Students trade hours on call for room and board

This is part one of a two-part series on how local emergency services are thinking "outside of the box" to solve volunteer shortages.

ELSMERE — Elsmere's Fire Company is firing up its volunteer firefighter corp with an innovative "Bunk-In" program. College students live rent free in a fire-company owned local apartment in exchange for volunteer firefighter service. Two bunk-in graduates have already signed on for regular duty at the Fire Company, and Delmar-Bethlehem EMS rents units in the building for its own bunk-in program.

Bunk-in programs are a response to a nationwide shortage



Shoprite now closed in Slingerlands, Colonie

Chain closed its Capital District stores sooner than expected By JOHN MCINTYRE

SLINGERLANDS and COLONIE - The five Shoprite grocery stores in the area closed for good on November 18, which is three weeks earlier than first announced on October 20.

On Thursday, Nov. 16, a visit to the Slingerlands store provided insight as to why they were calling it quits early, there is not much left to sell.

"We are all here and there isn't much to do," said a cashier at the front of the store who did not want to use her name. "Our last day is Saturday, but I really don't know what we will be doing."

Earlier in the week the stores were selling all remaining merchandise for 50 percent off, but in Slingerlands the signs posted that it was now 75 percent off. All parts of the store were empty, except for one freezer and refrigerator unit and the front 20 feet of four isles.

Another front-end worker said that at least the Slingerland store has registers at the front.

"At the other stores, they took out most of the cash registers," He said. "Here we at least have checkouts."

The employees said that they were told that they would be paid through the second week in January, but most of them did not know where they were going from there.

"We had meetings with our bosses and they told us about closing early, so that changes a few things for me," one worker said.

Approximately 500 people are employed at the five locations. The workers are unionized with United Food and Commercial Workers Local 1262, which represents store clerks

and workers at the front of the store, and Local 1, which represents jobs like meat cutters and other workers who are in the back.

The chain opened its stores in the Capital District just over 10 years ago with big fanfare and also with big tax breaks from State, County and local Industrial Development Authorities.

In the cases of the Slingerland and Colonie stores, each project received over \$1 million in mortgage and sale tax relief and Vista Technology Park, which houses the Slingerlands store also received County Legislature grant money for roads and parking lots.

The Albany, Slingerlands and Colonie stores opened in 2012 and 2013 after opening its first store in the area in 2011 in Niskayuna's St John's Plaza.

During the three-year period 2011-2013 Shoprite quickly established four



stores. The fifth store was built and opened in North Greenbush in 2017.

"This is a multi-state corporation making a decision to pull out of the Capital District, I am glad we have a grocery store across the street," Bethlehem Town Supervisor David Vanluven said after the initial announcement. "There are lots of opportunities in town for employment. It is a great place to work. We hope the employees stay here."

There has been no announcement of a possible suitor to buy the local stores and Wegmans and Kroegers have both said they are not going to acquire the properties.

"We stand ready to

Ruck March for charity on Veterans Day

Local distillery honors army medics with product's proceeds **BY JOHN McINTYRE** *mcintyrej@spotlightnews.com*

VOORHEESVILLE - A local distillery sponsored a Veteran's Day Ruck March on Saturday, November 11 along the Albany County Helderberg-Hudson Rail Trail and to collect donations for local food pantries across the Capital District.

The event, sponsored by New Scotland Spirits, commenced at the Voorheesville's American Legion Post 1493 and proceeded 0.3 miles down Voorheesville Avenue, over the railroad tracks, to the intersection with the Rail Trail.

Participants then marched 3.1 miles down the Rail Trail—past the historic Hilton Barn—to the intersection of Font Grove Road. There, ruck marchers "about faced" and headed back to the Legion, where finishers were greeted with a catered after-party to commend their performances and collect all comestibles intended for donation.

What's a "Ruck March"

you may ask? The ruck march is a staple of military training—a test of physical ability and mental stability. The objective is simple: get from point A to point B with all the essentials on your back in a "ruck sack" weighing between 35 and 85 lbs.

"In our case, the "essentials" are any groceries and supplies (food, toiletries, etc.) that participants wish to donate after shouldering the load down and back the Albany County Rail Trail," according to the event's website.

