the bands that perform there.

The parking lot would undergo a major reconfiguration as well. Kirkpatrick said that apart from getting it "milled and redone," the parking lot would be redesigned to prevent confusion, speeding, and traffic accidents.

"It's a poor design that just happened organically," Kirkpatrick said, referring to incidents where people have incorrectly used one-way parts of the parking lot.

In addition to improving the flow of traffic, with the demolition of the library-owned house on 59 Borthwick Ave., more parking spots would be added to accommodate current foot traffic.

"This building's footprint hasn't changed for 50 years," Public Information Specialist Kristen Roberts said. "It takes

up the same amount of space, but the number of people coming in has greatly increased."

### On the inside.

The new design would also greatly expand quiet spaces for work or study. Kirkpatrick said that while most modern libraries are designed with loud, intermediate, and quiet zones in mind, the Bethlehem Public Library was not, and staff have since tried to shoehorn in the different zones with the space available. Currently, the dedicated quiet spaces of the library consist mostly of a few cubicles and the four private study rooms, all of which are in high demand. The renovation would add eight more such rooms, and create more defined quiet areas of the library.

The library plans to move the children's area closer to the entrance to improve accessibility for parents with strollers and young children, while putting the quieter areas further away for those who need it.

The project also aims to expand crafting spaces and space for children to play in,

both of which have seen lots of demand, while still keeping room for the book collections.

"We're trying to balance all of the uses that people want to have in the library," Kirkpatrick said.

The teen's area would also see some changes, with Kirkpatrick looking to design a space that's "segregated, but not invisible." The current teen area was first made distinct around 2003, with comfortable seating and laptops added. However, it's cut through by a major walkway to get to the often-busy study rooms, and Kirkpatrick said that the library would like to make it more welcoming for teens coming to the library to read, study, or hang out.

Roberts has also expressed a desire to expand the makerspace. The library currently has a small space containing things such as a 3D printer, a VHS to DVD converter, a podcast station, and a studio space for recording videos, "but this is just a fraction of what we want to have in the makerspace," Roberts said.

### A thank-you event for Meals on Wheels donors

Local businesses, program participants raised \$44,000 for two vehicles

RAVENA - In advance of the Thanksgiving holiday, members of the Holcim Ravena cement plant leadership team joined Senior Projects of Ravena, local business owners, and area residents on Thursday, Nov. 9, to formally thank donors who made possible the purchase of two new vehicles for the nonprofit's delivery of meals to homebound seniors in Southern Albany County.

Toys For Tots Benefit Returns to Philly, Mikaela Singleton returns as event MC

LATHAM - Returning to Philly Bar and Grill Saturday, Nov. 18 is the 23rd Annual Rock For Tots. The annual fundraiser, held from 3-11 p.m. at 622 Watervliet Shaker Rd in Latham, will help support the USMC Capital Region Toys For Tots.

Restaurateurs who wish to support the cause can pay \$10 and bring a new unwrapped toy to Rock For Tots. This year's entertainment will be provided by Flame, Harmony Rocks, and Watchdog. Raffles will be held from 8-8:30 p.m. and a food buffet will be provided by 4-8 p.m. Also making her return to MC the event will be former NEWS10ABC reporter Mikhaela Singleton.

Waterford resident and event organizer Andrew Walters became involved in collecting toys for Toys for Tots in 1998 after being elected Commander of

the Waterford Sons of the American Legion. That year, less toy donations were being collected and Walters wanted to help collect toys for the Blue Barrels.

The first time Walters collected toys, he was unable to fill the barrels and returned only a few toys to a Marine who was still appreciative of whatever toys were to be donated. Walters apologized for not being able to fill the barrels. The Marine suggested to Walters to try something different to gain more donations, Walters said.

