Local college bunk-in students get emergency services experience and satisfaction plus free rent

When one door closes another one opens

Delaware Plaza chooses not to renew lease for Bruegger's Bagels location, but new eatery may move in

DELMAR – Bruegger's Bagels, a 31-year mainstay at Delmar's Delaware Plaza, is permanently shutting its doors on Nov. 28, just two days shy of its lease expiration date. Delaware Plaza Managing Director Debbie Nolan Murray said Delaware Plaza decided not to renew Bruegger's lease and instead "go in a different direction."

Nolan Murray said it was "a tough question, but the timing was right and we had other local businesses reach out to us."

Delaware Plaza is currently

negotiating a lease with a potential new tenant. Although vacant storefronts exist at Delaware Plaza, Nolan Murray said they opted to focus on re-leasing the Bruegger's space because "it is a key space for us that is very visible on Delaware Avenue." She said that part of having a new company open business in the plaza is the "visibility, the easy access and the adjacent parking."

She also said, "Bruegger's has changed quite a bit. It originally opened in Burlington, Vt., and had a local feel." However, she said "since moving its headquarters to Texas, it is not the same rapport we had over the years because their business model has changed."

She added that the company does not have a presence in the community anymore.

Nolan Murray said that although Delaware Plaza notified Bruegger's about six months ago that its lease would not

"With a new business, it gives us the opportunity to do some renovations on that corner and have a new store front," Nolan Murray said.

One employee at Bruegger's said the store's 12-13 employees were told

they would be offered employment at Bruegger's 1770 Central Ave. location in Albany.

Some community members have voiced their disappointment to Nolan Murray that Bruegger's is closing.

"People have told me that Bruegger's has been a staple for so long, it's convenient, easy and they can run in and get their bagels" she said. "It also appeared there was also a misperception that this was about raising their rent, which it is not." Instead, "it was an overall business decision for our community and the shopping center to bring something new to the business community here and we believe this will be a real boost for our community," Nolan Murray said.

Over the past couple of years, Bruegger's has closed two other Capital Region stores – one in Stuyvesant Plaza in Albany and one in Newton Plaza in Loudonville after long tenures. The stores closed after having occupied those spaces for 37 and 30 years, respectively.

Janet Kaplan, Vice President, Real Estate at Stuyvesant Plaza said in 2021, Stuyvesant Plaza, like Delaware Plaza, had chosen not to renew Bruegger's lease when it expired. She said the store had gone into bankruptcy around 2017 and was later bought by another company, but the new company was "not putting any money into the store," "wasn't keeping it up" and "it looked awful." In June 2021, Bruegger's lease with Stuyvesant Plaza expired and the Plaza opted to lease the space to Uncommon Grounds instead.

Although Nolan Murray would not identify the potential new tenant, she hinted that if the lease negotiation is successful, Delmar will not be without a place to get bagels. She said she expects to be able to announce the new tenant's identity within the next couple of weeks.

Bruegger's did not respond to a request for comment by the time of publication of this article.

Little libraries for all kinds of readers

Local free libraries let readers of all ages choose books to keep and share

COLONIE AND DELMAR – Dozens of small structures resembling mailboxes have popped up like spring daffodils along roads in Capital District villages, towns and cities. They are called Little Free Libraries (LFL's). Their purpose is to build community and to promote literacy and love of reading in convenient locations 24 hours a day.

Filled with mostly donated books, Little Free Library's motto is "Take a book. Share a book." Books are always free. Patrons of any age may take home any books they wish and keep the ones they want to own. They are urged, but never required, to bring back favorite books to share with others. Studies indicate that impoverished children often have no books at all in their homes, which negatively impacts scholastic achievement. Little Free Libraries gives them the chance to start building their own home libraries, a key component of literacy development.

One Delmar resident remarked, "It gives me great pleasure to share my books with others, free space on my bookshelves, and discover new ones to take their place."

No two Little Free Libraries are exactly alike. For example, a library on Mosher Road in Delmar has a particular theme: diversity. The library was built in 2021 by Greg Hopper and his then 9-year-old son, Evan. Hopper's wife, Laura DiBetta, has stocked and maintained the library ever since. She is passionate about combating racism and prejudice by means of the diversity of the books in the LFL on the edge of her lawn.

All the books were either written by authors or feature characters from a wide variety of cultures, countries and backgrounds. Recently, she put out books for both children and adults celebrating Native American Heritage Month. Books by well known Native American authors such as Louise Erdrich and Leslie Marmon Silko were plentiful. Also displayed were books for young people featuring children from various Indian tribes explaining their various customs and history in both word and colorful pictures. Throughout the year, books about holidays such as Diwali, Juneteenth, Passover, Holi, Chanukah, Russian Easter and more crowd the shelves and are soon plucked by eager readers.