"Like every single veteran in every single city in every single state, I cringe when people thank me for my service," said Jesse Sommer, a former U.S. Army paratrooper and founder of Albany Countybased New Scotland Spirits. "The gratitude doesn't fit. Like, yeah I saw some (stuff). But I also made it home, got paid well, traveled to some places, made some friends. I'd rather people thank me for my belief in Americait's why I joined in the first place. Assembling people who share that belief is why we do this."

The company is also donating proceeds from one of its products to charity in honor of military medics. New Scotland Spirits donates 68% of all profits from every sale of a bottle of "68W" to the Hidden Battles Foundation, which specializes in the treatment of alcoholism in veterans and first responders.

"68W is the phonetic MOS [military occupational specialty] code for the Army Combat Medic. Medics are an indispensable force on the battlefield and often the difference between being blessed to celebrate Veterans Day instead of being remembered on Memorial Day," Sommer said in an interview published in True Brew magazine.

Dozens of marchers turned out for the event this year. The company plans to continue the event each year on Veterans Day.

Nearly a hundred people participated in last year's ruck march, in the process raising \$2,950 for the Boot Campaign. "We also donated \$1,000 to the Hidden Battles Foundation and 1,200 pounds of nonperishables [to the Food Pantries for the Capital District]," Sommer said, "and every single one of those pounds was schlepped on our backs."

Building design reaches next phase

At the November board meeting, architects from Ashley McGraw presented the completed schematic design outlining proposed updates to the library's 50-year-old building. Renderings show a dramatic new exterior that complements the existing architectural details, as well as a vibrant and exciting space for children and teens. The proposal includes expanded meeting and quiet study spaces, as well as ample room for the library's traditional collection. In addition to these improvements, the schematic design also addresses components of the aging building, such as asbestos abatement and the demolition of the mezzanine level.

With the completion of the schematic design phase, the library begins now to look at costs and other logistics to be put



providing key contacts and guidance. Dennis Daugherty was our consultant who was present during the lift, providing years of experience to the project.

Thanks also to everyone we dealt with at the Port of Albany who have been very supportive and patient as we tried to find a workable and affordable removal plan. Over the last couple of years, there were a number of scenarios we explored to remove the locomotives. Dagen and Flach always made themselves available to come out and offer their ideas. They took a real interest in the project and I am very happy they were part of the removal process. Their expertise was needed on November 2nd and they came through for us.

The next stop is relocating the locomotives to the Danbury Railway Museum where they will be restored and can tell the story of how GE and American Locomotive Company of Schenectady combined their resources to make electric trains possible for use into New York City's Grand Central Terminal. 



of firefighters and EMS personnel.

According to a 2019 survey conducted by the New York State Emergency Medical Services Council, 52 percent of agencies with volunteer EMS responders are moderately or severely impacted by volunteer staffing shortages, and 40 percent of agencies surveyed reported that their certified volunteers were down by 11 percent over the last 3 years.

The decline is due, in part, to fewer new volunteers coupled with an increased demand for services.

"We average 350-450 fire incidents annually," said Fire Company 2d Assistant Chief Frank Wickham. "With more development comes more need for fire services."

Elsmere Fire Company Bunk-In Program

The bunkins benefit the company, the students and the taxpayers.

"It's a win-win for everyone," said Elsmere Fire Chief Mark Futia.

Elsmere's bunk-in program, spearheaded by Elsmere Fire Company Treasurer and Past President John Murphy.

"It has provided more manpower hours without having to get taxpayer money," Murphy said.

"The program is extremely prudent for the taxpayer because we do it all by fundraising and donations," said Elsmere Fire Commissioner Joe Catalano. "The taxpayers never spent money for this."

The fire company was contemplating how to attract more volunteers to its all-volunteer department when, in 2018, it saw an opportunity in a dilapidated three-unit apartment building on sale right next door to its West Poplar Drive station. In exchange for providing up to 20 hours weekly of fire service, each bunk-in student would get a bedroom in a twobedroom fully furnished unit rent free for the school year.

Murphy said the Ridge Road apartment building, which the Fire Department bought that year, cost \$350,000 and has \$208,000 remaining on its 20-year mortgage. The fire company used money raised by company members over the years from conventions and "a lot of fish fries" to buy the building, said Murphy.