In 1999, Walters discussed the idea of having a benefit event for Toys for Tots with his friend who ran Constanzo's Riverside in Halfmoon (pre Chrome Food and Spirits). This new benefit would have live entertainment, a buffet, and a donation of \$5 and an unwrapped toy. A year later, his friend at Constanzo's called Walters to tell him that people were asking when the next Rock for Tots event was taking place. Walters and his friend planned the event again for the Saturday before Thanksgiving and since then, Rock For Tots has been happening around the same time frame.

According to Walters, the 1999 Rock for Tots fundraiser was both the largest event and the second event in the Capital

Region supporting the Capital Region Toys For Tots.

Rock for Tots originally began at Constanzo's until it was sold to new owners and became Chrome Food and Spirits. The event then was held at Michael's Banquet House and later on, returned to Chrome. A few years had passed and the Chrome atmosphere changed and Walters decided to look for an alternative location.

Walters then went to Philly to meet with owner, Rocky Patel, and his manager to discuss the Rock For Tots idea. After holding the discussion, Patel and his manager made an agreement with Walters to host the event at the Latham restaurant.

Rock for Tots was canceled in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic and due to the success of the 2021 fundraiser, Rocky wanted Walters to book the event for 2022.

For those who are not able to attend the fundraiser but would like to make a toy donation can drop off an unwrapped toy at all Dunkin Donuts locations for the Toys for Tots collection boxes. And for those who want to attend the fundraiser but don't bring a toy with them, they will be asked to pay \$20.

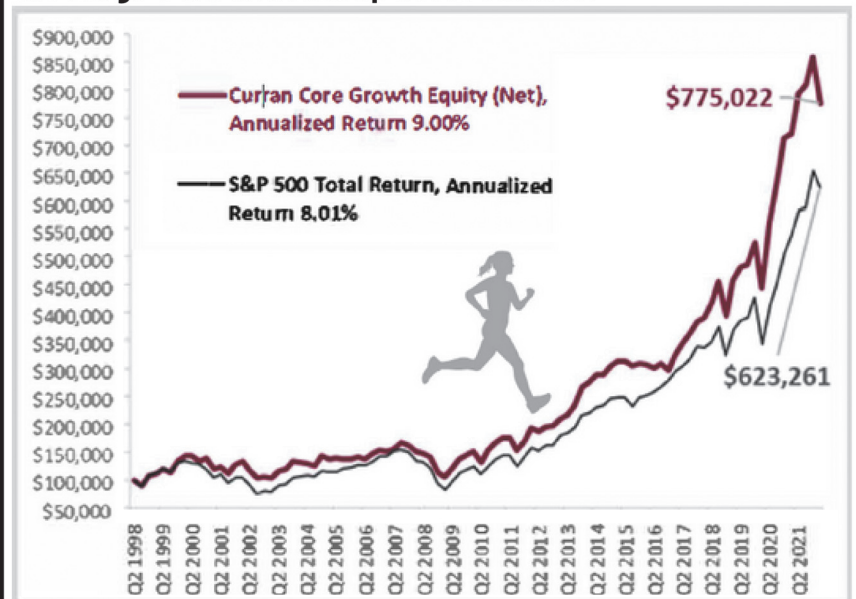

the second seat to replace Daniel Coffey, who did not seek reelection. Republican Theresa O’Neil came in third in voting and Uniting Bethlehem Party Candidate Kellin Rowlands came in fourth. Rowlands was on the ballot after beating back petition challenges from both Democrats initially by winning a case in court brought by the Board of Elections. The BOE also lost an appeal in the case, which put Rowlands on the ballot.

The two Democrats received almost twice the votes of either O’Neil or Rowlands.

In the battle for Highway Superintendent, incumbent Marc Dorsey won with 62 percent of the vote to 37 percent for Craig Sleurs.

“I would say that Tuesday’s election sent a strong message that residents are happy with town and county leadership,” Bethlehem Democratic chair Joanne Cunningham said. “The results speak volumes that we are doing a good job.”