The content of these books often complement units studied in schools.

"We want everyone who comes to our Little Free Library to feel at home here and to know they belong," DiBetta said, smiling. "We want to make sure our readers go into the world and interact comfortably with all kinds of people."

Her goal: developing understanding through diverse books.

Reading enthusiasts typically obtain desired books from town or city libraries or bookstores, but this is not necessarily the case in Colonie.

Book lovers in this town can take out and donate books at the Little Free Library (LFL), located at the Crossings, a park off Albany Shaker Road.

Located near the Ciccotti Center, the Little Free Library is continually stocked and maintained by a teen advisory group that meets at the nearby William K. Sanford Library.



The group is run by librarian Elissa Valente, head of programming and outreach.

She raved about the dedication, talent and enthusiasm of the teens working on this project. When the old Little Free Library fell into disrepair, teenager Luke Bomba decided to build a beautiful new replacement as his Eagle Scout project.

Overstock at the

Sanford Library, as well as donations from town residents, fill the shelves to bursting. Avid readers can find a wide variety of both fiction and nonfiction books appealing to both children and adults.

Books deemed not useful are recycled. Teenagers are heavily involved with most aspects of the library's upkeep.

"It's such rewarding work for teens, who yearn to work on a meaningful project like this that benefits the entire community," Valente said.

Many segments of Colonie's population patronize the Little Free Library when they visit the Crossings, including adults, families with young children, teenagers, and elderly residents, many of whom live at the Beltrone, a nearby senior residence. Young children particularly appreciate the LFL, in part because they can choose the books they like and take them home to keep if they wish.

On a recent visit, a spunky 7-year-old raced to the LFL ahead of her mother. She flung open the door, carefully perused the contents, and grabbed a Pinkalicious book, popular with first and second graders and preschoolers. Jumping up and down, she waved the book in the air, shouting, "PINKALICIOUS! I can read it all by myself! I can read it to my little sister! My daddy will be so proud!"

St. Thomas Church in Delmar is probably the only one in the Capital District with two beautiful

small wooden structures on the grounds that are meticulously shaped like the church itself. Both are Little Free Libraries maintained by the church, one on the Delaware Avenue side of the church and the other on Adams Street on the opposite side. Pastor Rick Lesser mentioned that the idea for the Little Free Library came from members of the parish who saw an opportunity to provide the greater Bethlehem community an enriching gift.

"We are delighted that books come and go. There are so many good folks here who want to do good with and for others," he said.

The libraries were built by congregant Rick Barnes, a talented teen skilled in woodworking who now attends college.

"This replica of our church lets us know we are all one family, and we need to be kind to one

another," said Mary Ann Hospidor, youth minister of the church who is now in charge of the library. "Our Little Free Library reinforces the idea that we are good people."

Books for all ages, many with religious or ethical themes, fill the library, including such books as

"Chicken Soup for the Soul," "The Story of Christmas," and "My First Book of Prayers." Hospidor changes the selection as often as necessary. All are available to any passerby who wants to read them.

Parishioners entering the church mentioned that they were delighted with their Little Free Library and that they often donate books that inspired them or brought them peace and joy. One woman, who declined to be identified, said she was fiercely proud of the library.

"Not only does it help children practice their reading, but they gain some understanding of God's presence in their lives," she said.

The library will be closed all day Friday, Dec. 1, for staff training.





who are firefighters in their home fire district, exchange up to 20 hours of firefighting services each week for free housing in an apartment building in Delmar owned by the Fire Company.

Four DBEMS bunk-in college student volunteers live in two of the three units in the Fire Company's multi-unit building. They provide three weekly 12hour shifts of emergency medical services from 6 p.m.-6 a.m.

The Fire Company and DBEMS say they tap into the Capital Region's huge pool of college and university students.

"Health care is a growing field, and emergency services is a point of entry for many talented young people, said Steve Kroll, DBEMS executive director and chief. "Students can get training for careers, and go on to be EMTs, doctors, nurses, microbiologists and other



great things in health care."

Both entities attract talented and committed young men and women to help solve a volunteer crisis felt by emergency service providers nationwide.

Knowing who these students are and why they choose to spend their time chasing fires and riding ambulances may help local emergency services to continue to ease their staffing shortages.

Free rent is a significant factor that makes the program attractive.