"We wouldn't have searched for a multi-unit building elsewhere, but when it became available and bathrooms worth about \$25,000-\$30,000. Community contractors also pitched in with service discounts.

According to Murphy, building operating costs for mortgage, water, utilities and cable total about \$22,000 annually.

"We do the snow removal and lawn care ourselves," he said.

To offset those costs, the fire department rented two of the three apartments for \$1,300/month to DBEMS for its own bunk-in program.

The company set aside a capital reserve fund for major repairs, and an additional wish list for items like central air conditioning.

"But central air would mean running fish fries from now until kingdom come to pay for it,"

said Murphy. In mid-2019, the first bunkins moved in. COVID delayed the program, but it picked up again in 2021 when the fire department re-started accepting applications.

This school year, two students live in a single unit, with a third expected to move into a recently added bedroom in January. Six other students — men and women — have participated in the bunk-in program since its inception. One former bunkin student is now an Elsmere Fire Company lieutenant and another also joined up.

To join the fire department bunk-in program, an applicant must meet rigorous requirements, including being at least 18 years old, a trained volunteer firefighter, a member of a fire department outside of Albany County and a fulltime student in a college in Albany or adjacent county. Upon acceptance, the bunkin student must provide up to 20 hours of assigned duty service, possibly including weekend duty. During duty hours, a bunkin student must be awake, in uniform, and perform

assigned tasks.

In addition, the bunk-in student must be generally available to respond to fire/ emergency calls whether or not on duty, maintain a sufficient GPA to remain enrolled as a full-time student and attend EMT training.

The students save the cost of a dorm room and the company gets multiple benefits in return.

"It gives us young, qualified individuals to support our response during the day when the rest of us are at work," Murphy said.

In addition, because they live next door to the fire department, "we have people right there ready to go," Murphy added.

Wickham further explained that the bunk-ins shorten the time it takes to get to a call, which is critical.

"A fire sometimes doubles in 30 seconds," Wickham explained, "so every minute counts in getting there and now we have people right here."

"The students are 'so eager' and 'Johnny on the spot," said Catalano. "They get right out of bed and are right there. They don't have to first go to the bathroom like us older firefighters because you don't know how long a call will be."

Because the bunk-in students are already trained firefighters with a home fire department, they often bring their personal firefighter gear with them. That gear would otherwise cost the department between \$5,000-\$6,000. Current Fire Company President Brendan Boyle said it's a "great symbiotic relationship among our department, their home department and the students."

Boyle added that the company also learns more about firefighting techniques.

"We are openminded about how we do firefighting," he said. "It's great to have someone else's point of view because they are coming from another department.

The bunk-ins add value in other ways.

"They integrate themselves into other aspects of fire prevention, social events, memorial services and work details," said Wickham.

They also serve an important function by volunteering for the fire department's explorer program that reaches 12-17 year olds and teaches them about fire fighting.

"The explorer kids relate very well to the 18-to-21-year-olds [bunk-ins] and see from them what it means to adhere to a chain of command, to have commitment and seriousness,"Wickham said.

"These kids are focused. They love firefighting and it affords them the opportunity to maintain a connection to the fire service," said Murphy. "Most of them even do more than the required 20 hours and if an alarm goes off at 2 a.m., they respond."

Boyle confirmed that there have been no typical

college issues with the bunk-ins.

"The quality of people we are bringing in are class A interior firefighters," he said. "They have a higher standard for themselves, are great kids with excellent hearts and hard workers." They even help with the mowing.

Still, Murphy said, "We tell them their school work is their No. 1 priority." To help the bunk-in students manage their firefighter obligations with school, "we are flexible about which hours they work and also about schedules around exam times," said Murphy. "We tell them to bring their laptops with them because they are 20 hours in the firehouse."

DBEMS Bunk-Ins Like the fire department, DBEMS has seen an increasing number of calls. In 2022, it received 4,318 calls, and answered 1,410 of them with 55 volunteers, totaling 15,000 volunteer responder hours. Unlike the fire department, ambulance services are provided by paid EMTs during the day through a partnership with the Albany County Sheriff's office EMS unit. However, from 6 p.m -6 a.m., DBEMS relies on volunteers.