#### County Seats

In addition to the re-election of County Executive Dan McCoy and County Sheriff Craig Apple, who both were unopposed, the Democrats swept all the Bethlehem County Legislature seats.

Cunningham, in District 34, and William Reinhardt, in District 33, both were unopposed and won four-year terms.

In District 35, Jeffrey Kuhn took 70 percent of the vote to win against Republican Mitchell Goldstein.

The closest race in the town was in District 36 where incumbent Democrat Matt Miller won over Terran O’Brien by less than 300 votes.

One of the factors of the race was the turnout. Almost 10,500 votes were cast, in a year where there was not a contest for supervisor or a local referendum on the ballot.

In 2021, there was a race for supervisor and a ballot question to fund the Delaware Avenue Complete Streets project. Almost 12,000 residents voted.

“Bethlehem residents are pretty habitual and strong voters,” Cunningham said.

There were absentee and affidavit ballots outstanding on Friday, and the BOE said they will be counted this week. The results in each race with more than one candidate are below.

### Bail after warrants

arraigned her on both warrants and sent her back to Rensselaer County jail.

That is where she was on November 8, where Bethlehem traveled over to pick Maeweather up for court, arraign, set bail and return her to the jail.

Bethlehem police also made sure to send securing orders to both the Albany County and Rensselaer County jails for her.

That way, if she made bail in one municipality and was transferred to another, Maeweather would still be held.

Maeweather was with Myunique McQueen, 20, of Albany at the June 12 Price Chopper larceny. She was charged as well in the case.

McQueen, however, was involved in grand larceny thefts at Lowes in Glenmont, three separate grand larcenies and bail jumping in Colonie, grand larceny in North Greenbush, larceny in August 2022 at Price

Chopper in Slingerlands and larcenies in Glenville. All of these arrests took place since August 2022.

There is a call for the State Legislature to revise the bail laws regarding prevalent larcenists. A bill has been introduced in the State Senate and Assembly, but that has not been considered yet.

### Chase, DWI, 25 charges

**SLINGERLANDS** - A chase that started on Route 85 ended on Lincoln Avenue in Albany when the driver crashed his vehicle, fled on foot, returned to the scene and was charged with DWI.

According to reports, at 2:59 a.m. on Saturday, Nov. 5, Bethlehem police attempted to pull over a 2010 Nissan Frontier on Route 85 that was traveling 74 mph and the vehicle fled. The vehicle increased to 91 mph and exited the highway into the neighborhoods in the city

of Albany.

Bethlehem police discontinued the chase once it left the highway due to safety concerns and continued to the next exit to turn around to head back to Bethlehem. At that point the officer saw the vehicle enter Route 85 again and accelerated to approximately 100 mph.

The Nissan turned off its lights during this time as well. The car exited 85 again and entered the City of Albany again and the chase was again discontinued for safety.

A search of the area found the Nissan crashed at the end of Rosemont Street and when officers approached the vehicle, they saw a suspect run through the woods and chased on foot.

They lost contact with the suspect, but he found them near the intersection of Lincoln and Colvin Avenues.

The man, a 21-year-old Troy man, told officers it was his car that crashed and he was driving. The man was taken into custody for unlawfully fleeing a police

officer in a motor vehicle.

While speaking with the man, officers observed he had bloodshot and glassy eyes, slurred speech and had an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath.

He was given and failed field sobriety tests and tested positive for breath alcohol on a pre-screening device.

At the police station he provided a breath sample that returned a .15 percent BAC.

He was charged with DWI, unlawful fleeing a police officer and two counts of reckless driving, all misdemeanors and driving left of markings, two counts of speeding, unsafe lane change, leaving the scene of a property damage accident, no lights, six counts of illegal signal and seven counts of failing to stop at stop signs, all violations.

The man was given an appearance ticket for Bethlehem Town Court on November 21 and released.