"I met one bunk-in's mother when he was moving out, and she was so thankful for the program and said her son couldn't have afforded to do what he wanted to do without the program," said current Fire Company President Brendan Boyle. But, as all the bunk-ins will tell you, money isn't everything.

Trailblazing young firefighters

Hayden Kothe and Brendan Cooper are fire department bunk-in roommates.

Kothe, 19, an HVCC freshman already has his own business building and restoring classic cars. He is a fourth generation firefighter raised in

Shokan, N.Y. His mother, once a paid firefighter with the City of Kingston, was seriously injured on the job when her foot was caught in a fire engine ladder. After having her foot and lower leg amputated, she retired from the department.

"She always reminds me to be careful on the ladder truck," said Kothe, who is undeterred by her accident.

Cooper, 20, is a University at Albany sophomore, who is also a U.S. Army reservist and majoring in an emergency preparedness program

Cooper became a firefighter at age 16 in Pleasantville, N.Y. Kothe at age 13 until he became at age 16. "It gives me something to do," he said with a grin.

Another benefit is "learning so much about independent living that college dorm living doesn't teach you," Cooper said.

He said he sometimes misses

the "immediacy" of campus life, but believes "the advantages outweigh everything else," and he still spends time with his friends, most of whom are EMS volunteers. "I'm not really active in the party scene," he said.

Kothe said that being in the bunk-in program makes doing his school work easier because of the "structure."

"It forces you to be into your work," he said. "We can't be out gallivanting, and if we are here we might as well do our homework."

Both Cooper and Kothe said the hardest part of the

program is keeping straight the Elsmere protocols from their home department protocols.

"Home is different from here and here is different from home, and I have to keep it straight and adapt," said Kothe, as he recounted attending two "major" fires on his very first night in the program. He described that experience as "interesting." Undaunted, he tells people about the program and says,"Just do it!"

DBEMS bunk-ins love the community and the cost containment

Currently, four college students – three women and one man – participate in DBEMS' bunk-in program.

Casey Navin, 21, of Saratoga and a junior at SUNY Albany double majoring in Emergency Management and Spanish is one. Navin became an EMT "to give back to the community that has given me so much."

Navin joined the bunkin program this school year and because he has other scholarships that cover his tuition, he attends college

free of cost. More than money, he said the bunkin program gives him an opportunity to learn in-depth about what he is studying, how to engage in emergency services as a team and how to manage

"The opportunity was almost too good to be true," he said. "Everyone here is passionate about giving back and it is motivating to be in this environment.'

Saving on college costs was a motivating factor as well for DBEMS bunk-in students Brittney Lezcano, 20, a junior from New Jersey studying human biology and medical anthropology at SUNY Albany, and Ashanty Joseph, a SUNY Albany senior double majoring in human biology and psychology from Suffern, N.Y. However, both women, like Navin, agreed that the bunk-in program gives them so much more.


"The bunk-in program gives you the opportunity to learn more about EMS, work with more experienced people and learn a lot," said Lezcano.

"I'm first generation, so it's nice to see the financial burden of housing come off," said Joseph. "It's a wonderful opportunity, and there should be more programs like this across New York State to help kids who worry about how to pay for school. ... It's an even exchange because we pay with our time."

Cost saving is just one benefit of the program. For Joseph, "DBEMS is like a second family and everyone is very loving and kind" and the bunk-in house "feels like home."

As for the house, while parties are forbidden, Lezcano said the "house is beautiful, amazing, perfect and much nicer and safer than people who pay for their apartments, and DBEMS even gave us a starter kit of cleaning supplies."

"We didn't expect how much they would give us," said Lezcano. "In addition



to our housing, everything was put in the house for us, and they give us DBEMS merch enough for a wardrobe and if something is broken they fix it in an instant," said Lozcano. "They take so much care of us."

All three prefer living in the bunk-in house to life on campus.

"There is less passion in the lifestyle at college," said Navin. "It's pretty much all about worrying about going out on weekends and getting work done."

And, they also all agreed that they are only a 15-minute drive from campus "so we are not missing out on anything by not being there," said Lezcano. "As a junior, this is important because it helps set my career path and that's more important to me than doing anything else. I have gained more than I have ever given up.'

Still, being a student and working 12 hour shifts has its challenges.

"I don't do a full overnight shift before I have class so I am not a zombie going to class," said Navin. And there are nights when they go without sleep. "Luckily, we're young so we can come back from that quickly and it adds a level of excitement to the week."

When asked whether he has ever fallen asleep in class, Navin smiled and said, "I take the Fifth."