DBEMS Executive Director and Chief Steve Kroll said they continually need new volunteers.

"We are looking to increase the number of volunteers so we can increase service to the community," he said and announced that a third

we jumped on it because it was right next door to the firehouse," he said.

Murphy said at the time of purchase, the building was falling into disrepair. Department members put both money and "sweat equity" into it.

"We have a good pool of firefighters who are plumbers, electricians so we do a lot of the work ourselves, and they are passionate about it," said Catalano.

Wickham said that Lowe's in Glenmont contributed kitchens

ambulance crew is being added on Mondays.

To recruit more volunteers, DBEMS rented two of the three units in the fire company's "bunk-in building" to offer the same free rent benefit to college students, but in exchange for emergency medical services.

"It's really nice that the fire department chose to partner with us," said Kroll.

DBEMS spends about \$30,000 of its \$2 million annual budget to pay for the bunk-ins' rent and utilities. Approximately 75 percent of DBEMS' budget comes from insurance payments, 20 percent from taxpayer money and five percent community donations. Kroll said that the bunk-in program saves money because it would cost \$130,000 to add another crew if volunteers were not available.

DBEMS bunkin applicants must meet qualifications set by DBEMS. Those requirements include being at least 19 years old, holding and maintaining a New York State EMT certification, attending an area college/university full time, meeting DBEMS drive requirements, having CEVO or EVOC training and committing for the school year and possibly summers.

Once on board, students are required to ride 18 scheduled hours per week in three 12-hour shifts between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m. Kroll clarified that did not mean 18 hours in the ambulance. They just have to be available in the ambulance station so they are permitted to sleep or study during the 12 hour shift. Now in its third year

with four bunk-in students, DBEMS has hosted four other bunk-in students.

Kroll reported that there have been no issues with the bunk-in students. "We have high standards and expect a lot from them and they have all met those standards," Kroll added.

"Our bunk-in liaison checks in on them regularly to make sure everything is OK," said Kroll. "The only kind of issue we have had is a leaky pipe."

Bunk-In Program Is A Success Story at Both Departments

"The program has been extraordinarily well received by everyone in the community," said Kroll. Kroll described the bunk-in students as "great volunteers who provide exceptional care and bring youth and enthusiasm to our ambulance squad." affordable for them." "To get their age group in here makes our organization better," said DBEMS bunk-in program coordinator Lt. Robert Gehrer.

"We have meetings and try to come up with potential negatives, but haven't so far," said Murphy. "Instead, we are constantly thinking about ways to add manpower and providing the very best fire protection services to our residents, and we are not afraid of thinking outside of the box."

Murphy said the only hard part is for "us older fire department members to figure out how to reach out to 17-to-19-year-olds so they can learn about the program."

"We are learning about social media," he admitted and noted that the department would love to recruit candidates with more than fire fighting abilities, such as web design, social media and even cooking skills.

Both DBEMS and the Elsmere Fire Company attributed the program's success to the number of local colleges and universities that provide a large and strong pool of candidates.

Kroll said, "we get plenty of applications because we have more colleges and universities here than the average place and two paramedic programs, with many people coming to the capital region seeking careers in health care."

Kroll also said that although DBEMS recruits on social media and on college campuses, DBEMS' best recruiters are its own bunk-in students.

"One of our bunk-in students was the best recruiting tool we ever had, and now a couple of her friends are in the program this year," he said.

"We will absolutely keep this program," said Kroll. "We count on these hours to provide care to the community. ... If the fire department had another bedroom available, we would rent it."

As for the fire department, "we look to the day we can have 5-6 firefighters in the [bunkin] building, which is a full crew," said Murphy. "I really want to be a dreamer, maybe someday we could have a larger program coordinated throughout the town's fire departments."

"I wish this program was available when I was in college. It's fantastic." said Boyle.

Next week, meet the young firefighters and EMTs who come to the community's and local emergency services' rescue.

According to reports, when police did a DMV check of Elizabeth A. Dolder deputies found she had an outstanding warrant from the City of Schenectady. She was taken into custody and transported to meet officers from that department.