### Study did not look at a one-way Kenwood Ave properly

To the Editor,

Proposal 8.B.1. as described under the Kenwood Avenue Potential Solutions Matrix is not captured correctly. I know this because I proposed it. And though I'm no civil engineer, that is the reason I had wished for the community to debate its merits before it was brushed away.

Converting a portion of Kenwood into a "one-way" street included the stretch of road between Adams Place and Elsmere Avenue, not Delaware Avenue. Kenwood was not designed as a modern-day thoroughfare. Though it spans from Glenmont to Slingerlands, the neighborhoods surrounding it were erected when the width of the motor vehicle was a foot smaller. We witnessed this as an unassuming pedestrian was struck while walking on the sidewalk by a pick-up truck's side mirror. The roadway is too narrow and neighboring homes have little

more room to give for expansion. So why not take away from motorists?

CHA Consulting dismissed the idea because it thought it "increases traffic on Elsmere and Delaware, [and is an] inconvenience to residents and businesses along a one-way stretch." It also stated that the proposal "reroutes busses and would impact emergency services."

The consulting firm is also connected with the renewed look at calming Delaware Avenue.

Delaware Avenue is a roadway designed specifically to be a modern-day thoroughfare. And, despite its initial construction over 50 years ago, an engineering firm recently said it was under-utilized today. As it runs through our town's business district, from the Four Corners to Albany, I doubt any business owner will object to increased traffic. As for Elsmere Avenue, it has adequate

sidewalks between Delaware and the By-Pass - another modern-day thoroughfare to which more bold changes would divert traffic back towards.

Unlike the Delaware Avenue Road Diet, we are sharing ideas that impact an established residential roadway that is soon to see more traffic with additional housing. Traffic circles, no matter how petite, don't belong in a residential area. However, I'd be more welcome to see crosswalk signals, raised crosswalks and a reduction to the state minimum speed limit of 25. This should dissuade motorists from Kenwood and encourage them to use Delaware Avenue and the By-Pass - as they were intended.

There's also the opportunity to add a bike lane between St. Thomas, by Bethlehem Central Middle School, and to the Kenwood/Elsmere Avenue intersection that safely leads to the Albany County Rail

Trail. Anyone who travels along this road as school lets in and out can confirm how dreadful motor vehicle traffic is at these times. This could add to much-needed safety for our school children.

As for my idea's impact on emergency responders, I yield to them. This was concocted based on my layman's observations: That Elsmere Fire Company uses Herber Avenue and Adams Place, not Kenwood, while responding to calls in Delmar proper. That Delmar-Bethlehem EMS, housed west of Four Corners, travels west to east on this section. Bethlehem Police, too, predominately travels west to east, too.

That was the conversation I hoped to have.

# Alleged larcenist lands in jail

Woman with five different addresses on five arrests has bail set after warrants

DELMAR - A woman wanted by at least four police departments for at least five separate arrests and charges, had bail set and sent to jail. This all might seem very confusing and vague, but that is because it is. We are doing our best to sort through this.

On November 8, Halasha Maeweather, 20, of Albany (on the most recent arrest), was sent back to the Rensselaer County jail in lieu of \$1 bail set by Bethlehem Town Judge Ryan Donovan after he arraigned her on a charge of petit larceny, a misdemeanor. The charge stemmed from a June 12 incident at Price Chopper in Glenmont that

involved the theft of \$503 worth of merchandise from the store.

Under the 2019 State criminal justice reform, that charge would not be bail eligible. Matter of fact, if the charge was felony grand larceny for a theft over \$1,000, it still would not be bail eligible. However, if a judge arraigns a suspect and releases them under conditions and the new charge is a felony, the judge can consider bail. We are not sure what charge or municipality was able to make her eligible for bail, but on November 2, Maeweather was arrested in Guilderland, processed there on charges and then transported to Bethlehem for the arrest warrant for the Price Chopper.