Joseph said sometimes

she does need a nap in the squad house and noted that "the couches are really comfortable."

But Joseph said all the bunk-ins and DBEMS administration agree that school work comes first.


"DBEMS is very flexible with my school work and classes," Joseph said. "They want to help me grow."

Navin summarized the personal benefits of the bunk-in program. "I learned more here than in classes so far in this one semester and have grown as a provider, as a person and as a leader."

And the benefit goes both ways. Both Lezcano and Navin said they would like to continue volunteering with DBEMS after graduation.

"Staying on after graduation is becoming increasingly important to me because so many people here want to give back and it's infectious," said Navin.

Local man found dead after search

Found in the woods near his home

GLENMONT - A Selkirk man reported missing on Saturday, Nov. 25 was found dead in a wooded area near 822 River Road in Glenmont on Sunday after a search from local police and fire departments.

Repeat Bethlehem burglar pleads guilty in County Court

ALBANY - A 54-yearold homeless man pleaded guilty to burglary in the second degree in Albany County Court on Tuesday, Nov. 22.

According to the Albany County indictment, on or about June 17, 2020, Richard Agley burglarized a home in Delmar and stole items while inside.

While the charges stem from 2020, the defendant failed to appear in court for over two years prior to this resolution, as at the time of charging, burglary in the second degree was not a bail-eligible offense, according to the Albany County District Attorney's

According to police arrest reports, Agley allegedly broke into a home on Euclid Avenue in Delmar in June 2020 and attempted to break into another.

He allegedly stole

cash and credit cards that were used in Albany. Bethlehem police detectives interviewed Agley a week later and arrested him on charges of burglary and grand larceny, both felonies, and criminal mischief and identity theft, both misdemeanors.

At that time, he was arraigned on the charges by Bethlehem Town Judge Andrew Kirby and sent to the Albany County jail until a preliminary hearing in August 2020 in Albany County Court.

At County Court, the judge had to release Agley with another court date because she could not set bail on either of the two felony charges or the misdemeanor charges.

He did not show up and on November 9, 2020 County Judge Andra Ackerman issued a bench warrant for Agley.

Albany City police arrested him on unrelated charges on July 5 and found that he was wanted.

This time Agley was processed on the warrant and sent from Albany City Court to the Albany County jail.

DWI in Selkirk



Gilman's first appearance at Richards' production was last year at the Charles R. Wood Theater in Glens Falls. Richards reached out to Billy and his agency about taking part in the

country music series. At the theater, Billy was blown away by the fan response and the audience participation, which he loved, and was impressed by the whole experience of the production, he told The Spot 518.

"I remember saying to him as we were leaving the theater after the performance, I said, 'Kevin, I really hope to do this again with you guys. It's been a really, really neat thing," Gilman recalled. "Every so often you get to go back to

a city or back to a certain area ... but we made it work, and the audiences seem to be responding, and the tickets are going well so I'm very excited to go back, because the audience really touched me."

Gilman will perform some new songs from his newest record, Christmas songs, hit songs from his career, including songs heard on his run on "The Voice," in "Billy Gilman: Close Up Christmas & Hits".

Since February, Gilman has performed across the nation in Maine, Ohio, Tennessee and Iowa, and his last regular show, which featured songs from his newest album and hit songs, was Nov.11 in Charlotte, N.C. For the remainder of the tour, he will perform 14 Christmas shows and will do a New Year's Eve show before concluding touring February 2024.

Adolescence to 'The Voice' comeback

Born and raised in Westerly, R.I., and splitting his time between his Rhode Island residence and Bowling Green, Ky., where he spends his time songwriting and composing music with his band, Gilman has had quite the musical journey.

He took a break from music when he entered puberty and his voice changed, which almost damaged his vocal cords. It took a long time for him to regain his voice, and he had to be placed on voice rest.

"It was a very rough patch of growing up, especially growing up and using my voice as a singer and not just as a speaker or going to school and using it normally. I used it for different reasons," Gilman said.

Gilman went to Nashville for a few years, where he worked in the songwriting community to write and co-produce music. It was during that period when "The Voice" first approached him about competing on the show. For four years, Gilman turned down the show's producers.

"I just didn't think that I wanted to be on a reality TV show," Gilman said. "I mean, I was a kid, and if a kid can get a record deal just on the mere fact of singing, after doing all of that and all of that journey, why do I have to rely on a TV show? I didn't have to back then."