This was not the first time she was in our blotter recently. On Thursday, Oct. 26, Sheriff's Investigators arrested a female, identified as Elizabeth A. Dolder,

who was in possession of two fraudulent personal checks and a fraudulent out-of-state license in the Town of Colonie on October 19.

Dolder is accused of going into multiple banks and cashing checks belonging to victims across the Capital District. She is part of a larger investigation which includes individuals stealing checks from residential mailboxes throughout the Capital Region. The individuals would wash the checks and enter fraudulent information with the intent to cash the checks while defrauding the victims.

Dolder was charged with four counts of criminal possession of a forged instrument in the second degree, a felony, and two counts of criminal possession of stolen property in the fifth degree, two counts of unlawful possession of personal identification in the third degree, two counts criminal impersonation in the second degree and two counts of petit larceny, all misdemeanors.

Dolder was arraigned at the New Scotland Town Court for the Town of Colonie Court and was released on her own recognizance at that time.



Grassroot Givers: where giving grows

Organization connects those with an abundance of resources to those in need

ALBANY — What was born out of a tragedy, has turned into a way to change lives with every act of kindness. For almost 15 years, the non-profit organization Grassroot

Givers has been working hands-on with communities in need.

The Grassroot Givers story began in 2009 when co-founders and co-directors Roberta Sandler and Mary Partridge-Brown helped their first family, who lost everything in a house fire. A request for assistance was met with an overwhelming community response.

"That call to action went out, and people filled it, and then some," said Stacey Erwell, the community outreach and program development coordinator. "They had an

abundance of beautiful items to share with the family. They had more than they could use, so they started sharing with organizations to fulfill a bigger need within the community."

"It started off as a small operation run out of a barn, but the need just kept expanding, and people knew that Mary and Roberta were the resources to contact," said Erwell. "That's the mission of Grassroot Givers – to connect the needs of the community with the individuals with the resources to share."

Grassroot Givers work centers on three major programs: clothing, home essentials and literature accessibility. They help families transition from shelters into apartments, providing them with everything from pots and pans to measuring cups and coffee pots. Individuals are connected with the necessities that "fill their home and make a home feel like a home," said Erwell.

Yasmine, a single mother who works two jobs and attends school to support her



5- and 8-year-old, said, "I wouldn't be able to make ends meet without Grassroot Givers."

In addition to being provided with kitchen and bedroom necessities, "we even have children's books stacked next to our bathtub," she said. "All things to make our house a home."

"Mary felt there should be a book in the hand of every child," said Erwell. "She's passionate about building home libraries for children."

"I love reading! It's exciting to get a book and keep it!" said a fifth-grader who benefited from one of the Grassroot Givers book programs. Their book drives bring an estimated 60,000 books a year into the hands of members of the community.

Requests pour in from all across the Capital Region. There are an estimated 9,200 requests for clothing a year.

"That demonstrates a real need within our community – things we take for granted every day," said Erwell. "With the newly arrived asylum-seekers, the need has expanded so much."

"We are currently working with the homeless population, families living on a fixed income, refugees, and the newly arriving asylum-seekers that have relocated to the Capital District," said Partridge-Brown. "In addition to our Albany neighborhood families living in poverty, we now also see up to 40 people of all nationalities and languages outside of our door every day, looking for basics such as warm clothing, pots and pans, and books in their native language."

Grassroot Givers has seen a dramatic increase in the need for basic essentials. From personal care kits, canned food drives, hand-knit items, and kitchen basics to towels and essential toiletries, Grassroot Givers is responding to needs from their partner organizations, such as RISSE, USCRI, and Healthy Alliance.

"Our community is our community," said Erwell. "Anyone in need deserves the assistance that they need."

November signals the Month of Simple Giving for Grassroot Givers, a tradition that has evolved since its origin. It began with a Day of Simple Giving in 2009, an event designed as a way for the community to come together for their neighbors. The event continued to progress from length to

location, accommodating the needs of the COVID-19 pandemic by offering at-home projects.

In 2022, the event was changed to a monthlong initiative, which is when Erwell joined. Initially planning to only volunteer for one month, she never left.

"I just loved everything about the organization and knew it was a place that I wanted to stay," she said.