Donovan was contacted by police, but because Maeweather had other outstanding warrants, he vacated the warrant and had police issue an appearance ticket for November 8 and release

her to North Greenbush police for its warrant.

North Greenbush must have sent Maeweather to the Rensselaer County jail, because on November 6 Colonie police picked her up at the jail for two outstanding warrants they had for her. Both of the warrants were for incidents that took place in September 2022.

It is also worth noting that Maeweather had two different addresses on those warrants, which were different from the addresses in North Greenbush and Bethlehem. According to media reports, Maeweather was also arrested in North Greenbush in September 2022 for larceny.

The two warrants in Colonie were for failing to appear in court, but the reports do not have the original charges. They must have been strong enough to hold her, because Colonie Judge Andrew Sommers

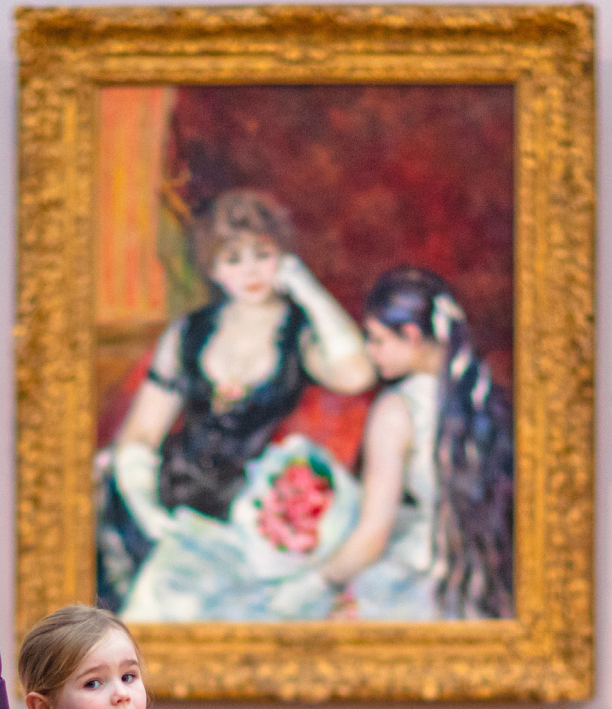
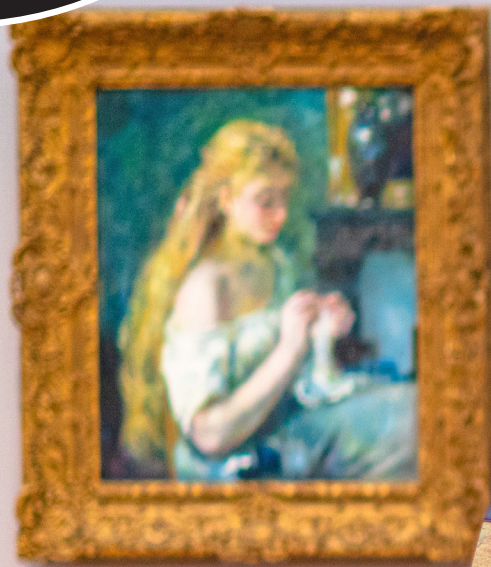

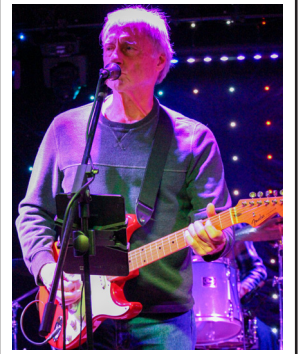

# Crafting the laughs

### Averill Park comedian speaks about life and comedy

**AVERILL PARK** - During the day, Averill Park resident Ed Smyth is restoring old windows in historic homes and buildings, but his true calling is delivering stand-up comedy to his fans around the Capital Region and New York State.