Eventually, his mood changed and he saw the show in a different light. He finally decided to give it a go in 2016

"I'm really happy that I finally said yes to doing it. I'm super grateful that people really understood that I wanted to come back, and this was the way that I felt it was necessary to be on 'The Voice," Gilman said. "I'm happy that after that, people have continued to show up at the concerts, pay to see shows and the meet and greets, CD's, and download the songs

on whatever platform that you listen to your music on. I'm just super grateful that people are still invested and intrigued in what I want to show them."

Being on "The Voice" was a great experience for Gilman as it also allowed him the creative freedom to choose and sing meaningful songs.

"I've done this, literally, my entire life, and I thought I've seen it all, heard it all, went through it all, but the work that goes into that show that you have to muster up the strength and energy to maintain, is really truly incredible," Gilman said. "I've a newfound appreciation and respect for anyone that wants to go on that show because it's a lot, especially if you make it to the finale. ... It was a great experience, but it was a lot of work."

New record & past hits

Looking ahead, Gilman is excited to release his first bluegrass record next year. He has been wanting to create this record for 15 years, and he had difficulty getting the project off the ground.

Gilman eventually found a songwriting team, an agent, and a record label that believed in his idea. He and his songwriting team were able to co-write songs in Bowling Green, Ky., and record the singles in Nashville, which include "Delta Queen," "Roller

Stonemason to Sculptor

When Henry DiSpirito (1898–1995) emigrated from Italy in 1921 he was already a trained stonemason and bricklayer. 



Utilize a shopping app or coupon aggregator



Bake up a classically shaped dessert for the holidays



reparing homemade cakes is an endeavor that families can enjoy together. Baking is a popular holiday tradition in many families, and few cake styles are as recognized as the Bundt cake.

The Bundt® pan was created in 1950 by H. David Dahliquist, the founder of the Minneapolis-based Nordic Ware kitchen products manufacturer. The shape was inspired by a traditional European cake known as kugelhopf. The design creates a hole in the center of the cake, which enables a heavy, dense cake to be baked without risk of the center being undone.

Many cakes lend themselves well to the Bundt form, and that includes this "Orange Spice Cake With Berries" from "Classic Stars Desserts' (Chronicle Books) by Emily Luchetti.

Orange Spice Cake With Berries

Serves 10

Cake

Butter for the pan

tablespoons fine dried bread crumbs

3 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon ground white pepper

teaspoon ground cinnamon 3/4

3/4 teaspoon ground cardamom

teaspoon baking soda 3/4

teaspoon baking powder 3/4

3/4 teaspoon kosher salt

cup milk

tablespoons freshly squeezed lemon juice *Grated zest of 2 oranges*

3/4 teaspoon peeled and grated fresh ginger

ounces unsalted butter, at room temperature 8

11/2 cups granulated sugar

large eggs

Glaze

1/2 cup granulated sugar

1/4 cup freshly squeezed orange juice

teaspoons freshly squeezed lemon juice 11/2

pint raspberries (about 2 cups)

pint blueberries (about 2 cups)

Preheat the oven to 350 F. Butter a 10-inch Bundt pan and dust with the bread crumbs, tapping out the excess.

Sift together the flour, white pepper, cinnamon, cardamom, baking soda, and baking powder onto a piece of parchment paper or into a bowl. Add the salt and set aside. In a small bowl or measuring cup, stir together the milk, lemon

juice, orange zest, and ginger and set aside. Combine the butter and sugar in the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment and beat on medium-high speed until light and fluffy, about 3 minutes. Add the eggs one at a time, mixing well after each addition. Reduce the speed to low and add the dry ingredients in three additions, alternating with the milk mixture in two additions, beginning and ending with the dry ingredients and mixing well after each addition. Spread the batter into the prepared

Bake the cake until a skewer inserted into the center comes out clean, about 40 minutes. Let cool for 15 minutes. Invert a platter on top of the pan and then invert the plate and pan together. Lift off the pan.

To make the glaze: In a small saucepan, combine the sugar, orange juice, and lemon juice over low heat, stirring to dissolve the sugar. Brush the glaze on the cake. It will seem like a lot of glaze, but the cake will absorb it. Let the cake cool to room temperature. Slice the cake and serve with raspberries, blueberries and cream, if desired. Note: Experiment with other berries for the holiday season, such as sugar-dusted cranberries.



Coaster," "Buried," "States," and "Until You Come Home," to name a few.

"Delta Queen" was released as a single Oct. 13, and "Roller Coaster" was released March 14. Both songs can be heard on all music platforms, along with his older hits "One Voice," "Oklahoma," and "Elizabeth."

"For the first time, this sounds like a true record," Gilman said. 