Sixty different groups that range from sporting teams, family and friends,

businesses, and women's clubs work on projects for the Month of Simple Giving. The projects are distributed throughout the Capital Region and are part of their mission of "giving with dignity."

"Whether it's a warm blanket, a like-new story book to read in bed, or a winter coat, it all contributes to a sense of feeling valued and contributes to a sense of health and wellbeing," said Sandler.

Grassroot Givers want the recipient to feel a sense of worth as they're receiving the item. "It's given as a gift," explained Erwell. These gifts have the essential aim of empowering the affected communities to uplift their lives.

"Giving with dignity has always been at the heart of our mission," said Partridge-Brown. "When we see people who are in vulnerable situations and are struggling to make ends meet, it is humbling to know that by making the simple connection with people who have beautiful resources to share."

"Everyone needs to know that every bit of kindness helps. Working together, we're able to accomplish wonderful, big things. It can be a simple project, but it can be a lifeline to a family in need," said Erwell. "It doesn't take much to help others. We all have such an abundance. If we think about how we can share that, we're able to help and uplift our neighbors."

for the artist community through teaching, exhibitions, murals, plein air painting meet-ups, and her current artist residency at Arlene's which she has been at for a year.

Huang said the residency presents a unique opportunity to focus on her art and connect with fellow artists and the local art community. It allows her to surround herself in a supportive environment and provides a dedicated studio space and access to a wide range of art supplies. She said she is grateful to Arlene's for generously providing the space and resources that allow her to experiment, develop her art, and bring her creations to her community.

What does the exhibit include?

The subjects of "People and Places" include landscapes, urban scapes, rural areas and small

moments in everyday life in Huang's preferred media of watercolor and ink.

Huang's current sketches reflect her exploration of Upstate New York, her new home. Huang was born in Indonesia and spent over a decade studying and working on art in Taiwan before coming to the United States and settling in Ballston Lake, where she runs her art studio.

They feature Jacques Cartier's explorations of the St. Lawrence River and the Gulf of St. Lawrence. Alternately titled The Seneca Discover the French and Jacques Cartier Discovers the Indians, the murals depict the 16th-century encounters from two points of view.

Stonemason to Sculptor

When Henry DiSpirito (1898–1995) emigrated from Italy in 1921 he was already a trained stonemason and bricklayer. In Utica, New York, he found work in those trades but longed to devote his life to art. He found his calling in the direct-carving style of sculpture. Most of his subjects were animals or human figures, rendered in fieldstone or wood. He exhibited at the Whitney, MoMA, and SculptureCenter in New York City, and at museums and galleries across the state. Renowned for his sculpture, DiSpirito was an accomplished painter as well. In 1963, he was appointed the first artist-in-residence at Utica College, a position he held until his death. 

Simplify your feast by slow cooking your Thanksgiving turkey

ood features prominently in many holiday celebrations, but perhaps no holiday is more closely associated with eating than Thanksgiving. In fact, Thanksgiving and food are so closely connected that many people lovingly refer to the holiday as "Turkey Day," which is an homage to the popular main course that finds its way to millions of Thanksgiving dinner tables across the country each year.

Side dishes abound on Thanksgiving dinner tables, but turkey still takes center stage. That reality can put some pressure on hosts tasked with preparing the meal for their family and friends. Unlike some other dishes that require a laundry list of ingredients and lots of prep work, turkey is a relatively hands-off main course. However, home cooks know a dried out turkey is not on anyone's holiday wish list. Slow cooking can help to avoid such a result. This recipe for "Holiday Turkey," courtesy Andrew Schloss' "Cooking Slow" (Chronicle Books), calls for slow cooking the bird. Such an approach should

result in a delicious and mouth-watering main course that satisfies anyone who's anxious to sit down at the Thanksgiving dinner table this year.

Holiday Turkey

- Makes 15 servings fresh turkey, about 15 pounds,
- preferably free-range
- tablespoon olive oil
- quart apple cider

- teaspoons dried poultry seasoning Coarse sea salt & freshly ground black pepper

Remove the giblets from the turkey and discard (or save for another use). Rinse the turkey inside and out and pat dry with paper towels. Rub it all over with salt and pepper. Refrigerate, uncovered, for at least 12 hours and up to 24 hours. During that time, the surface of the turkey will become

visibly dry and the skin will tighten; this encourages a nice crisp skin on the finished bird. Remove the turkey from the refrigerator 1 hour before you plan to start roasting. Preheat the oven to 450 F.