Recently, Smyth was involved in the All Abilities Productions Upstate New York show held in Glens Falls at Aviation Mall. All Abilities Production Upstate New York (AAPUNY), formed in April 2022 as a non-profit organization, provides all-inclusive opportunities for individuals with physical and mental disabilities and abilities to take part in community theater. Its founder, Andrew O’Roarke, who was born with cerebral palsy, discovered that there was a lack of disabled people participating in community theater and created the non-profit to change that.

A member of the organization’s board whom Smyth knew from his acting days invited him to bring his one-man comedy show to the organization’s September fundraiser event. He came back for a Nov. 5 show, but this time he was assisted by his friend Jerry Diamond, to serve as host for the one-hour “coop comedy” show as Smyth called it.

### Comedy and Acting

“Well, like most artists who claim that it’s not as if they look for it rather as if they were compelled to do it, and I’d have to say the same thing. It is that I enjoy doing it,” Smyth said. “And the first rule for me is: if I crack myself up, then I have a good chance that I can crack somebody else up.”

Ever since the second grade when he caused his classmates and teacher to



laugh in class, acting and comedy has been something that Smyth wanted to do as an adult.

“I’ve always enjoyed it. My first time I ever cracked an audience up was in second grade,” Smyth recalled. “When you sat down in a reading circle, you had to read a sentence, and I would do it in a goofy way and I would crack the kids up and I thought this is great.”

Smyth performed his coop (a play on co-op) comedy shows in different formats at The Tram in Utica at the end of September and two comedy festivals: the Finger Lakes Comedy Festival and the Uptown Comedy Festival in Utica. Smyth’s mission with the “Coop Comedy” concept is to sell and market his one-man show to different venues, he said.

Sometimes, Smyth will have special

comedy guests to fill in inbetween comedic sketches to have their moment in the spotlight or he’ll perform the show by himself.

In fact, two of Smyth’s comedy friends, Mike Ciccono and a gentleman who calls himself “Home Visitor” were involved in what Smyth calls his “Kook” shows, where Cicconi would read his loud, wacky poems and “Home Visitor” would play funny songs on a harpsichord.

On stage, Smyth portrays a set of characters that he has added over time to his one-man acts. They include: Ooog, Son of OG 30,000 BC, who’s a primitive caveman; the Ancient Baby Boomer, originally portrayed as Ted the Farmer who came from the dark ages when people only had three TV channels and dialed the phone by hand; Ted the Impressionist who enjoys doing impressions but has no clue how to do stand up comedy; and Broncho Ted, a cowboy who talks about his favorite things from an afternoon cowboy TV show.

The idea behind the “Coop Comedy Show” Smyth said, is that it’s weird, funny, but not cringey, and it’s a show where a young teen won’t be shocked or offended by the creative content. He also calls his comedy absurd, non-offensive and that it tends to be for people who enjoy offbeat, nonsensical humor.

### Window Restorer

Smyth’s main hustle is restoring and revitalizing original wood windows. He enjoys helping to preserve something that was originally designed for a building, in particular, old architecture.

“I always kid with people that I walk into their house, the side benefit is I get to look at old buildings while I’m doing my job.” Smyth said.

Art for all at The Clark

Programs Sarah Hobin. As a part of its mission of accessibility, the Clark offers an annual free Community Day, First Sundays Free program (October through May), and three months of free admission from January through March. These programs are intended to

provide the community with multiple opportunities to attend the museum without any financial barriers.

Throughout the upcoming winter months, the Clark also provides free admission for children ages 3-6 and their families through their unique

Start with Art program. The tours are specifically designed with young children in mind, along with art-making activities and printed guides that will take families into the galleries with prompts for engaging with the art.

Cost and availability barriers often prevent schools from visiting museums. Part of the Clark's plan to combat the problem is their bus reimbursement program, which offsets the cost

of transportation for schools within a day's driving distance. This has encouraged schools as far as Washington, D.C., to visit and is a vital aspect of dismantling the barriers that prevent youth from accessing the arts.