Put the turkey on a rack set in a large, flameproof roasting pan. Drizzle the oil over the top. Roast for 1 hour. Reduce the oven temperature to 175 F. Pour the

cider into the roasting pan and sprinkle the poultry seasoning in the liquid. Continue roasting until an instant-read thermometer inserted into

the thickest part of a thigh (but not touching bone) registers to 170 F.

Transfer the turkey to a carving board, tent loosely with aluminum foil, and let rest for about 15 minutes (see tip). Meanwhile, skim the fat from the surface of the liquid in the pan. Put the roasting pan over two burners and bring the pan drippings to a boil over high heat. Cook until the juices reduce and thicken slightly, enough to coat a spoon, about 10 minutes. Taste for seasoning. Carve the turkey and serve with cider pan juices.

Resting tip: Slow-roasted meats need far less resting time (pretty much none) than those that are traditionally roasted. The reason for resting meat that has been roasted at a high temperature is to allow juices that have collected

in the cooler center time to migrate back into the dryer (hotter) exterior sections after it comes out of the oven. Because slow-roasted meats are cooked evenly and a temperature that keeps most of the juices in place, a resting period is largely unnecessary. A brief resting time does allow the meat to become a little firmer as it cools, making it easier to carve







Avoid foodborne illness with safe food preparation

Arious behaviors are integral to maintaining personal health. While exercise and eating healthy foods is one of them, safe cooking is a major component as well.

The World Health Organization reports that each year unsafe food causes 600 million cases of foodborne diseases and 420,000 deaths. Eating unsafe food is a major problem in developing nations, but also poses a threat closer to home. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates 48 million people get sick, 1,280,000 are hospitalized, and 3,000 die from foodborne diseases each year in the United States.

Many different microorganisms can be blamed for causing foodborne illnesses in people. B. cerus food poisoning, botulism, campylobacteriosis, cyclosporiasis, listeriosis, and E.coli infection are some of the more common diagnoses. Symptoms may range from fever to muscle aches to diarrhea to stomach cramps.

Though not every foodborne disease can be prevented, diligence on the part of individuals when they handle and cook food can significantly reduce the risk of experiencing a foodborne illness. Adhering to the guidelines of Clean, Separate, Cook and Chill can keep people safe. The following are some additional ways to prevent foodborne pathogens from making



others sick, courtesy of the Food and Drug Administration and the United States Department of Agriculture.

Clean

Cleanliness is vital to avoiding foodborne illnesses. Hands should be washed before and after handling food for 20 seconds with warm, soapy water. Thoroughly wash any surfaces that come in contact with foods, particularly raw meat, poultry, fish, and eggs. Surfaces should include cutting boards and counters.

Separate

Do not cross-contaminate. Keep raw food separate from cooked foods. Also, do not use the same utensil to handle raw foods and cooked ones. Wash utensils and food preparation dishes promptly, and refrain from using marinade on cooked food if it has been in contact with raw meats.

Another way to avoid crosscontamination is to pack meat, eggs, and poultry separate from raw produce and

other foods that will not be cooked. This way bacteria cannot easily be transferred, even if items are in packages.

Cook

A food thermometer is a person's best asset against foodborne illnesses. Always cook food to the recommended internal minimum temperature, which can help kill any pathogens in the food. Rather than judging doneness by sight alone, use a thermometer to prove that the food is thoroughly cooked. In addition, foods that are supposed to be served hot should remain hot. When serving a buffet, consider using chafing dishes to keep foods at or above 140 F.

Chill

Cold foods need to be refrigerated to prevent spoilage. Do not leave food out of the refrigerator for more than two hours, or one hour if it is outdoors when the temperature is 90 F or hotter. Consider spreading foods thinly when packaging to help them chill down faster and later defrost more readily when leftovers will be used. Cold foods should be held at or below 40 F.

Safe food handling, cleaning and cooking reduces the risk for foodborne illnesses.