"Opening young children to the experience of visiting museums will, we hope, encourage them to be lifelong museum-goers who appreciate that museums are a place for discovery, exploration, learning and fun," said Hobin.

Through this approach, the museum involves children and adolescents by providing them with the opportunity to take part in art-making workshops and group discussions.

"Connecting people at a young age with the tools to process the world around them and to share their experiences and opinions feels particularly pressing at this time, and we enjoy making the time and space for that type of learning to happen," said Hobin.

Many of the multi-generationally beneficial programs match community-specific needs, such as Meet Me at the Clark on Nov. 20, which is created to serve individuals living with dementia and their caregivers. Rx for Wellbeing studies the therapeutic potential of art to enhance mental health and wellbeing.

"Programs like these were envisioned in response to needs that existed within the community that were not being met elsewhere," said Hobin.

In addition to the tours of their exhibitions, indoor and outdoor activities range

from academic lectures, film screenings, and live music performances to art-making, docent-led tours, and nature hikes.

The scenic Berkshire location of the Clark is where many of the artists in the museum's galleries drew inspiration for their own work. Art and nature go hand-in-hand at the Clark with their newest program, "Sensing Nature at the Clark: From the Outside In."

Throughout November and December, the Clark's calendar is filled with events for all ages to partake in, from Mohican Plant Medicines on Nov. 19 to the New Parents Gallery Tour on Dec. 1, where

caregivers and their infants will have a guided visit in the permanent collection galleries.

"Museum education is not just learning about art, although that can be part of it, but practicing ways to engage with art," said Hobin. "Connecting with culture, identity, and creativity through the arts can have transformative effects on individuals and communities, and we love seeing that happen at all stages of life."

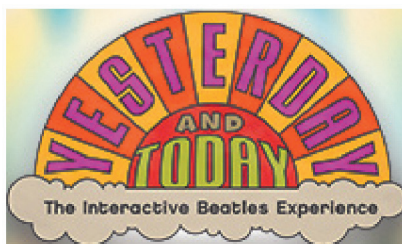

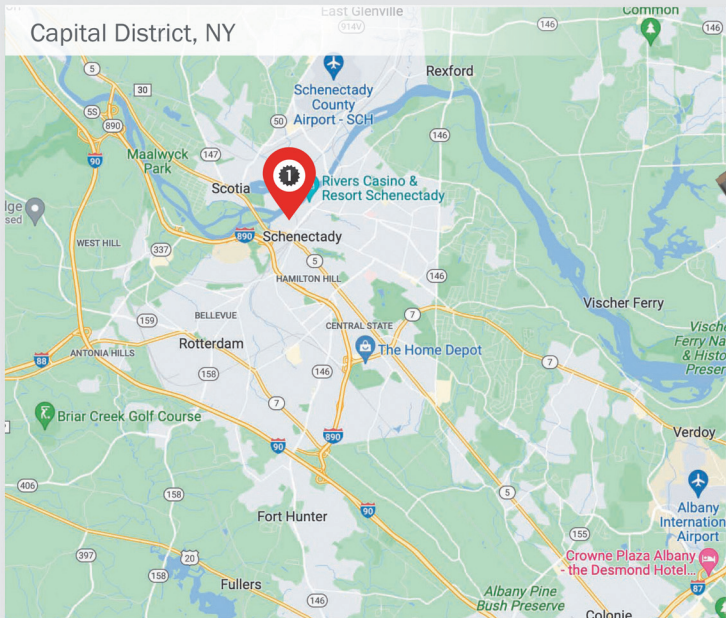

construction was everywhere; hundreds of 19th-century buildings had been torn down to make way for dozens of skyscrapers. She was determined to capture this momentous change in photographs.

**Thomas Hart Benton**

In 1956 Thomas Hart Benton was commissioned by Robert Moses, chairman of the New York Power Authority, to create two murals for the powerhouse building of the state's first hydropower facility in Massena. They feature Jacques Cartier's explorations of the St. Lawrence River and the Gulf of St. Lawrence. Alternately titled The Seneca Discover the French and Jacques Cartier Discovers the Indians, the murals depict the 16th-century encounters from two points of view.

**Stonemason to Sculptor**

When Henry DiSpirito (1898-1995) emigrated from Italy in 1921 he was already a trained stonemason and bricklayer. In Utica, New York, he found work in those trades but longed to devote his life to art. He found his calling in the direct-carving style of sculpture. Most of his subjects were animals or human figures, rendered in fieldstone or wood. He exhibited at the Whitney, MoMA, and SculptureCenter in New York City, and at museums and galleries across the state. Renowned for his sculpture, DiSpirito was an accomplished painter as well. In 1963, he was appointed the first artist-in-residence at Utica College, a position he held until his death. Through his art, DiSpirito developed a deep connection with students and faculty, as well as the larger community in Utica. December 23, 2019 to December 31, 2023.

# Canadian Elvis Tribute Artist in the building

ETA Is November 17th

RAVENA - In the Elvis circles, "ETA" does not mean "Estimated Time of Arrival." It's a privilege of the highest sort to be called an "ETA," that is, Elvis Tribute Artist.

Canadian Sylvain Leduc's ETA for the capital district is Friday, November 17 at 6:30 at the Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk High School on Route 9W in Ravena in a special fundraiser for senior centers in the Ravena and Coxsackie and Rt. 9W corridor.

Sponsored by HEARt Ear Boutique of Glenmont, Ravena and Coxsackie, tickets are available through eventbrite.com or at the door. Advanced-purchased tickets will be seated first.

Don't ever say "impersonator" to Montreal's Elvis Tribute Artist (ETA) Sylvain Leduc.

"It's a full-time job for me," Leduc says.

The singer hasn't immersed himself in some sort of strange idolatry. Like other ETAs, it's out a profound respect that

they put in the hard work that it takes to keep their performances authentic.

"Knowledgeable fans will recognize the real Elvis mannerisms versus what I call the 'Grasshoppers' who are constantly hopping around while performing. Elvis wasn't always like that. When young ETAs ask me for advice, I tell them to listen to Elvis and be authentic to his music."

The artist has traveled to Graceland, Tupelo, The Circle G Ranch and other places where Elvis stayed. Leduc has also become acquainted with Linda Thompson who was Elvis' girlfriend from 1972-1976.

"Being close to someone like that builds up your Elvis-love and helps me to be authentic which I believe is one of my strong points," he says. "I come from a good and

humble family and so this is not an act; it's being myself paying tribute to him."

The surge in the popularity of Elvis amongst the younger generation is not a surprise to Leduc.

"He spans the generations because young people see his charisma through all the attention he's getting in social media," he says. "If they do their research, they'll see he came up from a poor background

and maintained his humility throughout his years. They'll notice his generosity. Who wouldn't be attracted to a man like that?"

Elvis' musical prowess, good looks and incredible voice and blending of blues, country and gospel propelled him to superstardom. The musical convergence has to be displayed and craftily worked into Leduc's performances - each of which are

customized to the audience.

"I like to mix it up while doing the 'concert years' with pop, gospel, spiritual and when appropriate, holiday," he says. "When onstage, you can feel what the audience is looking for and so you work to engage them in those expectations and emotions."

Leduc is well aware that his concerts and shows stir up deep and intimate memories whether that's in larger weekend venues or in smaller assisted living facilities.

"Their staff in these home-for-adults tell me in advance that the residents can only sit through 30-60 minutes and yet I do a full 90-minute set and they love it to the end and it's rewarding to see their faces," he says.

"After the big shows, folks tell me about their memories; about when they first met their spouse, or had their first dance or how it calls to mind a certain time or place in their life," he says. "The joy that it brings to them and what I do and how it helps them forget what's going on in the world or in their world is what brings me joy."
